Special Activities. Park Ranger, Superintendent, and other staff members were present at the meeting of the Yellowstone Outfitters Association on December 1 and 2, 1920.

On December 5, the Administrative Division personnel met to discuss the proposed new organizational setup, specially with reference to the Division.

Superintendent Garrison, Management Assistant Hadley, Chief Ranger Dick and Biologist Howe attended the 12th Annual Meeting of the Montana Outfitters and Guides Association in Great Falls on December 7-9.

Chief Ranger Dick, Biologist Howe, and Ranger Berg attended a meeting of the West Yellowstone Lions Club on December 12 and presented the Park's elk management program.

Superintendent Garrison, Chief Ranger Dick and Biologist Howe attended a meeting in Cheyenne, Wyoming, December 19, to discuss the elk management program with Acting Governor Gage and officials of the Wyoming Game and Fish Commission. Messrs. Lawrence F. Cook and Richard Rogers attended.

Special Assignment. Assistant Superintendent Luis E. Castellum, who is a United States Observer with the French and Chilean Relief and Resupply Expeditions to Antarctic, has written that it is summer in Santiago de Chile, with a 90 degree temperature and humid.

Scientists on this expedition are specialists in geology, glaciology, atmospheric physics, oceanography, gravimetry, entomology and many others. The American Scientists' activities are limited to the Bernardo G. Higgins base and the Chilean Scientists work at the Gabriel Gonzales Videla base. Mr. Castellum's work will permit him to move to four bases, plus refuges and visits to some of the Argentine and British bases.

Under the Antarctic Treaty, claims to territory remain status quo for 30 years, with the entire continent open to all countries for peaceful scientific work.

Park Ranger Carl Lamb completed his course at the ninth session, (Owen A. Tomlinson) of the National Park Service Training Center in Yosemite National Park, and returned to the Park December 18.

Reorganization. By orders from Director Conrad L. Wirth and Park Superintendent Lenzel A. Garrison, the three-district manager plan of the Park was discontinued effective December 11 in the West and South Districts, and in the North District on December 31. Plans for a two-district operation are now in the Regional Office for review.

Mr. Steers retired from the Federal Service in November 1961, having spent 18 years with the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the United States Forest Service, and the National Park Service.

A Commendable Service Award of the Department of the Interior was conferred posthumously to Mr. Claude Sanders, a career employee of the National Park Service, who was killed on August 26, 1961, in an airplane crash near Mount McKinley, Alaska. Superintendent Garrison presented the Award, Department Medal and a lifetime pass to units of the National Park Service, to Mrs. Sanders, on December 17, at the home of her parents in Lovell, Wyoming. Mrs. Sanders has two children.

Yellowstone Lake was frozen over on December 10.

The Superintendent's Staff meeting was held December 12.

December 25, Christmas Day, was a legal holiday.

Birth. A daughter, Amette, was born to Mr. and Mrs. David Olson, December 17, in the Memorial Hospital, Livingston, Montana. Mr. Olson is Accounts Maintenance Clerk.

Operations

Ranger Activities. Most Park Rangers were engaged in the elk reduction and trapping operations during the month. All operations were suspended during Christmas week.

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Corral Operations. Direct responsibility of the Park's horse stock is vested in the Chief Ranger's office since the retirement of David Pierson. Weekly inspections were made of the animals which are in winter pasture on the Ellery Merrell ranch.

Roads and Trails. Road crew activities included snow plowing to Lake through December 15; to Cooke City on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, as needed; and occasionally to Norris from the 15th through the 30th.

Sanitation. The Sanitarian worked almost daily collecting specimens from the elk reduction.

Cooperative Activities

Publicity. On each Thursday the Yellowstone Weekly News was issued to Park employees, concessioners and others currently informed of Park happenings.

Religious and Chapel Use. The Chapel was used every Sunday for the regular Sunday School and Protestant church services. A special Christmas Eve service was held December 24 at 7:00 p.m., conducted by Rev. M. Allen Line.

History. The Park Historian completed the texts for the spruce forest and the natural bridge interpretive signs and began research on the "Yellowstone Winter Tragedy" text.

Research and Observation. Park Naturalist (Geologist) Marler reported that Steamboat Geyser is showing increasing activity, not only in frequency, but in power of play. Eruptions occur every 1 to 3 minutes, with a maximum height of from 30 to 40 feet.

Mr. Marler devoted considerable time during December to compiling 1961 data on the Park's major geysers.

Museum Activities. The evaluation lists of accessioned property were prepared on Form DI-102. Total value now amounts to \$38,305.00.

Special Activities. On December 5, the Park Naturalist traveled to Helena for the Montana Natural Resources Council Meeting and to visit the State Library and Museum.

The Park Naturalist presented a 45 minute talk at the Livingston Rotary Club to an audience of 69 persons on December 4.

Field Research Seminars. Dr. Vincent J. Schaefer, Research Consultant, Schenectady, New York, plans to continue research work at Old Faithful, January 3 to February 8. Ten scientists will participate in studies in atmospheric, cloud formations, crystallization, etc.

The Boeing Aircraft Company of Seattle, Washington, plan to have five or six people at Old Faithful for three weeks starting January 15. This group will conduct studies and experiments under the auspices of the Air Force Space Research Program.

Safety. A report from the Yellowstone Park Safety Committee revealed that Yellowstone Park employees operated during the month of December 1961 without a lost time accident.

Construction. Taggart Construction Company moved from their respective projects at Lake, Canyon and Norris December 11. All contractor personnel had departed the Park by December 13.

Wildlife and Fish Cultural Activities.

Bighorn Sheep. Sheep were observed on Junction Butte and between Mammoth and Gardiner.

Bison. As a result of our elk live trapping program, 64 bison were caught in the Crystal Creek trap during December. All but one cow were removed from the Park by the Texas Meat Company representatives. One cow got down on the floor of the truck and her neck was broken by another bison stepping on her. She was shot, dressed out and hung and will be sold to the next group of Indians arriving for elk.

Biologists from the Montana State Fish and Game Department were in the area aiding in the collection of biological data, and four students from Montana State College cooperated in this study, in addition to Laboratory Biologist Ken Greer.

Eagles. Golden and Bald eagles were observed frequently in the Slough Creek area between the highway and the transfer station.

Elk. Under the direction of Chief Park Ranger Oscar Dick, and Biologist Robert E. Howe, 21 rangers worked full time on the elk reduction and trapping program during December. Full time assistance was received from several people from other divisions in taking biological samples and statistics, weighing carcasses, filling orders for meat and record keeping, taking of photographs, and miscellaneous chores. Biological material has been collected in our cooperative efforts with the Montana Fish and Game Department. Age classes are being kept on all animals from which specimens are gathered. All activities were suspended during the Christmas holidays. Assistance has been requested from several Parks and it is expected these men will arrive soon after January 2.

Dr. Robert Noah, Department of Agriculture, Animal Disease Eradication Division, Riverton, Wyoming, and an assistant, collected 157 blood specimens from the elk shot in the reduction. He will be notified of the results as soon as they are available. Tests will be made for brucellosis, tularemia, red water, leptospirosis, and anaplasmosis.

Elk Trapping

Elk trapping, on a limited scale, began December 11, with the Gardiner trap set. On December 12, the Crystal Creek trap was set. Four elk trapped were caught in the Gardiner trap on the 16th. These animals were ear tagged and released as part of our cooperative migration study with the Wyoming Game and Fish Commission.

We have approved release from the Montana Fish and Game Department and the U. S. Forest Service for 45 live elk for a plant in the Deer Lodge National Forest.

Dr. Paul Holcomb, Animal Disease Eradication Division, Department of Agriculture, has been making blood tests of elk before acceptance by Montana. Dr. Holcomb will also take blood samples from the bison.

Moose. The cow and bull moose at Tower Fall Ranger station continued to browse between the Yellowstone River and the corral in the service area, usually bedding down behind the ranger residence each evening.

Swan. Twenty-eight swan were seen along the Yellowstone River above the falls.

Waterfowl. Many goldeneye and mallard ducks were observed on the Yellowstone River above the falls.
