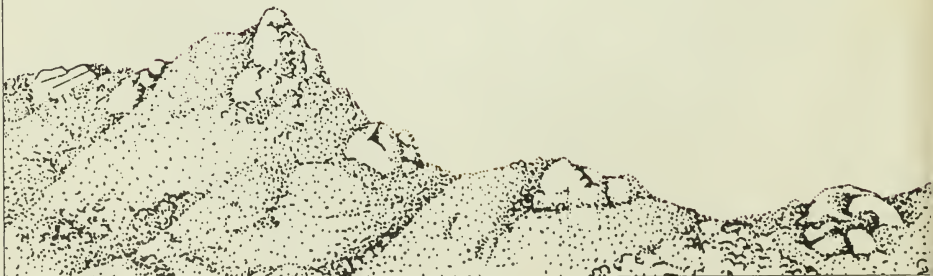
SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

Winter is a season of contrasts. The valley oaks and sycamores are leafless, while the grass beneath them turns green. On the trails or in your neighborhood you may see wildlife foraging for new growth brought out by winter rains. The patchwork-like quality of our public lands in the Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area enables residents of this area to share the neighborhood with wildlife. It is important to remember that these animals have always lived here. This is their home, too. For ways in which we can enjoy and protect our wildlife neighbors, call for our new publication "*Living With Wildlife*."

Public lands provide an important refuge for wildlife, but these protected areas alone cannot ensure the survival of species. Ultimately, it is our society's values and each person's behavior in their own backyard that is critical. Be a good neighbor, learn more about wildlife and protect their homes by attending a guided hike or by including native plants in your yard. Know the rules of park areas you visit and have a safe and enjoyable experience.

Location - Directions to listed parkland areas are on pages 15 and 18. Between these pages is a map of the national recreation area. *These four pages may be removed together for easy reference.*

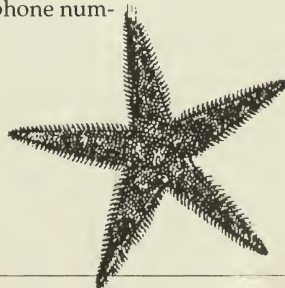
Reservation - Indicated if required.

- 2 **Caballero Canyon** Ventura Fwy (101) to Reseda Blvd exit. Turn south 1.9 miles to just past the fountain on the left side of Reseda Blvd. Park on street.
- 3 ***Castro Crest Site** Pacific Coast Hwy to Corral Canyon Rd (Just west of Malibu Canyon Rd). Follow Corral Canyon Rd to end, park in parking lot.
- 4 **Charmlee Nature Preserve** Pacific Coast Hwy, about 3 miles south of Ventura County line. Turn inland on Encinal Canyon Rd, 4 miles to park entrance on left side of road.
- 5 ***Cheeseboro Canyon/Palo Comado Canyon Site** Ventura Fwy (101) to Chesebro Rd exit. At end of ramp, turn north on Palo Comado Canyon Rd and right on Chesebro Rd. North 1 mile to park entrance. Turn right and follow dirt road to parking lot.

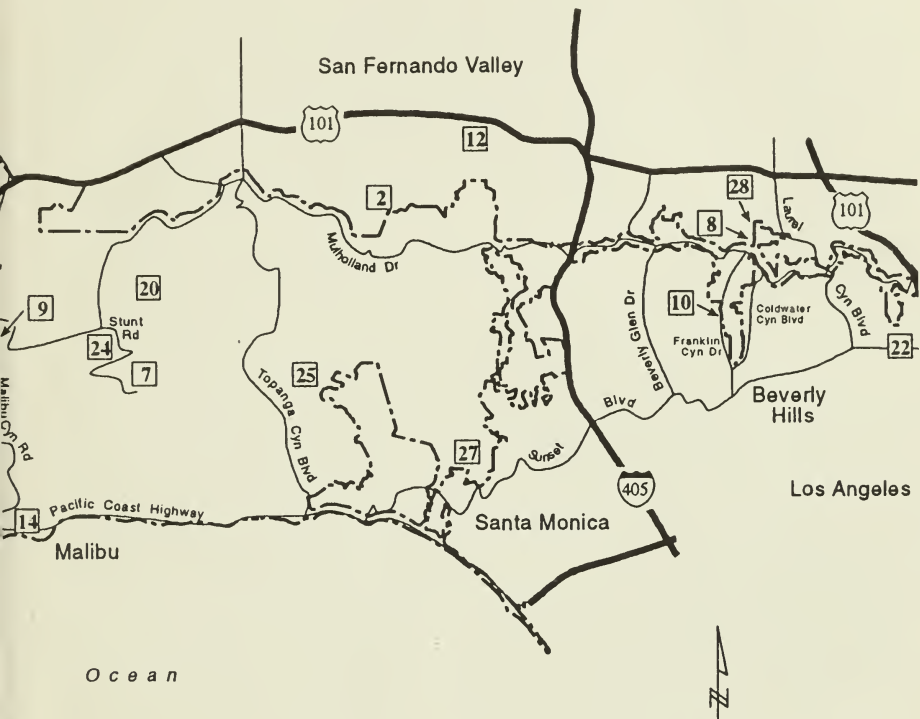

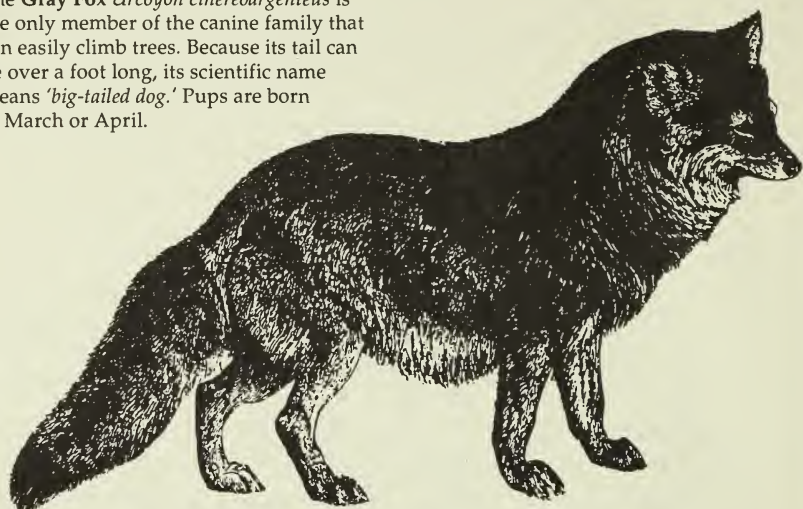
