### FEDERAL ASSISTANCE

**COOPERATIVE EXTENSION SERVICE:** Conducts ongoing programs in environmental improvement with focus on pollution. Also sponsors regional workshops.



**ENVIRONMENTAL THRUST PROGRAM:** A cooperative program involving the Soil Conservation Service, Farmers Home Administration, Forest Service, Rural Electrification Administration, Economic Resources Service and the Cooperative Extension Service. The program shows

people how they can do something to improve environmental conditions. Outlines are provided to interested parties and detail how citizens can initiate, carry out and coordinate community-wide programs for environmental awareness.



**FARMERS HOME ADMINISTRATION:** Prepares handbooks for teachers on environmental education. Offers curriculum guide on improving the quality of the environment.



**FOREST SERVICE:** Has a nationwide environmental education program involving teacher training, environmental study sites and teacher guides. The main thrust of the program is in the area of teacher preparation and workshops.



**SOIL CONSERVATION SERVICE:** Provides teacher training through workshops. Stresses the outdoor classroom approach to environmental education and supplies the course materials. The SCS also provides regional assistance through its centers and furnishes technical resource data for the courses. Provides material for a wide variety of courses including recreation and land use planning.

The Office was mandated by Congress with the responsibility of aiding other Federal agencies in coordinating environmental education projects and provides both state and Federal agencies with assistance.





**PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICE:** Helps communities in establishing action groups and provides them with some written materials on the health aspects of environmental education. Is primarily concerned with the man-made-environment



**FOOD & DRUG ADMINISTRATION:** Has initiated a system of consumer phone messages in cities with consumer specialists. The message is used to alert the public of possible dangers in drugs or foods.

**BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT:** The Bureau's employees will offer time and assistance to persons needing help in establishing a program. The Bureau is not currently funded for such assistance, however.



**BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS:** Offers two environmental education curriculum guides and assistance in setting up a program.



**BUREAU OF OUTDOOR RECREATION:** Office of Information Services keeps files on status of environmental education movement in and out of government. Administers Recreation Support Program with Labor Department. The RSP provides cities with funds for recreation programs.



**BUREAU OF RECLAMATION:** The Bureau has hired 13 environmental education specialists to carry out programs for them.



**NATIONAL PARK SERVICE:** Operates and provides information on three environmental education programs. NEED (National Environmental Education Development) is designed to assist school systems through development of interdisciplinary educational materials which supplement existing school curricula. Teacher guides, student classroom and outdoor materials are available for the program. NESA (National En-

vironmental Study Areas) is a program of environmental study whereby schools use the resources of parks and other "out-classroom" sites in conjunction with an ongoing environmental education curriculum at the school. NEEL (National Environmental Education Landmarks) is designed to identify and preserve nationally significant environmental study areas. The programs are based on a 5-strand approach to teaching and are mutually supporting in their philosophy. The Park Service Office of Environmental Interpretation has worked in conjunction with other agencies to produce supporting guidebooks for the programs. *National Environmental Study Areas: A Guidebook*, explains the philosophy behind the NESAs program; *A Guide to Planning and Conducting Environmental Study Area Workshops*, explains how to get a workshop started and what to expect from the group; *Environmental Education/Facility Resources* is a report from Educational Facilities Laboratories and is a listing of facilities designed to be used in conjunction with the programs and sites. NPS also cosponsors with the US National Commission for UNESCO a program called STEP (Students Toward Environmental Participation). It is an autonomous vehicle for environmental education and action operated by and for High School students.

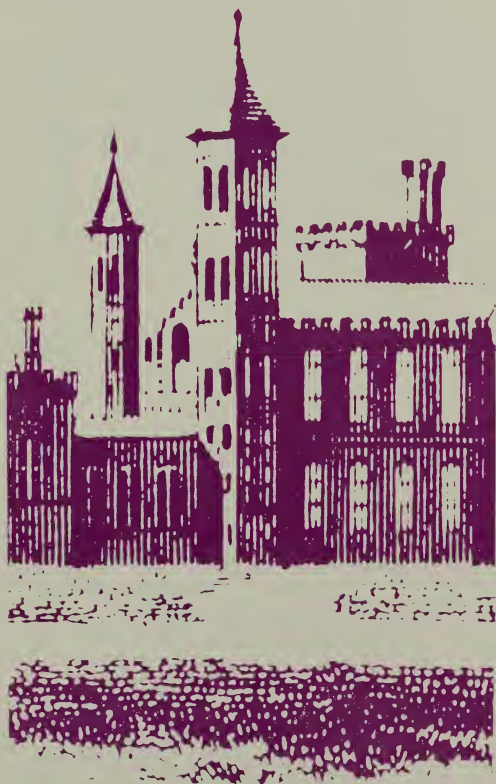



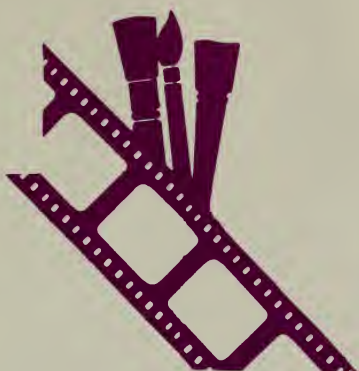
