FOREWORD

Events appearing in this schedule of outdoor activities are offered as public services of the National Capital Parks in Washington, D. C. These events include campfire programs; hikes; bird, flower, tree, and general nature observation walks; outings for children; camera strolls; horse-drawn barge trips on the Chesapeake & Ohio Canal; historic tours; and auto caravans. Programs are under the direction of Park Naturalists and Park Historians. All outings are offered without charge except necessary transportation and admission costs on some trips.

(1) CAMPFIRE PROGRAMS are held outdoors in Rock Creek Park near 16th St. & Colorado Ave. N. W. each Saturday at 7:30 p.m. (8:30 p.m. if daylight saving time is in force). They consist of a half hour of recorded "Music at Twilight" under the auspices of the District of Columbia Public Library, followed by illustrated talks and motion pictures on National Parks and other popular subjects presented by wellknown speakers. The Campfire site may be reached by 16th St. bus line to 16th St. & Colorado Ave. It is a two block walk from 14th & Hamilton Sts. on the 14th St. car line. Follow signs from 16th St. into the area. Ample parking space is reached from 16th & Kennedy Sts. In case of inclement weather or other unforeseen factor, programs will be canceled. Call the Park Police RE 1820, Ext. 2555, in case of doubt.

(2) HISTORICAL TOURS AND CONDUCTED TRIPS: Two-hour visits to historical areas are conducted by Park Historians who interpret the significant historical features visited. These trips start at '2:30 p.m. and involve short, easy walks. For further information telephone RE 1820, Ext. 2565.

(3) Two-hour AFTERNOON NATURE WALKS on Saturdays and Sundays, as scheduled, are short strolls where primary interest is the observation of natural features. Some are devoted to flowers; others to trees, ferns, mushrooms, mosses, tree diseases, rocks, snakes, frogs, insects, pond life, or general nature subjects. The time for each walk is given in the schedule.

(4) BIRD WALKS are scheduled from 6:30 or 7 o'clock Saturday and Sunday mornings during springtime and early autumn. Leadership for these outings is provided through cooperation of the Audubon Society of the District of Columbia.

(5) CAMERA STROLLS are offered this season for the fifth year. Led by Major Ralph W. French, an expert photographer, these trips are intended to help amateur photographers by taking them to scenic places in local and nearby parks where the technique of taking good pictures is demonstrated. Camera strolls will be offered on alternating Sundays.

(6) HORSE-DRAWN BARGE TRIPS ON THE SCENIC AND HISTORIC CHESAPEAKE & OHIO CANAL are conducted by the National Park Service in cooperation with Government Services, Inc., which manages the necessary business arrangements.

There will be two one-way trips each Saturday after-noon from May 3 to October 25, inclusive, and on Sunday afternoons in May, September and October; and four one-way trips on Sundays from June 1 to August 31, inclusive. The harge trip may be made either upstream or downstream. Up-stream passengers leave Lock No. 3 (on the Canal one block south of 30th & M Sts. N.W.) in Georgetown, D. C., and ride the barge to Lock No. 5 at Brookmont, Md. The barge leaves Lock No. 3 at 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. on the dates noted above. At Lock No. 5, upstream passengers disembark to return to Wash-ington via the Glen Echo street car line. Downstream pas-sengers embark at Lock No. 5. This point may be reached by walking about a block and down the steps from Stop 24 on the Glen Echo car line. The downstream trip ends at Lock No. 3. The barge leaves Lock No. 5 at 11:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on the dates noted above. Picnic lunches may be eaten at the picnic area at Lock No. 5 or on the barge. Tickets are on sale daily except Sunday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. through the courtesy of the CAPITAL TRANSIT COMPANY at their Chartered Coach Department, 1416 F St., N.W., and may be purchased in advance for any desired trip. A limited number of tickets will be reserved for sale at the barge. Adult tickets 60 cents including tax; children under 14, half fare when accompanied by an adult. Arrangements for chartering the barge for special group trips can be made by calling NA 7363, Government Services, Inc.


A Park Service Historian or Naturalist accompanies each trip to interpret the story of the canal and other features seen enroute.

OUTINGS FOR CHILDREN are conducted during the summer (7)vacation period. These are designed to appeal especially vacation period. These are designed to appear espectarly to Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Camp Fire Girls, and members of other youth organizations. All children of comparable age are welcome. The Park Naturalists will also conduct nature programs in Day Camps operated by the D. C. Recreation De-partment. Detailed information can be had by telephoning the Park Naturalist RE 1820, Ext. 2557.

(8) AFTERNOON HIKES of from 4 to 7 miles in length are of-fered on Saturdays and Sundays during November for those who enjoy strenuous walks with occasional stops for discussion of things seen along the trail. These hikes begin at 2 p.m. and end at 5 p.m. Wear clothes suitable for hiking, and comfortable walking shoes.

(9) STAR OUTINGS are held on four Sunday nights beginning at 8 p.m. Leadership is provided through the cooperation of the National Capital Astronomers. Portable, home-made tel-escopes are loaned by club members for observation of the moon and planets. If the sky is cloudy, the event will be canceled.

(10) ALL-DAY AUTO CARAVANS to nearby park areas will be con-ducted on various Sundays from June to November. Each per-son must bring his own lunch to eat at a picnic area, since arrangements cannot be made for eating at restaurants. Wear suitable clothing for short hikes at destinations. You may use your own car. Those desiring to travel by charter bus read paragraph (**).



(**) Call Capital Transit Company's Chartered Coach Department, MI 6363, Ext. 400 or 401 during office hours for res-ervations. Bring your own lunch when all day trips are scheduled. Buses leave from 1416 F St., N. W. and tickets may be purchased there before leaving.







LINCOLN MUSEUM (Ford's Theater) 511 10th Street NW.

Open: Week days - 9 a.m. to 9 p.m.; Sundays and holidays -12:30 p.m. to 9 p.m. Admission: 10¢ plus tax; children under 12 and military personnel admitted free. Children 12 thru 16 years of age are admitted free except for tax.

The tragic assassination of Abraham Lincoln occurred in Ford's Theater on the night of April 14, 1865. The Lincoln Museum occupies the first floor of the old theater building. It contains an extensive collection of items associated with Lincoln, the theater, the assassination, and John Wilkes Booth. The exhibits have recently been arranged chronologically, and adequate labels describe the story of Lincoln's life.

HOUSE WHERE LINCOLN DIED (The Old Petersen House)

Open: Week days - 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.; Sundays and holidays - 12:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. Admission: 10¢ plus tax; children under 12 and military personnel admitted free. Children 12 through 16 years of age are admitted free except for tax.

This house, opposite Ford's Theater, is where Abraham Lincoln was carried after receiving his fatal wound from the hand of the Assassin, John Wilkes Booth. It was in this simple dwelling that the famous emancipator died on April 15, 1865. It contains appropriate furnishings of the period and other exhibits.

THE LEE MANSION

Arlington Cemetery

Open: Daily from 9:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. (April 1 - Sept. 30); 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. (Oct. 1 - March 31). Admission: 10¢ plus tax; children under 12 and military personnel admitted free. Children 12 through 16 years of age are admitted free except for tax.

The ante-bellum home of Robert E. Lee. Built about 1803 by George Washington Parke Custis, grandson of Martha Washington, and willed to Mrs. Robert E. Lee, his daughter. An outstanding example of the mansion house and furnishings of the period prior to the Civil War.



WASHINGTON MONUMENT

The Mall west of 14th Street

Open: Daily from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Ascent may be made by elevator which reaches the top in one minute, or by stairway. Elevator charge: 10c; no charge for uniformed military personnel and children 16 years of age and under.

The Washington Monument was built between 1848 and 1884 to represent the gratitude and admiration of the Nation for Washington's wise leadership and stainless integrity. Straight and lofty, the obelisk portrays in stone the resolution and uprightness of the first President and his unswerving devotion to principle and country.

JEFFERSON MEMORIAL

Open: Daily from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m.

The Memorial to Thomas Jefferson was dedicated and opened to the public on April 13, 1943, the 200th anniversary of his birth. This circular domed structure, designed by the office of John Russell Pope to reflect the admiration of Jefferson for this type of architecture, contains inscriptions from the writings of Jefferson embodying his concepts of liberty and democracy. The heroic statue of Jefferson by Rudulph Evans is placed in the center and dominates the Memorial Room.



The Lincoln Memorial contains Daniel Chester French's heroic statue of Lincoln and the inspiring words of the Gettysburg Address and Second Inaugural Address. Most of its features symbolize the Union and the freeing of slaves. Henry Bacon's superb architectural design and the beautiful setting make the Lincoln Memorial one of the most admired structures in the United States. It was dedicated May 30, 1922.
