Subject: Monthly Narrative Report for August 1962

General

<u>Weather</u> Thunderstorms were common during the first two-thirds of the month. Snow appeared on the higher peaks later in the month, with some frost in the lower valleys.

Enough precipitation fell to prevent fire danger from becoming critical.

A mild tornado was observed coming off Mirror Plateau on August 22. Many trees were blown down and rough lake conditions existed.

The Beartooth Highway was closed on the 28th due to snow and poor visibility.

Increase or Decrease in Travel A total of 592,606 visitors were recorded during the month, an increase of 30% above August 1961. Travel dropped during the last few days of the month due to adverse weather and opening of many schools throughout the country on August 27. On August 24, 1,610,094 visitors had entered the Park this season exceeding the all-time travel year of 1957. According to the latest figures, Park travel is 24.8 per cent ahead of last year, and the month of August to date has shown the remarkable increase of 32.9 per cent. Travel to and from the Seattle World's Fair has contributed to the record-breaking travel.

On Monday, August 20, the season's travel totalled 1,533,307, surpassing last year's total of 1,528,088. Daily travel during August through the 21st, has averaged just over 20,000 visitors per day.

<u>Range</u> On August 31, Mr. Bergstrom, under contract through the University of Wyoming's Biological Station at Jackson to inventory and set up range study plots in connection with the new 5-acre exclosures, had completed his work.

The Junction Butte and Tower Fall new range exclosures were located. By August 31 four new 5-acre exclosures had been completed by the construction crews and the fifth, Tower Fall, was under construction.

<u>Visitors</u> Former Director of the National Park Service, Horace M. Albright, August 22-31.

Mr. and Mrs. Edmund B. Rogers, former Superintendent of Yellowstone, visited friends here the week of August 27.

Distinguished Visitor Col. John H. Glenn and family visited the Park on August 21. Superintendent Garrison, who met them at West Thumb, accompanied them on the southern loop, visiting Old Faithful, Norris, Canyon and Lake. Superintendent Garrison reported that Col. Glenn and his family are wonderful people, who accept their world fame modestly but straighforwardly. The Colonel was quickly recognized by visitors as they toured the Park and he graciously responded to all requests for autographs and photos. He was extremely interested in Park operations, ready with questions about policies and standards and sympathetic to the Service's objectives.

Martin Litton, photographer for Sunset Magazine, arrived August 23 for about a month's stay. He and his group will do a camping story, with photographs, about Yellowstone.

Inspections Regional Forester Gynn, Forestry Technician Reeves, and Park Forester Myers, in company with U. S. Forest Service officials from the Region One, office in Missoula, made an inspection of the Blister Rust Control areas in the Fark, Blister Rust and Commandra Rust test plots in the Custer National Forest and in Yellowstone on August 6-10.

A group of eleven U. S. Forest Service officials were accompanied on a show-me trip from the Northeast Entrance to Manmoth on the 16th.

Inspections were made by the following officials from the Midwest Regional Office: George H. Baggley, Assistant Regional Director, August 2-4; Chester Brown, Recreational Resources, August 19; Frank Childs, Chief of Ranger Services, August 22; Elbert Smith, Chief of Concessions Management, August 27; and Leroy Brown, Chief, Programs Coordinator, August 13-18. From the Washington Office: Stanford Young, Division of Recreation Resource Planning,

August 10-11; and from WODC, Ralph McFadden, Electronics Engineer, August 12-16.

Frank Childs, Regional Chief of Ranger Activities arrived August 20 for a week's stay. Retiring in September, this will be Mr. Child's last official visit to Yellowstone. In 1929 Frank entered the Service as a Park Ranger on the Yellowstone staff.

Mr. Bert Floyd, Recruiting Representative, Denver Region, U. S. Civil Service Commission, was in the Park August 21-27 contacting Federal seasonal employees and concessioner employees at various locations throughout the Park.

Ralph McFadden of WODC visited the Park in regard to the radio system and audio visual installations. Inspection of the FM radio indicated that the contractor was not meeting specifications. Currently, liquidated damages are being assessed until repairs are effected.

Billionth Visitor Mr. Faul Geiman and family of Baltimore, Maryland were greeted by Superintendent Garrison at the East Gate at 12:42 p.m., August 22, and honored as representatives of the billionth visitor to the national parks of the United States. The ceremony was planned by the Washington Office to occur throughout the National Park System at precisely the same time, on the same date, to symbolize the occurrence of the billionth visit to the national parks during the 58 years that visitor records have been maintained. Mr. and Mrs. Ceiman, daughter, Jane, 15, and a friend, Adele Weetenkamp, also 15, were presented with gifts by Park concessioners in honor of the occasion.

Special Activities Assistant Chief Park Naturalist Good spent August 2 with Dr. Irving J. Witkind of the U. S. Geological Survey, who is mapping a quadrangle which includes a part of the Park in Gallatin Valley.

The Chief Park Naturalist and the Assistant Chief Park Eaturalist spent time in the field with the National Science Foundationsponsored Summer Conference on Structures and Origins of Volcanic Rocks under the direction of Dr. Parsons.

On August 24, George Marler, Park Naturalist (Geology) was presented an honorary Doctorate degree from Brigham Young University. The degree is in recognition of Mr. Marler's distinguished work on the geysers and hot springs of Yellowstone National Park. (see photo attached)

Park Historian Aubrey Haines departed the Park August 2 for Portland, Oregon and Mount Rainier National Park to attend a meeting of the Oregon Historical Society at Mount Rainier upon the release of his book "Mountain Fever; Historic Ascents of Rainier".

Administrative Officer Anderson, Personnel Officer Miller, and Personnel Management Specialist Thompson, attended a planning session sponsored by the Morthern Region, U. S. Forest Service, at Missoula, for the 1962 Wage Board Survey, August 28-30.

The annual Campfire Day pagesnt, re-enacting the Washburne-Langford-Doane Expedition of 1870 was presented at Madison Junction on Sunday, August 19. Approximately 1,200 people, the largest audience ever, attended the showing.

Alfred A. Bowman, Asaistant Postmaster, Yellowstone Park Post Office, transferred to Powell, Wyoming as Assistant Postmaster, August 20. Mr. Bowman was an old-timer in the Park, having lived here all his life except for the time spent in the Army and at college. He started working in the Post Office during summer vacation periods while attending Montana State College.

The new Assistant Postmaster is Charles E. DesRoches, who has been Station Superintendent at the Old Faithful Post Office.

Superintendent Garrison and his staff met with Ralph HcFadden of WODC, and representatives of Land-Air radio to review radio communications in the Park. Mile by mile communications tests were made between headquarters and mobile units on August 14 and 22, covering most Park roads.

 T_{WO} earth tremors were felt in the Canyon area, one at 5:15 a.m. and the second at 6:20 a.m. on August 26. Both were violent enough to shake buildings in the Government area but apparently no damage was done.

Following the water phase that lasted almost an hour, steam rose many hundreds of feet with great force. The last similar eruption of Steamboat was on September 1, 1961.

The Docates income Contract Contract and the second contract of the

USGA Two representative of the U.S. Geological Survey gathered information on gravity measurements in the Lake area on August 20.

<u>Maps</u> The Air National Guard of Battle Greek, Michigan, made a final flight in August to get the remaining aerial photos of the northern Yellowstone and should deliver a mosaic and three prints of each photo by the end of September. This is the biggest operation of this kind they have ever undertaken.

Operations

Ranger Activities All entrence stations, Lake, Canyon and headquarters maintained 24-hour operation during August.

In order to handle the increase of visitors, rangers have been working six days per weak for the first three weeks in August. A total of 323 hours of uncompensated overtime was reported worked by rangers of the South District.

Law Enforcement A total of 99 persons were tried before the U.S. Commissioner during the month, as compared to 83 persons during August 1961. Fines totaling \$1,946 were levied by the Court, of which \$130.00 were suspended.

U. S. Attorney, Robert H. Chaffin, of Cheyenne, Byoming, was in the Park August 22-24 for the purpose of reviewing problems relating to investigation of offenses and prosecution of cases in the U. S. Commissioner's Court. Mr. Chaffin visited each of the three districts and discussed enforcement problems with Superintendent Garrison and his staff. The anticipated object of this visit is the formulation of enforcement guidelines which will provide uniform protection and safety of persons and property.

<u>Campgrounds</u> The campgrounds in the Park were full to overcrowded during the earlier period of the month, but with the slump in travel during the last few days, there was adequate room.

Back country use continued to be excellent. A total of 87 people visited the Thorofare area. Shoshone Lake recorded 222 people, and Heart Lake showed visits from 235 individuals. A total of 962 visitors made other hiking-fishing trips into the more remote areas.

<u>Complaints</u> Complaints were received at all stations about the conditions of the West Thumb-Lake road which is under construction. Many written complaints have been received concerning facilities of the Yellowstone Park Company.

The new hospital in the Lake area is progressing rapidly, and the mid-October completion date still holds.

Forest Insect and Disease Control Regional Forester Gynn and Forester Hyers made a reconnaissance survey of White Pine-Ribbs distribution on Cook Peak on the 31st. Pure stands of Pinus Albicaulis were observed on the highest elevations with heavy growth of ribes montigenum at the base of trees and fallen logs. An old infestation of Hountain Pine Beetle killed thousands of White Bark Pine leaving a skeleton forest with an intermingling of mature White Pine still growing to carry on the task of reseeding the infestation area. Reproduction in some of these areas will go well over 1,000 trees per acre. No Blister Rust was found on either White Pine or Ribes.

Ribes eradication was completed in the Graig Pass on August 10. The work was completed in the Antelope Greek and Mt. Washburn extension units on the 24th.

Wildlife and Fish Cultural Activities Mountain Lion One observed in the Lower Geyser basin.

<u>Black Swift</u> (cy pseloides niger) has been reported for the first time in Yellowstone National Park.

Bear Thirteen cases of bear feeding have been brought before the U. S. Commissioner to date, with a total of 3110 in fines.
