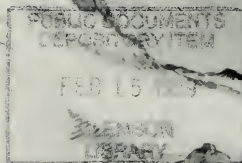

In the late 1940s and early 1950s the public demanded that the National Park Service (NPS) develop a winter use policy that would make the Paradise area of Mount Rainier a ski resort. Skiers wanted all-year road access, overnight accommodations, and a chair lift or an aerial tram at Paradise. The proposed hotel would have had 250 guest rooms, employee quarters and offices, a museum, lecture hall, warming rooms and ski shops. The dining room and cafeteria would have seated 475. The NPS did not want to turn Mt. Rainier into a ski resort and rejected the hotel proposal. Other regional ski areas emerged over the next decade and public demand for a ski resort at Paradise decreased. (Maps and Architectural Drawings)

Archives Finding Aid: A Centennial Project

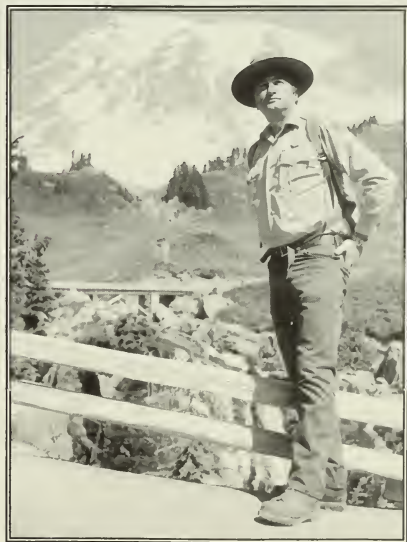
Mount Rainier is widely known for its rich natural resources and scenic beauty. In the course of its 100-year history the staff and superintendents of Mount Rainier National Park have created a rich cultural resource in the form of an irreplaceable administrative and photographic archives. These records chronicle the history and evolution of this unique place.

The Mount Rainier Archives Collection includes extensive documentation of park operations in both text and graphics forms. Examples of documents in the collection are the annual reports of superintendents, construction documents and materials related to the evolution of park policies. These documents help us understand why certain decisions were made, policies enacted and actions taken over the course of the park's first one hundred years.

There are thousands of photographic images that reveal the long legacy of human interaction with the natural environment. The images give us a glimpse of the park through the eyes of park staff and visitors over time, and help us see how many aspects of the park have changed as our understanding of the purpose of the park has evolved.

The publication of the Archives Finding Aid is a significant contribution to the Mount Rainier Centennial. Prior to the development of the Archives Finding Aid these documents and images were largely unorganized and, because of that, inaccessible to the public. This project is the culmination of a four-year cooperative agreement with Western Washington University to process the park's extensive archival and photographic collections. The staff of Mount Rainier and the public will now be able to utilize the park's extensive archival and photographic collections to conduct research and planning efforts to ensure the preservation of this mountain wilderness into the twenty-first century and beyond.

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A Brief History of Mount Rainier National Park

The history of the region which we know today as Mount Rainier National Park stretches back thousands of years. The Yakima, Puyallup, Muckleshoot, and Nisqually peoples were among the first to live in the shadow of the mountain. For two centuries, European adventurers made only brief sojourns into the region until John Longmire became the first permanent settler. He quickly recognized Mount Rainier's potential for tourism and in 1884 established a modest mineral springs resort at the base of the mountain. With the completion of improved rail service from the Seattle-Tacoma area by the 1890s, there was a dramatic increase in the number of people who sought out the mountain's attractions. This rise in Mount Rainier's popularity led to rapid changes for its meadows and forests. Careless campers were trampling the fragile alpine meadows and commercial interests were depleting the surrounding forests. Local citizens, along with prominent conservationists like John Muir, began to voice their concerns. The first tentative step toward preservation came in 1893, with the establishment of the Pacific Forest Reserve surrounding the mountain. Soon mountaineers and scientists joined the efforts to provide increased protection to the area. In 1894, the National Geographic Society, the Geological Society of America, and the American Association for the Advancement of Science, along with the Sierra Club and the Appalachian Mountain Club formally petitioned Congress to extend national park status to Mount Rainier. On March 2, 1899, the efforts of thousands of local and nation-wide park advocates culminated in the establishment of Mount Rainier as our nation's fifth national park.

1900-1909

Despite not having a budget or a full time superintendent, Mount Rainier National Park welcomed two thousand visitors its first year. The first two seasonal rangers were hired in 1903 and began laying the groundwork for basic game and fire protection as well as the trail system. In these first years, most visitors experienced the park's attractions as members of large, organized outings led by alpine clubs like the Mountaineers, which was established in 1906. That same year, the Tacoma Eastern Railroad opened

the National Park Inn and daily stage service to the park began. Soon stages and railroads were replaced by automobiles. In 1907, Mount Rainier became the first national park to allow visitors to enter by automobile and thus the first to charge an entrance fee. The following year, Oscar Brown was hired as the first permanent Park Ranger. The Ranger Station he built in 1908 at the Nisqually entrance still bears his name and is the oldest existing park structure.

1910-1919

In 1911, a new archway at the Nisqually entrance welcomed the growing number of visitors arriving by automobile. Soon a War Department civilian engineer named Eugene Ricksecker, was assigned the task to construct an improved road from the Nisqually entrance to Paradise. The road, designed to conform to the mountain's topography and dramatic vistas, was completed in 1915 as the park's annual visitation rose to over 35,000. The same year saw the beginnings of the Wonderland Trail that would eventually afford visitors spectacular views while encircling the entire mountain. Despite the growing popularity of the national parks, there was now concern over their uneven management and lack of adequate visitor services. In response to these mounting concerns, the National Park Service was established in 1916. The agency's first director, Stephen T. Mather, was a strong advocate of encouraging private development to increase visitation. Successful photographer and Mount Rainier advocate, Asahel Curtis invited Mather to a meeting of Tacoma and Seattle businessmen. When the group accepted Mather's offer of an exclusive concession for recreational developments in the park, the Rainier National Park Company came into being. In 1916, the company began construction of the Paradise Inn, a two-story rustic structure built of Alaska yellow-cedar logs. In addition, the company also established the first commercial guide service for the those climbers attempting the summit.

1920-1929

The policy to develop park facilities gained momentum throughout the 1920s. The thousands of visitors who now came to the park in motorized stages expected more facilities and services. Mount Rainier took

the lead in developing a new style of rustic architecture within the park service. Dozens of new structures were built throughout the park, most notably in the Longmire area. Educational programs began in earnest when Floyd W. Schmoe was named the first park naturalist in 1924. He and his fellow Park Rangers took the lead on providing educational nature walks, the publication of "Nature Notes" and the establishment of the park's first museum at Longmire. The growing park staff soon boasted six divisions: protection, maintenance, education, engineering, landscape and electrical. Getting a handle on this rapid growth soon became a priority throughout the national park service. In 1928, Mount Rainier became the first national park to be given a master plan for the development of all roads, concessionaire services and administrative facilities. The park's emphasis on development did not continue without opposition. The Mountaineers protested the expansion of road construction and succeeded in having the entire northern portion and a section of the west side of the park set aside from further development. By the end of the decade annual visitation reached a quarter of a million people.

1930-1939

The decade began with a burst of activity. Development expanded into Yakima Park beginning with the construction of the Sunrise Lodge in 1931. Soon Superintendent O. A. Tomlinson began to shift the park's management emphasis toward resource protection. The addition of 34,000 acres on the eastern boundary, extended the park to the crest of the Cascade Range and incorporated the area known as Ohanapecosh. That same year the Mather Memorial Parkway was created along the Naches Highway. The effects of the Depression slowly began to have an impact upon the national parks. To counteract poor visitation, Mount Rainier and its concessionaires promoted winter activities such as downhill skiing and a winter carnival. A more lasting legacy from the period came from the accomplishments of the Civilian Conservation Corps. By 1938, Mount Rainier boasted eight camps staffed with nearly 1,600 young men. Hundreds of miles of trails were maintained, picnic areas and campgrounds improved, revegetation projects completed, and bridges, patrol cabins and fire lookouts were built.

1940-1949

The advent of World War II brought major changes to park visitation and management. Many national parks devoted portions of their facilities for military uses. Ski troops from the Tenth Mountain Division trained on the slopes of the mountain. At the end of the war, park visitation rebounded with almost a half a million visitors. However, after years of neglect, deterioration of park facilities and structures became apparent. In 1947, the Secretary of the Interior pointed to Mount Rainier as a prime example of the problems then facing the national park system. Adding to the troubles, Mount Rainier's special geologic history that helped make it a national park came to the fore front once again. In 1947, a volcanic mudflow or "lahar" swept down Kautz Creek burying the road to Longmire with 30 feet of debris. Efforts to monitor the newly recognized geohazards of the park would continue to receive greater attention in the years to come.

1950-1959

In 1955, Mount Rainier became the pilot park for a new park service wide program known as Mission 66. It was a comprehensive ten-year, billion-dollar program to upgrade park facilities throughout the nation. At Mount Rainier this included completion of the Stevens Canyon road in 1957 and the eventual relocation of park headquarters to the town of Ashford. Some recreational developments began to face growing opposition. In 1954, conservationists were victorious in blocking the construction of a chair lift to Panorama Point. Ecological principles began to find acceptance. By the end of the decade, C. Frank Brockman had conducted the first ecological study of damage to the Paradise meadows.

1960-1969

As the decade began, mountaineering took center stage. In 1962, members of the American Mount Everest Expedition trained on the slopes of the mountain. The following year, the Camp Schurman Memorial Shelter was constructed and the first winter mountain climbing was permitted. Resource protection also gained a higher profile than in years past. Passage of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 and

the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 led to more in-depth inventories of the park's cultural and natural resources.

1970-1979

The 1970s brought a renewed interest in backpacking. The larger numbers of visitors caused a more intense impact upon the fragile ecosystems. The park responded to the growing problems by developing a backcountry management plan in 1973. The new plan called for controlled campfire use, designated backcountry campsites, limits on the number of backpackers, and restrictions on horse use. Some visitors interpreted these protective measures as unnecessary limits to access. Though lawsuits were brought in opposition to the new regulations, the park's efforts to counteract backcountry damage succeeded. One result of the resource studies was recognizing the need for meadow restoration efforts. Other damaging, long-term activities were also coming to an end. Eagle Peak Copper Mining Company, the longest operating mine within the park boundaries ended operations in 1974.

1980-1989

The problems identified in the previous decade, became the subjects of numerous research and data gathering projects. In 1988, Congress designated 97% of the park as official wilderness. The Paradise Meadow Plan was inaugurated the following year and revegetation projects moved into full gear. In addition, the park began monitoring air and water quality. Despite the advance in management strategies, national park funding did not keep pace with the increased work load and visitation levels.

1990-1999

In 1990s the park began to develop partnerships with other private organizations and other government entities to expand research projects and improve environmental conditions in the park. When Mount Rainier was designated a Decade Volcano, it's violent potential became the focus of more intense and monitoring. Efforts to improve air quality in the park accelerated. In 1996, negotiations for a

collaborative effort to reduce emissions began between the owners of the Centralia Power Plant and state, local, and federal air regulatory agencies. The park's irreplaceable cultural resources were also afforded greater protection. In 1997, the developed areas of the park were designated as a National Historic Landmark District. In anticipation of the park's upcoming anniversary in 1999, several rehabilitation projects were designated Centennial signature projects: restoration of the White River Patrol Cabin, revegetation of the campground at Yakima Park and routing the last few miles of the Wonderland Trail into the backcountry.

The first one hundred years of resource stewardship at Mount Rainier proved to be a complicated, and at times, an interrupted process. By the close of the twentieth century, the park was succeeding in its efforts to meet its mandate to preserve irreplaceable resources while providing public access. Maintaining that delicate balance is the challenge facing both the public and the staff of Mount Rainier National Park in the new millennium.

Arranged chronologically by year.

Over the years park employees and private citizens have done research on the history of Mount Rainier National Park. The administrative office collected this research creating the artificial history collection. The collection contains rough drafts of park histories (such

as C. Frank Brockman's *The Story of Mount Rainier National Park*); subject files on a variety of topics including the battle to rename Mt. Rainier as Mt. Tahoma; oral history transcripts from the Longmire descendants; and other data documenting more than fifty years of historical research. The artificial history collection also contains primary source materials identified as having important historic value by the park administrative staff. These materials include the correspondence of Superintendent O.A. Tomlinson and the papers of Eugene Ricksecker.

The first folder contains excerpts regarding Mount Rainier National Park (MORA), photocopied from the Secretary of the Interior's annual reports, 1899 - 1905. They contain very limited information. Subjects include the creation of the park, boundaries, mining issues, facilities, visitation, Native American issues, and some flora and fauna information. Superintendent's reports begin in 1904.

The level of detail in the Superintendent's Annual Reports varies greatly ranging from 4-5 pages up to 50-60 pages in length and appears to have been determined by requirements of the director's office or Secretary of Interior, different superintendents, and levels of park activity. Many reports contain supplemental reports from various park divisions submitted to the superintendent for use in compiling his annual report. Miscellaneous correspondence regarding the reports is also often included in the files.

These reports were submitted at the end of each fiscal year to the National Park Service (NPS) director for use in generating the service-wide annual report for the Secretary of the Interior and for determining budget appropriations. The reports cover the highlights of the park's yearly operations. In general, the reports contain information on park operations and administration, development and maintenance of

facilities, budget concerns, activities of various divisions, visitation, significant events, and projected needs. Subjects, in varying levels of detail, include: visitation (statistics, hotels, activities, transportation); development and construction (buildings, roads, trails, surveying, facilities, maintenance, sanitation, electrical and telephone); use (recreation, mining, forestry, grazing); nature (statistics, research, education/naturalist divisions); budgeting; personnel; ranger issues (safety, law enforcement, search and rescue, fires, patrolling); and special events.

Included in early reports (1906 -1910) are maps, including the original boundary map of the park and multiple copies of the 1906 Ricksecker map with roads, trails, and projected projects. Additionally, the 1930 report contains a hand colored map of forest types. Several reports refer to a photographic supplement, four of which (1934, 1936, 1965, 1966) still include the photographs.

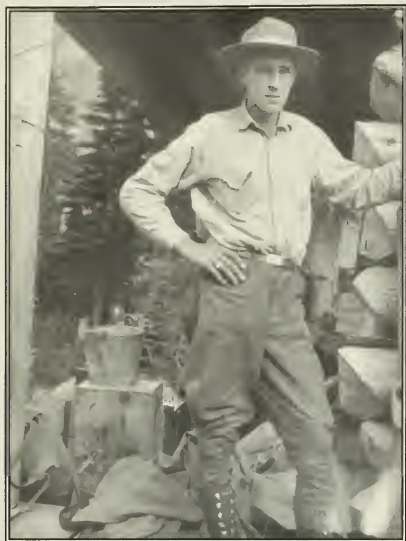

Mount Rainier National Park administrators have given Interpretive Services many names over the years. They include Information Bureau, Nature Guide Service, Educational Division, Naturalist Department and Division of Interpretation and Education. The members of Interpretive Services have been called Information Officers, Nature

Guides, Park Naturalists, Ranger Naturalists and Park Rangers-Interpretation.

Regardless of their individual or division titles the goal of interpretation is to facilitate a connection between the interests of the visitors and the meaning of the resource. This connection in turn fosters stewardship of the park resources. The Interpretive Services' records document programs designed to achieve this goal. Included are records documenting museum and wayside exhibits, slide programs, self-guided trails, and guided nature walks. The staff also acts as liaison between the park and news organizations. The division's records includes press releases and other interpretive publications.



On Sunday, August 19, 1934, local radio station KOMO and N.B.C. affiliate KJR did a live broadcast from Mount Rainier National Park. The program based in the Paradise Valley also took listeners up to Camp Muir (10,000 ft) and down into the Paradise Ice Caves. (Tahoma Woods Collection)

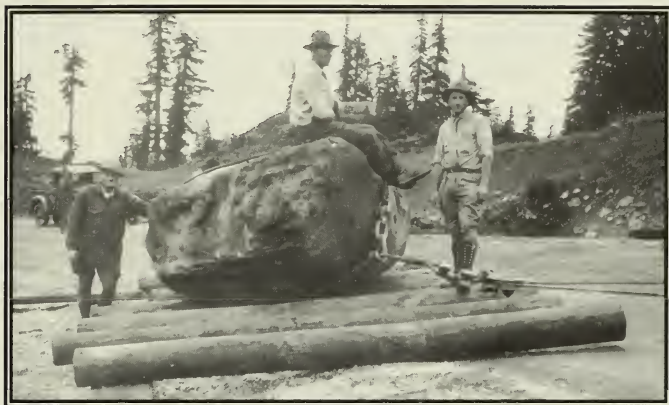

In 1973 Mount Rainier National Park adopted a new backcountry use plan. These new guidelines were developed "to decrease the deteriorating trail and campsite conditions, while providing for quality wilderness experiences for back country users." H. Larry Penberthy, president of Mountain Safety

Research, Inc., filed a lawsuit against Superintendent Tobin and the National Park Service calling the new Master Plan's backcountry restrictions "arbitrary and capricious."

This series contains the files kept by the park as a result of the litigation. The files include correspondence, backcountry management plans and a copy of the case files. Each summer during the New Deal years, hundreds of young men lived in Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) camps in Mount Rainier National Park. They

spent their working hours erecting buildings, improving trails and campgrounds, fighting white pine blister rust, and planting trees and shrubs. The CCC, and the Emergency Conservation Works (ECW), had a tremendous impact on Mount Rainier National Park. These records document construction programs including the development of the Wonderland Trail. Included are progress reports, correspondence, and photographs documenting the CCC/ECW's activities at Mount Rainier National Park.

These records illustrate the conflict inherent in the dual goal of the National Park Service, to protect and preserve the natural resources but to also provide public access to this resource. Mount Rainier National Park granted concessions to private firms to help promote the use of its natural resources and to meet the demands of public facilities. In the past the goals and needs of the concessions often conflicted with the goals of the NPS.

At the turn of the century, concessionaires promoted the mineral springs and its healing powers. In the 1940s the concessionaires worked to develop Mount

Rainier National Park into a skiers' paradise. Today, concessionaires work closely with the park to minimize human impact while still providing facilities to the public. While the concessions records are normally deaccessioned under the existing National Park Service records schedule, the administration of Mount Rainier National Park identified this collection as a valuable historic resource and made these records permanent.

The concession records include contracts, leases, reports, blueprints, and correspondence. The records document all park concessions from the large concessions; Rainier National Park Company (RNPCo), Government Services Inc./Guest Services Inc. (GSI) and Rainier Mountaineering Incorporated (RMI) to the small individual concessions such as; L.G. Linkletter (photography), George B. Hall (livery), and John S. Reese (Camp of the Clouds).

When John Muir visited Mt. Rainier in 1888 he had no intention of climbing to the summit. However, he soon caught 'mountain fever' and decided to ascend Mt. Rainier. Muir later wrote about the experience, "In the morning we were astir by four o'clock, not boisterous after a sleepless night, but with cheery hearts. And the view of the mountain top, so grandly heaving itself into the sky, cheered us on and supplied strength...This is a good mountain to prove one's mettle..."

Over the years many people have caught mountain fever and climbed Mt. Rainier. In the early 1900s there were no formal park summit registers. Many different mountain climbing clubs maintained registers at the summit of Mt. Rainier. One climbing group, The Mountaineers, has its Mt. Rainier summit registers available at the University of Washington Archives.

Mount Rainier National Park's collection of summit registers begins in 1932. Author Bruce Barcott accessed the registers because he "was curious to read the thoughts of the climbers at 14,000 feet, to see how they want to be remembered." While some summit register pages have been damaged and some volumes are missing the registers are still an excellent record of Mt. Rainier summit climbs and provide an the reader with an opportunity to "read the thoughts of the climbers."

The **Park Structures Collection**, often referred to as the San Francisco collection, contains approximately 1100 black and white images taken by park personnel from 1920 to 1942. The images were part of a "record of structures" for all national parks. As part of the regional program for copying and preserving nitrate negatives, the photos were moved to the photo lab at what is now San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park (then Golden Gate). The contact positives and safety negatives were transferred to Mount Rainier National Park in 1986. The original nitrate negatives are in San Francisco. The photos document all construction projects at Mount Rainier National Park. Many of the images were used to illustrate Maintenance Division construction reports, Superintendent's Monthly Reports, and Emergency Conservation Works (ECW) progress reports. The collection is arranged by negative number.

The **Interpretive Services Collection**, often referred to as the Dewey Decimal collection, contains approximately 3500 black and white images. The majority of the collection is composed of photos

taken by park employees from 1940 to 1989. The rest of the collection, approximately 500 images, are copy negatives. The historic prints used to make the copy negatives are from the photo album and Tahoma Woods historic print collections. The photos document a wide variety of subjects including ranger activities, visitor use, construction projects, storm damage to park structures, and natural resources including flora and fauna. Several of the images have been used in park publications and exhibits. The collection had been organized by Dewey decimal number but over the years this system was not properly maintained resulting in duplicate numbers. The collection is now arranged by negative number.

The **Nitrate Collection** contains approximately 2200 black and white images. These images were collected as part of the park's nitrate negative conservation project. All original order and provenance has been lost. The images, taken by park employees from 1910 to 1950, document various park activities including construction projects and special events. The collection is arranged by negative number.

The **Maintenance Division Collection** contains approximately 300 images taken by park personnel from 1960 to 1985. These images were created to document various Maintenance Division activities including construction projects. Many of the photographs document storm damage to park structures and roads. The collection is arranged by subject.

The **Tahoma Woods Collection** contains approximately 5000 images from 1885 to 1980. The administrative office of Mount Rainier National Park maintains a historic print collection. These prints, many of them original, include publicity photos from the Rainier National Park Company, donated prints from local families, and photographs removed from photo albums. While a large portion of the collection is duplicated in the other park photographic collections, these are the original prints used to make the copy negatives. They provide a valuable historical resource including detailed descriptions of people, places, and events. The collection is arranged by subject.

The **Linkletter Collection** contains approximately 50 images. L.G. Linkletter had a photographer's concession at Mount Rainier National Park from 1908 to 1915. Linkletter specialized in photographs of "automobiles along the graceful winding

roadways, saddle horses on the trails, camp scenes, mountain climbing, and groups posed amid the natural scenery of the park." In 1998 his daughter, Adeline Linkletter Goode, donated several of his original photographs to the park. The images document the early history of Mount Rainier National Park, specifically the development of the Longmire Springs area. Included are images of Linkletter's concession tent, early park visitors, and scenic photographs. Records regarding Linkletter's concession are available in the Concession records. Arranged chronologically by year.

The **Historic Photo Albums** collection contains both the 'official' Mount Rainier National Park photo albums, created by the Office of the Superintendent, as well as photo albums donated to the park by employees and the public. Included are images of the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers road construction project, Civilian Conservation Corps activities, World War II ski troops and a variety of scenic views. Also included are family albums documenting visits to the park including photographs of camping, hiking, climbing, fishing and swimming. The family albums also contain vacation photos of other scenic areas including the Washington Coast. The albums are arranged chronologically by year.

Lantern Slides

Arranged by image number.

The Interpretive Division of Mount Rainier National Park has conducted slide shows since the earliest days of the park. These magic lantern slide shows covered topics similar to those addressed in modern 35mm slide presentations. The Lantern Slide collection contains approximately 1200 slides, many of which are hand-tinted. The majority of slides are of flora and fauna but the slides also include visitors use, park structures, trails, and ranger activities.

Motion Picture Film
6 linear feet
1930-1980

Arranged chronologically by year.

The administrative office of Mount Rainier National Park has maintained a collection of motion picture film at the Tahoma Woods Complex. These films were created by many different park offices. There are multiple copies of films commissioned by the National Park Service for interpretive presentations and documentaries. A large portion of the films contain sets of miscellaneous park scenes of visitors, wildlife and winter recreation from the 1930s through the 1960s. Other films document specific construction projects including activities conducted by the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC), Emergency Conservation Workers (ECW), Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) and the U.S. Army. Reels of particular interest include NPS Director Stephen Mather's visit to Mount Rainier and a time lapse study of glacial motion. The majority of the film collection has not been videotaped and some portions have not been fully identified.

Ephemera

1884-1935

Mount Rainier National Park maintains a large collection of artifacts. This ephemera includes historic photographs, postcards, concession and park

brochures, menus and souvenirs sold in the Park's gift shops. There are approximately 250 items in this collection.

Maps and Architectural Drawings
5 linear feet
1890-1990

Arranged chronologically by year.

Mount Rainier National Park maintains a collection of oversized materials in several park offices. This oversized collection includes architectural drawings created by the park landscape architect and the Maintenance Division. These plans document various construction projects including buildings, bridges, parking areas, landscaping, roads and trails. The oversized collection also includes park maps. The maps were created (or annotated) by park personnel while doing surveys, environmental impact studies, and construction projects. A detailed inventory has not been completed. Park personnel estimate over 10,000 items in this collection.

Master Plans
6 linear inches
1931-1965

Arranged chronologically by year.

The Master Plans were maintained separately in the Longmire Library.

Master planning is "...a discipline which treated the park as a synthetic whole, not as a group of fragmented resources...[There were] master plans for almost every national park and monument in the late 1920s and early 1930s...but few plans were as significant or as complete as the plans for Mount Rainier...The physical integrity of the developed areas and facilities of Mount Rainier also set it apart." Mount Rainier's complete set of master plans was instrumental in the park's nomination as a National Historic Landmark District. The plans contain detailed maps and diagrams of every region in the park. The plans addressing the proposed development of Paradise and Sunrise (Yakima Park) are especially significant.
