PURPOSE

The 1994 River Conservation Directory is intended to:

- o promote, strengthen, and help unify the river conservation movement nationwide;
- o offer a source of contacts for those interested in volunteering in river conservation work;
- o encourage the interaction and involvement of citizens and government agencies in river conservation efforts;
- o help connect groups that have common river conservation interests and goals find each other;
- o provide a source of contacts for those initiating river conservation efforts.

ABOUT THE LISTINGS

The Directory includes agencies and organizations, both public and nonprofit, whose missions directly involve river conservation, although the 1994 Directory has hundreds more listings than the 1992 edition. It is by no means a complete listing of all interests concerned with river conservation. For example, local chapters of national organizations frequently are involved in river issues, and our listing includes only those chapters of which we are aware. We suggest you contact the appropriate national organization for details of the affiliate nearest you. In addition, there are hundreds of local "stream watch" or "stream team" organizations. PREFACE

The National Park Service (NPS) Rivers, Trails and Conservation Assistance Program and American Rivers, Inc. developed the 1994 River Conservation Directory through a cooperative agreement initiated in August, 1993.

The National Park Service Rivers, Trails and Conservation Assistance Program helps states, local governments, and citizen organizations protect and restore river and trail corridors nationwide. NPS staff can provide technical assistance in performing statewide river assessments, developing conservation strategies for individual streams or watersheds, revitalizing metropolitan waterways, pursuing National Wild and Scenic River designations, and creating water trails and greenways. The NPS program is based on the principle of partnerships. By working together, government agencies, private organizations, and landowners can more effectively meet the challenges of river and trail conservation. The NPS helps these groups set goals, tackle difficult issues, and develop ways to reach a consensus for the future use and protection of land and water resources that are important to them.

American Rivers is a national conservation organization, which since 1973 has addressed river protection issues across the country. American Rivers' mission is to preserve and restore America's river systems and to foster a river stewardship ethic, by working cooperatively with citizens nationwide and with state and federal agencies.

American Rivers accomplishes its mission through work in six conservation arenas:

- * preservation of nationally significant rivers;
- * hydropower policy reform;
- * protection of endangered aquatic and riparian species;
- * allocation of western water and protection of instream flows;
- * clean water protection; and
- * urban river restoration and conservation.

River conservation is the careful utilization and preservation of rivers and their related resources. It involves the protection of recreation access, scenic beauty, stream beds, wetlands, adjacent lands, water quality, instream flow, and associated flora and fauna.

A successful river conservation effort must include a wide range of players. We encourage all interested parties to become active in river conservation efforts, including river-related businesses and industries, nature centers, universities, planning commissions and departments, private consultants, utility companies, sport and nature clubs, museums, realtor associations and boards, town councils, local community leaders, zoning boards, public schools, developers, and, perhaps most of all, the general public.

There are over 2,050 organizations and agencies listed in this edition; we hope that the 1994 River Conservation Directory will serve as a tool to help these groups work in partnership for the stewardship of one of our most valuable resources -- rivers.
