





THE NATIONAL HISTORIC PRESERVATION ACT OF 1966

In the decade since the passage of the 1966 Historic Preservation Act, our nation has witnessed far reaching changes in the field of historic preservation. One of those changes has involved a growing awareness of the need to protect and preserve our historic patrimony as the tangible link with those seminal events which shaped our country and its culture. We have also come to understand that great nations endure because their traditions are maintained and protected. In the 1966 National Historic Preservation Act, the Federal government made an unprecedented commitment to encourage public and private historic preservation activities. This legislation authorizes the Secretary of the Interior to expand and maintain the National Register of Historic Places as the official inventory of the Nation's cultural property that is worth saving; it establishes procedures to protect registered properties from adverse effects of federally supported undertakings; and it provides for a program of matching grants-in-aid to the States and the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

In the ten years since passage of the 1966 Act more than 12,000 properties have been included in the National Register and over 1600 grants totalling \$38.7 million have been awarded for Statewide survey and planning efforts, and acquisition and development projects.

Matching grants-in-aid of up to 50 percent are available to the 50 States of the Union, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, and the National Trust for Historic Preservation. Grants may be used for preparation of comprehensive statewide historic preservation surveys and plans, and for acquisition and development of properties listed in the National Register. The States and territories may transfer funds to local governments, private organizations, or individuals.

Authority for the program has been delegated to the Director of the National Park Service, who has assigned administrative responsibilities to the Division of Grants, Office of Archeology and Historic Preservation.

The Program

Project Eligibility

Eligible projects include the acquisition of title to or interests in properties listed in the National Register, as well as the protection, rehabilitation, restoration, and reconstruction of such properties. All projects must be in accordance with an approved State Historic Preservation Plan.

The State Historic Preservation Plan is prepared in three volumes. Volume I, "The Historical Background," organizes the State's history into categories to assure that all segments will be identified. Volume II, "The Inventory," lists individual sites which fall into these historical categories. Volume III, "The Annual Preservation Program," focuses on the status of the grants program within the State and outlines the State's intentions for the fiscal year. The State's specific requests for survey and planning and acquisition and development funding are set forth here. Volume III is intended to be a current document, and it may be amended by agreement of the State Historic Preservation Officer and the National Park Service.

The Annual Program Grant

Following appropriation of funds by the Congress, an annual program grant is awarded to each participating State the National Trust on the basis of need as determined by the Secretary of the Interior. Acceptance of the grant by the State constitutes an obligation of Federal funds in the United States Treasury. Project work may be initiated only after approval of documentation required by the National Park Service. Upon a State's request, the Federal government will pay up to 50 percent of allowable project costs. Requests for the release of funds may be submitted after work has been accomplished or at intervals as work progresses.

Survey and Planning

Funds may be used to support the continuing activities of the State in the identification and nomination of historic properties to the National Register, protection of historic properties, preparation and updating of the State Historic Preservation Plan, drafting of project plans and specifications, compilation and publications of information, and for research and other expenses related to the historic preservation program.

Acquisition

Funds may be used for the acquisition of fee simple or less-than-fee-simple title. Fee simple acquisition involves absolute ownership; less-than-free-simple may include acquisition of development rights through easements and acquisition of title subject to a life estate. Acquisition funds may be transferred by the State to local governments, private organizations, or individuals. When an acquisition project results in ownership resting with a private organization or individual, the public interest must be protected with deed covenants assuring continued maintenance and administration, benefit to the public, and first right of refusal on behalf of the State.

Development Projects

Funds may be used for the protection, rehabilitation, restoration, and reconstruction of historic properties according to professional standards established by the Secretary of the Interior. Demonstration of conformance to standards must be shown in the form of plans, specifications, shop drawings, or other materials submitted by the State to the National Park Service, or by onsite inspections by Division of Grants personnel. Funds may be transferred by the State to local governments, private organizations, or individuals. Private transferees are required to encumber the deed with a covenant in the name of the State guaranteeing public benefit and the continued maintenance and administration of the property. The length of the covenant is determined by the amount of Federal grant assistance accepted.


This publication provides, on a State-by-State basis, a complete list of grant assisted projects as of November 30, 1975, since passage of the Historical Preservation Act, Survey and planning projects are listed first under each State; these entries do not include descriptive paragraphs because the funds assigned to all survey and planning projects are utilized in assisting activities associated with conducting historic surveys, nominating properties to the National Register, and preparing and implementing State Historic Preservation Plans and programs. Following the listing of survey and planning project are entries describing acquisition and development project by historic property, including information on ownership as of November 30, 1975, describing the property's significance, and summarizing the work that has been or will be accomplished

with grant assistance. The dollar figure for each entry is the amount of Federal aid for that particular project. The middle two-digit figure in the official grant number indicates the fiscal year of the grant.




Tombstone Historic District, Bank Building, Cochise Co., Arizona



SITE OF OLD ST. STEPHENS (01-71-00004-00). *St. Stephens vic., Washington Co.* Private ownership. Alabama's territorial capital from 1817 to 1819. State to acquire approximately 74 acres to facilitate protection of ruins at the site. \$18,199.48.

DR. J. C. FRANCIS OFFICE (01-71-00010-00). *Jacksonville, Calhoun Co.* State ownership (Historical Commission). A typical doctor's office of the 1850's and only remaining structure of its type in northeast Alabama. Restoration of office and apothecary shop as ante-bellum medical museum. \$4,000.

HORTON MILL (COVERED BRIDGE (01-71-00013-00)). *Oneonta vic., Blount Co.* State ownership (Historical Commission). A two-span structure with a Town truss spanning the Calvert Prong of the Warrior River. Roof replacement and general repairs. \$5,000.

BLUFF HALL (01-71-00014-00). *Demopolis, Marengo Co.* Private ownership (Marengo County Historical Society). An impressive Greek Revival landmark and home of Francis Strother Lyon, a cotton planter who served in both the United States and Confederate Congresses. Restoration of interior and chimneys. \$3,000.

FENDALL HALL (01-72-00016-00). *Eufaula, Barbour Co.* An ante-bellum home in the Italianate style built by a Eufaula merchant and banker. Acquisition by the State. \$29,537.92.

FENDALL HALL (01-72-00019-00). See above (72-00016-00). Utility and structural repairs; painting; replacement of exterior brackets; clearing of grounds; and archeological research necessary for restoration. \$6,374.08.

FORT TOULOUSE (01-72-00021-00). *Wetumpka vic., Elmore Co.* Multiple public ownership, including Alabama Historical Commission and the U.S. Army Corps of En-

gineers. The Province of Louisiana's eastern outpost in the French and Indian War and later the site of Fort Jackson. Archeological investigations; partial excavations; and preparation of map and report to guide further development. \$22,000. ■

FORT MIMS SITE (01-73-00031-00). *Tensaw vic., Baldwin Co.* State ownership. Site of 1813 massacre during the Creek Indian War. Archeological exploration and publication of findings. \$10,598.

GAINESWOOD (01-73-00032-00).

Demopolis, Marengo Co. State ownership (Historical Commission). Alabama's largest and most elaborate ante-bellum Greek Revival mansion. Restoration of second floor, slave quarters, and music pavilion; installation of burglar alarm and fire/smoke detection systems; and landscaping. \$30,000. ■

FORT TOULOUSE (01-73-00039-00). See above (72-00021-00). Excavation of dry moat, parade ground, watch tower, and maga-

FORT MIMS SITE (01-73-00031-03). See above (73-00031-00). Completion of archeological research to uncover structures in and near the fort site. \$7,000.

zine of 1751 fort; excavation of cedar plank floor of 1814 Fort Jackson. \$12,484.10. ■

SEMPLE HOUSE (01-73-00041-00). *Montgomery, Montgomery Co.* State ownership. Built in the 1850's, this home is the last surviving ante-bellum residence in its original location in the Capitol Hill area. It was the home of a Supreme Court Justice. Exterior repair and interior restoration. \$44,337.

FENDALL HALL (01-73-00059-04). See above (72-00019-00). Demolition of later additions; repair of cupola and roof; restoration of first floor interiors. \$30,533.90.

COLEMAN-BANKS HOUSE (01-74-00071-00). *Eutaw, Greene Co.* County ownership (Greene County Commission). Major Greek Revival landmark of middle Alabama (1845), including smoke house and separate kitchen. Preliminary architectural plans. \$1,500.

POWDER MAGAZINE (01-74-00079-00). *Montgomery, Montgomery Co.* Municipal ownership. One of two such remaining facilities, built in 1840; purchased by state in 1861 and used to store powder during the Civil War. Plans and specifications. \$950.

FIRST WHITE HOUSE OF THE CONFEDERACY (01-74-00091-00). *Montgomery, Montgomery Co.* State ownership (White

House Association). 1825 mansion served as official residence of Jefferson Davis before the capital was moved to Richmond. To be restored to ca. 1861. \$50,000.

KIRKBRIDE HOUSE (FORT CONDE-CHARLOTTE HOUSE) (01-74-00091-22-E). *Mobile, Mobile Co.* Private ownership (National Society of Colonial Dames of Alabama). 1822 Greek Revival home on site of 1711 Fort, owned successively by French, English and Spanish until surrendered to United States in 1813. Interior and exterior restoration. \$21,420.

PERRY STREET HISTORIC DISTRICT: WILLIAM KNOX HOUSE (01-74-00091-24-E). *Montgomery, Montgomery Co.* An 1855 home, built for a prominent banker, one of the two largest and most elaborate antebellum homes in Alabama. Partial acquisition of structure and ¼ acre by William Knox House Association from Landmarks Foundation of Montgomery, Inc. \$17,325.

RUSSELL COUNTY COURTHOUSE AT SEALE (01-75-00112-00). *Seale, Russell Co.* Public ownership (Russell County). Oldest surviving courthouse in eastern Alabama (1869). Roof re-framing with cedar shingles. \$13,000.

FORT TOULOUSE (01-75-00114-00). See above (72-00021-00). Restoration of 1751 French dry moat palisade wall. \$38,475. ■

PERRY STREET HISTORIC DISTRICT: WILLIAM KNOX HOUSE (01-75-00115-00). See above (74-00091-25). Project involves partial acquisition of structure and ¼ acre by William Knox House Association. \$7,325.

TANNEHILL FURNACE (01-75-00125-00). *Abernaut vic., Tuscaloosa Co.* State ownership. Constructed in 1859, the best preserved early Alabama furnace. Such furnaces were the foundation of Alabama's industrial economy. Reconstruction of furnace. \$5,000.

ALASKA TOTEMS (02-71-00005-00).
Ketchikan, Southeastern District. Multiple public ownership. Preservative treatment for 38 totem poles and fragments retrieved from abandoned village sites. \$4,000.

TOTEM BIGHT STATE HISTORIC SITE (02-71-00010-00). *Ketchikan vic., Southeastern District.* State ownership (Division of Parks). A site containing a replica of a 19th century community house and 13 totem poles that are copies of 19th century originals. Rehabilitation of house and environs; historical and architectural research. \$42,224.91.

ST. MICHAEL'S CATHEDRAL (02-71-00010-02). *Sitka, Southeastern District.* Private ownership (The Orthodox Church in America). One of the finest examples of Russian architecture in the western hemisphere, destroyed by fire in 1966. Complete reconstruction, based to a large extent on records of the Historic American Buildings Survey. \$18,313.92 ■

NENANA (STEAMER) (02-72-00017-03). *Fairbanks, Interior District.* Municipal ownership. Best surviving of many sternwheel packets that operated on the Yukon River from 1898 until after W.W.II. Restoration of exterior and engine room. \$1,432.01.

GEORGE C. THOMAS MEMORIAL LIBRARY (02-74-00022-00). *Fairbanks, Interior District.* Municipal ownership. One of the oldest buildings in Fairbanks, constructed in 1909 with funds provided by George C. Thomas, a layman interested in the work of the Episcopal Church, to serve St. Matthew's Mission. Installation of sprinkler system and replacement of roof. \$11,287.

NENANA (STEAMER) (02-74-00023-00). See above (71-00017-03). Restoration of engine room; exterior painting; and replacement of decking where required. \$9,731.

FORT WILLIAM H. SEWARD: BUILDING 13- HOSPITAL (02-74-00024-00) *Port Chilkoot, Southeastern District.* Private

ownership (Alaska Indian Arts, Inc.). The only surviving military entity representing the Army's role in the 1898-1904 Gold Rush. Repairs to siding, eaves, roof and chimney; exterior painting. \$4,000.

CHURCH OF THE HOLY ASCENSION (02-75-00026-00). *Unalaska, South Central District*. Private (church) ownership. The oldest building in Alaska. Originally constructed in 1808, it was repeatedly destroyed by fire and rebuilt, the last time in 1894. Exterior repairs and painting. \$3,700. ■

NENANA (STEAMER) (02-75-00027-00). See above (72-00017-03). Restoration of paddlewheel. \$7,000.

SAINT MICHAEL'S CATHEDRAL (02-75-00031-00). See above (71-00010-02). Interior reconstruction. \$25,000. ■

ALASKA NATIVE BROTHERHOOD HALL, SITKA CAMP NO. 1 (02-75-00032-00). *Sitka, Southeastern District*. Private ownership (Alaska Native Brotherhood). Early 20th century structure and headquarters of oldest organization, founded in 1912, to represent native Alaskan rights. Historic Landmark of Southeastern Alaska. Replacement of existing pilings; repainting; and electrical wiring. \$25,000.

TANGLE LAKES ARCHEOLOGICAL DISTRICT (02-75-00034-00). *Paxson vicinity*.

FORT WILLIAM H. SEWARD: BUILDING 13 (02-75-00029-00). See above (74-00024-00). Interior and exterior restoration. \$4,000.

SHELDON JACKSON MUSEUM (02-75-00030-00). *Sitka, Southeastern District*. Private ownership (Sheldon Jackson College). First concrete structure and museum in Alaska (1896); served Society of Alaskan National Ethnographers and Historians. Fire and intrusion protection system to be installed. \$850.



ATAULOMA GIRLS SCHOOL (87-73-00001-00). *Afao, Lealataua Co.* Private ownership (Congregational Church of Jesus Christ), leased to Government of American Samoa. One of the oldest buildings in American Samoa, dating from 1900, and an example of early European influence. Painting, roofing, and repairs. \$43,750.



YUMA CROSSING AND ASSOCIATED SITES: TERRITORIAL PRISON (04-71-00005-00). *Yuma Co.* State ownership (State Parks Board). Repair and stabilization of the Territorial Prison, a central feature of this complex. \$5,000. ■

PUEBLO GRANDE RUIN (04-71-00006-00). *Phoenix, Maricopa Co.* Municipal ownership. One of the few remaining large Hohokam village sites in the region. Acquisition of two land parcels, totalling over 17 acres, that contain prehistoric material. \$8,000. ■

TOMBSTONE HISTORIC DISTRICT: ALLEN STREET (04-71-00007-00). *Tombstone, Cochise Co.* Multiple public and private ownership. Tombstone was a mining frontier town, with a colorful history and unrivaled reputation for lawlessness and violence. Removal of wire lines and electric streetlights; installation of gas lamps, sidewalk canopies, and boardwalks, along three blocks of Allen Street. \$5,560.86. ●

OLD LA PAZ (LAGUNA DE LA PAZ) (04-71-00008-00). *Ehrenberg vic., Yuma Co.* Indian Trust Land (Colorado River Indian Tribes). Site of a now-deserted gold mining city and active Colorado River Port of the 1860's that contains mounds and depressions

indicating locations of buildings and streets. Excavation to expose townsite foundations. \$7,071.

FORT VERDE DISTRICT (04-72-00011-00). *Yavapai Co.* Site of military post associated with Crook's campaign against the northern Apaches in 1872 and 1873. Acquisition of approximately 3.5 acres containing original parade ground and one historic structure by State. \$15,000.

TOMBSTONE HISTORIC DISTRICT: ALLEN STREET (04-72-00013-00). See above (71-00017-00). Restoration of canopies and posts. \$2,245. ●

FREMONT HOUSE (04-73-00015-00). *Tucson, Pima Co.* State ownership (Arizona Historical Society). An adobe residence of the type common in Tucson in the 1870's. Restoration of interior walls, floors, doors, and ceilings. \$12,000.

TOMBSTONE HISTORIC DISTRICT: COCHISE COUNTY COURTHOUSE (04-73-00016-00). See above (71-00007-00). Acquisition by State Parks Board of a buffer zone for the courthouse, necessary to preserve the historic character of the area \$7,500. ■

Excavation to determine the perimeters of the town. \$6,000.

PHELPS DODGE GENERAL OFFICE BUILDING (04-73-00018-00). *Bisbee, Cochise Co.* Municipal ownership. A brick building erected c. 1890 to furnish office space in the business center of Bisbee, heart of one of the country's richest copper producing areas. Floor and utility improvements; general repairs; structural work; and exterior painting. \$18,621.

JAMES M. FLAKE HOME (04-73-00019-00). *Snowflake, Navajo Co.* Private (individual) ownership. Built in 1896 by the son of the town's founder, William J. Flake. Roof repair; balustrade restoration; and exterior and interior stabilization. \$2,000.

OLD LA PAZ (LAGUNA DE LA PAZ) (04-74-00022-00). See above (71-00008-00).

ST. PAUL'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH (TOMBSTONE HISTORIC DISTRICT) (04-75-00024-00). *Tombstone, Cochise Co.* Private (church) ownership. A Gothic Revival style church, built in 1882. Restoration of the roof. \$3,467. ■

JESSE N. SMITH HOME (PIONEER MEMORIAL HOME) (04-74-00025-00). *Snowflake, Navajo Co.* Private ownership (Daughters of the Utah Pioneers). Built in 1906 for the fifth wife of Jessie N. Smith and her nine children. Representative of Mormon brick residential architecture. Stabilization of library floor. \$716.

TOMBSTONE HISTORIC DISTRICT: BANK BUILDING (04-74-00027-00). *Tombstone, Cochise Co.* Municipal ownership. Anglo adapted adobe architecture (1881), built on site of first “commercial” house of Tombstone. Funding for research, documentation and photos. \$2,500. ● ,

CORDOVA HOUSE (04-74-00028-00). *Tucson, Pima Co.* Municipal ownership. Typical single story Mexican Town House constructed of unfired adobe block. May be oldest surviving structure in Tucson, dating from as early as 1848. Stabilization of foundation, preservation of adobe; and replacement of roof. \$15,000.

FIRST FLORENCE COURTHOUSE (04-75-00039-00). *Florence, Pinal Co.* State ownership. An Anglo adobe structure, built from 1877 to 1882, the hub of county activities until 1891 when it was converted into a hospital. Plans and specifications: replacement of the porch deck. \$16,000.

OLD NEW-GATE PRISON (09-72-00008-01).
See above (71-00007-00). Restoration of sentry house and prison gates; removal of incongruous structures. \$9,300.

OLD NEW-GATE PRISON (09-73-00010-00).
See above (71-00007-00). Removal of existing frame walls and west gable from 19th century rear addition; shoring of roof; bricking up to cover exterior frame walls. \$9,300. ■

CONNECTICUT STATE CAPITAL (09-73-00011-00). *Hartford, Hartford Co.* State ownership. A Victorian Gothic building dating from 1879. Research and restoration of rotunda. \$15,000. ■

FARMINGTON CANAL LOCK (09-74-00012-00). *Cheshire, New Haven Co.* Municipal ownership. Built before 1828, the best preserved section of the canal system. Restoration of lock; installation of wooden lock gates. \$21,000.

CITY HALL-MONUMENT DISTRICT:
CITY HALL (09-74-00012-00). *New Britain, Hartford Co.* Municipal ownership. Area containing the city hall; a five-story brick Renaissance Revival style building dating from 1885 that was originally a hotel. Cleaning and restoration of main facade to original appearance. \$6,250.

OLD FARM SCHOOLHOUSE (09-74-00014-00). *Bloomfield, Hartford Co.* County ownership. A building dating from 1795 that is the oldest remaining public structure in the city. Extensive restoration of exterior. \$18,984.

OLD NEW-GATE PRISON (09-74-00016-00).
See above (71-00007-00). Installation of roof; reconstruction of chimney; interior carpentry; rebuilding of east frame gable. \$17,368. ■

TAPPING REEVE HOUSE AND LAW SCHOOL (09-74-00017-02-E). *Litchfield, Litchfield Co.* Private ownership (Litchfield Historical Society). First law school in the United States. Installation of electrical and heating services; draining and waterproofing of basement. \$5,000. ■

FARMINGTON HISTORIC DISTRICT: MISS PORTER'S SCHOOL (09-75-00020-00).
Farmington, Hartford Co. Private ownership. District includes more than 150 buildings, oldest of which dates to 17th c. Restoration of original white picket fence and brownstone footings. \$3,900.

GENERAL WILLIAM HART HOUSE (09-75-00022-00). *Old Saybrook, Middlesex Co.* Private ownership (Old Saybrook Society). Georgian style frame house with Federal style portico built by Revolutionary War General. Roof restoration. \$5,000.

RICHARD MANSFIELD HOUSE (09-75-00027-00). *Ansonia, New Haven Co.* Private ownership (Derby Historical Society). Home of Reverend Mansfield from 1748 to 1820. Soil removal; carpentry; clapboard repairs; sash preservation. \$773.

MANSFIELD CENTER HISTORIC DISTRICT: FIRST CHURCH OF CHRIST (09-75-00029-00). *Mansfield Center, Tolland Co.* Private (church) ownership. Constructed in 1866, important as visual focal point in the district. Restoration of roof to original appearance. \$1,014.

NEW HAVEN GREEN HISTORIC DISTRICT: FIRST CHURCH OF CHRIST (09-75-00031-00). *New Haven, New Haven*

NEW LONDON RAILROAD STATION (09-75-00033-00). *New London, New London Co.* Private ownership (Union Station Associates of New London). Last building designed by H. H. Richardson. Preparation of plans and specifications. \$6,110. ●

OLD TOWN HALL (09-75-00035-00). *Stamford Fairfield Co.* Municipal ownership. Built in 1905 in an imposing Beaux Arts style. Restoration on slate and metal roof. \$21,785.

DR. PRATT HOUSE (09-75-00037-00). *Chester, Middlesex Co.* Private (individual) ownership. Large transitional style residence combining features of Greek Revival and Georgian styles. Exterior painting. \$513.

Co. Private ownership. Designed by Ithiel Town in 1813, significant as one of New England's finest ecclesiastical structures. Painting of sanctuary walls. \$3,770.

THOMASTON OPERA HOUSE (09-75-00043-00). *Thomaston, Litchfield Co.* Municipal ownership. Built between 1883-85 as a local cultural center, still used today for the-

WOODBURY HISTORIC DISTRICT: HURD HOUSE AND BARN (09-75-00049-00).

Woodbury, Litchfield Co. Private ownership (Woodbury Historical Society). Structure built before 1690. Preparation of plans and specifications. \$1,950.

WOOSTER SQUARE HISTORIC DISTRICT: WOOSTER SQUARE PARK (09-75-00050-00).

Hartford, Hartford Co. Private ownership (Episcopal Diocese of Hartford). Built in 1868 as a monument to Samuel Colt. Stabilization of stone steeple; replacement with steel of inadequate wooden roof members. \$1,000.

GENERAL DAVID HUMPHREYS HOUSE (09-76-00074-00). *Ansonia, New Haven Co.* Private ownership (Derby Historical Society). Birthplace and home of the prominent local soldier, politician and diplomat. Completion of exterior repairs. \$1,000.



PRINCE GEORGE'S CHAPEL (10-72-00006-00). *Dagsboro vic., Sussex Co.* State ownership. An 18th century church designed like many structures of its type, but executed in wood rather than masonry. Restoration of cruciform shape with vaulted ceilings and box pews; landscaping of churchyard. \$5,000.

LOOCKERMAN HALL (10-72-00008-00). *Dover, Kent Co.* State ownership (Delaware State College). A Georgian plantation house on the college campus. Restoration, to include reroofing; repairs to openings; and architectural survey. \$2,000.

JOHN DICKINSON MANSION (10-73-00016-00). *Kitts Hammock vic., Kent Co.* State ownership. A 1740 house associated with a statesman, writer, and member of the Constitutional Convention. Installation of security system. \$922. ■

OLD COURTHOUSE (OLD COLONY AND STATE HOUSE) NEW CASTLE HISTORIC DISTRICT) (10-73-00017-00). *New Castle, New Castle Co.* State ownership. A focal point within the New Castle Historic District. Installation of security system. \$2,527. ■

PARSON THORNE MANSION (10-73-00020-00). See above (72-00009-00). Preparation of restoration plans and restoration of several rooms. \$2,000.

BARRATT'S CHAPEL (10-73-00021-00). *Frederica vic., Kent Co.* Private ownership (Historical Society of the Peninsula Annual Conference, United Methodist Church). One of the first churches in the state, built c. 1780, important to Delaware's Bicentennial celebration. Partial restoration. \$1,600.

OLD STATE HOUSE (10-75-00027-00) See above (73-00013-00). Archeological documentation; research report; interior and exterior restoration. \$60,000.

OLD SUSSEX COUNTY COURTHOUSE (10-75-00028-00). *Georgetown, Sussex Co.* State ownership. Frame court house constructed in 1791 to serve as meeting place and center for Bicentennial activities. Interior and exterior restoration; installation of burglar and fire alarms. \$100,000.

THE MASONIC HALL AND GRAND THEATER (10-75-00029-00). *Wilmington, New Castle Co.* Private ownership (Grand Opera House, Inc.). 1871 Second Empire style featuring cast iron facade and structural frame. Roof restoration; replastering of ceiling; interior painting. \$50,000.



DAVID G. RANEY HOUSE (12-71-00017-02). *Apalachicola, Franklin Co.* An excellent example, dating from the 1840's, of Greek Revival architecture in Florida. Acquisition by the city from private owner. \$7,500.

PONCE DE LEON INLET LIGHTHOUSE COMPLEX (12-71-00017-03). *Ponce Inlet, Volusia Co.* Municipal ownership. An outstanding example of lighthouse design and engineering dating from 1887. Restoration, including work on windows, front doors, and tower woodwork. \$1,569.

THE ARMORY (12-72-00027-00). *Key West, Monroe Co.* State ownership. One of the few remaining large frame buildings dating from Key West's period of prosperity as a seaport. Exterior and interior restoration. \$20,000.

ASA MAY HOUSE (12-72-00030-06). *Capps, Jefferson Co.* Private ownership (Jefferson County Historical Association, Inc.). A simple Greek Revival farmhouse probably built in the 1840's that illustrates the carpenter classic style and is one of the few antebellum plantation houses remaining in northern Florida. Replacement of roof. \$5,000.

TAMPA BAY HOTEL (12-72-00030-07). *Tampa, Hillsborough Co.* Municipal ownership. An excellent example of late 19th century resort architecture. Repair of veranda. \$6,887.

KEY WEST HISTORIC DISTRICT: OLDEST HOUSE (12-72-00030-12). *Key West, Monroe Co.* State ownership (Historic Key West Preservation Board). Significant as the oldest residential structure in the district. Archeological investigation and historic research. \$4,868.26.

BRADLEE-McINTYRE HOUSE (12-73-00032-00). *Longwood, Seminole Co.* Private ownership (Central Florida Society for Historic Preservation). A typical Victorian-style cottage of the 1880's. Interior and exterior painting and restoration. \$25,000.

ANDREWS MEMORIAL CHAPEL (12-73-00036-00). *Dunedin, Pinellas Co.* Private ownership (Dunedin Historical Society). The first church in Dunedin and a superb example of the carpenter Gothic style. Restoration, including roof repair, interior and exterior painting, rebuilding original chancel, and re-joining a detached section. \$10,000.

ST. AUGUSTINE HISTORIC DISTRICT: AVERO HOUSE (12-73-00037-00). *St. Augustine, St. Johns Co.* Private ownership (Greek Archdiocese of North and South America). First Spanish period coquina residence dating from 1712 that later was used as a place of worship by Greek and Minorcan survivors of the New Smyrna colony. Historical research and archeological investigation. \$3,725.

FORT FOSTER (12-73-00039-00). *Zephyrhills vic., Hillsborough Co.* State ownership. Site of a Second Seminole War post, dating from 1836. Archeological excavation and research. \$11,671.

NEW RIVER INN (CITY HALL ANNEX) (12-73-00040-00). *Fort Lauderdale, Broward Co.* Municipal ownership. One of the city's earliest commercial buildings to be restored as a community center. Exterior painting; wood-work repairs; roof replacement; termite treatment; and stabilization of the foundation. \$25,000.

DAVID G. RANEY HOUSE (12-74-00050-10). See above (71-00017-02). Architectural engineering; historical research; and various repairs and improvements to foundation and exterior. \$7,500.

EAST MARTELLO TOWER (12-74-00052-00). *Key West, Monroe Co.* County ownership. An unusual example of military architecture from the Civil War. Repointing and architectural and engineering research. \$10,000.

PERKINS OPERA HOUSE (12-74-00060-00). *Monticello, Jefferson Co.* See above (71-00017-01). Architectural planning; drawings; window and roof repairs. \$37,500.

FORT COOPER (12-74-00063-00). *Inverness, Citrus Co.* State ownership. A Second Seminole War site. Historical and archeological investigation. \$10,000.

NEW RIVER INN (CITY HALL ANNEX) (12-74-00064-00). See above (73-00040-00). Rehabilitation of interior walls and plumbing. \$14,128.

CHAUTAUQUA AUDITORIUM (12-74-00072-00). *DeFuniak Springs, Walton Co.* Municipal ownership. A building dating from 1910 that is an unusual example of neo-classic wooden construction and a surviving structure of the once nationally famous Chautauqua cultural center. Roof repair; replacement of foundations and footings; and temporary covering of windows. \$20,000.

CHAUTAUQUA AUDITORIUM (12-75-00078-00). See above (74-00072-00). Extensive exterior restoration. \$20,000.

BRADLEE-McINTYRE HOUSE (12-75-00079-00). See above (73-00032-00). Restoration of interior plasterwork, woodwork and floors; updating of electrical and mechanical systems. \$25,000.

HOTEL THOMAS (12-75-00081-00). *Gainesville, Alachua Co.* Municipal ownership. Early 20th century structure of historical and architectural significance. Removal, repair, and/or replacement of wood cornices. \$15,137.

NEW RIVER INN (CITY HALL ANNEX) (12-75-00085-00). See above (73-00040-00). Patching of existing plaster walls; installation of air conditioning and ventilating system and fire detection system; refinishing of counter, stairways and railings. \$31,500.

TAMPA BAY HOTEL (12-75-00088-00). See above (72-00030-07). Repair and painting of minarets; repointing and cleaning of brickwork; repair and cleaning of metal roof. \$75,839.

HOUSE OF REFUGE AT GILBERTS BAR (12-75-00092-00). *Hutchinson Island, Martin Co.* Private ownership (Martin County Historical Society). 1870's structure significant as the last of 15 original houses built along the Atlantic Coast to provide shelter for the ship wreck victims. Extensive exterior and interior restoration. \$50,000.

BRONSON-MOLHOLLAND HOUSE (12-75-00093-00). *Palatka, Putnam Co.* Municipal ownership. Ante-bellum homestead significant as the residence of Isaac Bronson, a prominent jurist and political figure. Historical and architectural research and planning. \$5,000.

CLARA BARKLEY DORR HOUSE (PENSACOLA HISTORIC DISTRICT) (12-75-00096-00). *Pensacola, Escambia Co.* 1871 residential structure significant architecturally as an extension of the Classic Revival style into the post Civil War period. Acquisition by State (Historic Pensacola Preservation Board) from a private organization (Historic Pensacola, Inc.).

FORT GEORGE (12-75-00099-00). *Pensacola, Escambia Co.* Municipal ownership. Revolutionary War site significant as the only undeveloped portion of the British fortification at Pensacola which was besieged and captured by Spanish forces in 1781. Archeological investigation. \$13,700.




SOUTH ELEVATION



MCDONOUGH COUNTY COURTHOUSE (17-75-00054-00). *Macomb, McDonough Co.* County ownership. Built in 1871 in Second Empire style, the seat of McDonough county government until 1972. Rebuilding of entrance stairs and tower balcony; replacement of roof with an 1870 style, Mansard. \$40,000.

OLD DANISH CHURCH (17-75-00055-00). *Sheffield, Bureau Co.* Private ownership (Sheffield Historical Society). The oldest (1880) congregation of the Danish Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Re-roofing. \$3,119.

ULYSSES S. GRANT HOME (17-75-00061-00). *Galena, Jo Daviess Co.* State ownership. Given by the citizens of Galena to General Grant upon his return from the Civil War, this 1857 structure served as the Grant residence until Grant assumed the Presidency. Installation of a fire-detection system and trenching for underground electrical utilities. \$5,000. ■

OLD MARKET HOUSE (17-75-00062-00). *Galena, Jo Daviess Co.* State ownership. Built in 1845-1846 to be used as a market house and public square, city council chamber, and city jail. Restoration of walk and wagon causeway. \$5,000.


WOODSTOCK OPERA HOUSE (17-75-00067-00). *Woodstock, McHenry Co.* Municipal ownership. The opera house, seating 640 people, occupied the second floor of the City Hall, built in 1889. Numerous stars of stage and screen, in particular Orson Welles, were associated with it. Interior and exterior restoration. \$25,000.

GENERAL DEAN SUSPENSION BRIDGE (17-75-00068-00). *Carlyle vic., Clinton Co.* Municipal ownership. Constructed in 1859 over the Kaskasia River, a suspended Howe truss bridge with a wooden deck. Preparation of specifications. \$1,125.

FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT HOME AND STUDIO (17-75-00057-00). *Oak Park, Cook Co.* Private ownership (Frank Lloyd Wright Home and Studio Foundation). Built in 1889 with additions in 1895 and 1898; the residence and architectural studio of Frank Lloyd Wright and an excellent example of his early architectural style. Preparation of plans and specifications. \$2,750.

ISADORE H. HELLER HOUSE (17-75-00058-00). *Chicago, Cook Co.* Private (individual) ownership. Designed by Frank Lloyd Wright in 1897, a fine example of a transitional group of buildings which culminated in Wright's "Prairie" style of architecture. Rebuilding of two chimneys; repair of stained glass windows; restoration of the frieze and ornamental trim. \$20,000.



OLD MAIN (19-74-00018-00). *Mount Pleasant, Henry Co.* Private ownership (Iowa Wesleyan College). Constructed in 1854 in the Federal style. One of the oldest college classroom buildings in Iowa. New roof. \$15,000.

PLUM GROVE (ROBERT LUCAS HOUSE) (19-74-00031-11). *Iowa City, Johnson Co.*, State ownership. First territorial governor's home built in 1844, now a museum. Interior and exterior restoration. \$34,691.

AMANA VILLAGES (19-74-00031-12). *Middle Amana, Iowa Co.* Private ownership (Amana Heritage Society). An 1860's German settlement including both domestic and commercial buildings built of native brick. Restoration of a school building. \$12,400. ■

CHAUTAUQUA PARK: PAVILION (19-74-00038-00). See above (74-00020-00). Continued restoration. \$10,000.

JONATHAN CLARK CONGER HOUSE (19-75-00040-00). *Washington, Washington Co.* Private ownership (Jonathan Clark Conger House, Inc.). Also known as Colonel C. J. Wilson House. Built in stages from 1848 to 1900, this museum house is significant for its Italianate architecture. Reconstruction of blinds and research for reconstruction of the 1860's porch. \$2,000.

DALLAS COUNTY COURTHOUSE (19-75-00043-00). *Adel, Dallas Co.* County ownership. Built in 1902 and significant for its French chateau architecture. Replacement of windows. \$15,000.

Significant for its contribution to musical history in Iowa, this two-story 1893 brick structure was associated with the big bands of the 1940's and noted for its fine acoustical system. SYMPHONY HOUSE (23-74-00038-00). *Bangor, Penobscot Co.* Private ownership (Bangor-Brewer YWCA). A two-story brick structure built in 1843. Project work, including an architectural survey, plumbing and wir-

ing repairs, painting, and restoration of interior molding. \$30,000.

GRAND ARMY MEMORIAL HOME (23-74-00040-00). See above (73-00033-02). Stabilization of early 20th century dormers, installation of fire alarm system, repointing, and painting of exterior trim. \$15,000.

RICHARDSON HOUSE (CAPT. GEORGE McMANUS HOUSE) (23-75-00044-00). *Brunswick, Cumberland Co.* Built in 1857, an example of transitional Greek Revival-Italianate architecture. Originally the home of Capt. George McManus, a prominent Brunswick master mariner. Acquisition of the house and 0.317 acres by the Pejebscot Historical Society from St. Paul's Episcopal Church. \$32,000.

PERCY AND SMALL SHIPYARD (23-75-00045-00). See above (73-00030-00). Continuing restoration. \$40,000.

YORK HISTORIC DISTRICT: ELIZABETH PERKINS HOUSE (23-75-00049-00). *York, York Co.* Private ownership (Society for the Preservation of Historic Landmarks in York County, Inc.). An imposing oak frame residence dating from 1686 and 1730, one of the oldest surviving colonial homes in Maine. Roofing, masonry repairs, and exterior painting. \$22,500.

MORSE-LIBBY MANSION (23-75-00050-00). See above (72-00018-00). Continuing restoration. \$10,000. ■

CUMSTON HALL (23-75-00065-00). *Monmouth, Kennebec Co.* Municipal ownership. An unusual wooden Romanesque Revival structure built in 1900, and presently used as a town hall and summer theater. Repainting and repairs to exterior wooden members. \$6,000.

BATH HISTORIC DISTRICT: CENTRAL CHURCH (23-75-00068-00). *Bath, Sagadahoc Co.* A large scale wood frame Gothic Revival church dating from 1846, one of the earliest works of the prominent Boston architect, Arthur Gilman, designer of Boston City Hall. Repointing, repair of tower, exterior painting. \$22,500.





PACA HOUSE AND GARDEN (COLONIAL ANNAPOLIS HISTORIC DISTRICT) (24-71-00006-00). *Annapolis, Anne Arundel Co.* State ownership. Colonial gardens at the William Paca House, home of Maryland patriot and signer of the Declaration of Independence. Restoration. \$10,000. ●■

PEMBERTON HALL (24-71-00007-00). *Salisbury, Wicomico Co.* State ownership. A brick house dating from 1741. Restoration. \$1,000.

FULLER-BAKER LOG HOUSE (24-71-00008-00). *Grantsville vic., Garrett Co.* Private ownership (Council of the Alleghenies).

An early 19th century log house typical of dwellings once common on the Maryland frontier. General rehabilitation and improvements. \$1,800.

UNION MILLS HOMESTEAD HISTORIC DISTRICT (24-71-00012-00). *Union Mills, Carroll Co.* County ownership. Building dating from 1797 associated with the early history of a small-scale industrial complex and active crossroads settlement. Roof, wiring, and frame timber repairs; general improvements. \$1,000.

FORT GARRISON (24-71-00013-00). *Stevenson, Baltimore Co.* County ownership. A fortification garrisoned during the French and Indian War. Restoration of the one remaining building, a massive fieldstone structure and only surviving stone blockhouse in Maryland. \$429.

PACA HOUSE AND GARDEN (COLONIAL ANNAPOLIS HISTORIC DISTRICT) (24-72-00023-00). See above (71-00006-00). Continuing restoration, including installation of water circulation system, and construction of sandstone steps. \$7,300. ■●

DENTON HOUSE (CHESTERTOWN HISTORIC DISTRICT) (24-73-00035-00). See above (71-00004-00). Completion of front facade restoration, construction of a seawall, installation of climate control unit. \$7,000. ●

MICHAEL CRESAP HOUSE (24-73-00043-00). *Oldtown, Allegany Co.* Private (individual) ownership. One of the oldest structures in the town, home of an 18th century frontiersman. Work to include the installation of fire resistant cedar shingles, repair of exterior wood trim, repointing of stone walls. \$4,500.

OTTERBEIN CHURCH (24-74-00057-00). *Baltimore (independent city).* Private (church) ownership. A brick building constructed in 1785, the oldest church in continuous use in the City of Baltimore. Restoration of steeple, exterior painting and installation of lightning protection system. \$2,847.

RODGERS TAVERN (24-74-00114-00). *Perryville, Cecil County.* Private ownership (Society for the Preservation of Maryland Antiquities). FRIENDSHIP HALL (24-75-00124-00). *East New Market, Dorchester Co.* Private (individual) ownership. One of the finest pre-Revolutionary residences extant in Dorchester County. General interior and exterior restoration. \$15,000.

POPLAR HILL MANSION (24-75-00127-00). *Salisbury, Wicomico Co.* Municipal ownership with retention of easement rights by State. Two and one-half story Federal style frame house, the only building of architectural merit to survive the fires of 1860 and 1886. Upgrading of mechanical systems; refinishing of floors; and repainting. \$11,000.

CHESTERTOWN HISTORIC DISTRICT: CUSTOMS HOUSE (24-75-00133-00). *Chestertown, Kent Co.* Private (individual) ownership. Mid-eighteenth century five-bay Flemish bond brick building, an important early center of commerce and industry in

Chestertown. Removal of unoriginal elements; installation of new sash; restoration of interior woodwork and floors. \$11,625.

HAMMOND-HARWOOD HOUSE (COLONIAL ANNAPOLIS HISTORIC DISTRICT) (24-75-00160-00). *Annapolis, Anne Arundel Co.* Private ownership (Hammond-Harwood House Association). One of the premier Georgian mansions in the United States, significant also in historic and socio-economic contexts. Restoration of exterior windows and woodwork. \$6,000. ■●

UNIONTOWN ACADEMY (24-75-00242-00). *Uniontown, Carroll County.* Private ownership (Historic Uniontown, Inc.). One-story

brick and stone building in modified Greek Revival style constructed in 1851. Stabilization of foundation; interior painting; exterior repairs. \$3,000.

GODLINGTON MANOR (24-75-00245-00). *Chestertown, Kent Co.* Private (individual) ownership. One of the earliest structures extant in the Chestertown vicinity of Kent County, containing important paneling and woodwork and elaborate interior stencilling. Stabilization of timber structural members and replacement of wood shingle roof. \$7,500.



Greek Revival clapboard structure; to be partially acquired by the Edward Bellamy Memorial Association from a private individual. \$10,720.50. ■

OLD SCHWAMB MILL (25-72-00012-00). *Arlington, Middlesex Co.* Private ownership (Schwamb Mill Preservation Trust). Rare example of a craft industry complex that continues to produce picture frames in the original manner. Replacement of heating system, insulation, and removal of trees endangering the facility. \$10,350.16.

LOAMMI BALDWIN MANSION (25-72-00015-00). *Woburn, Middlesex Co.* Municipal ownership. A fine example of Federal architecture that was the home of the builder of the Middlesex Canal and his son, a noted American civil engineer. Acquisition of a new site to permit relocation. \$8,100.

PELHAM TOWN HALL HISTORIC DISTRICT: PELHAM TOWN HALL (25-72-00019-00). *Pelham, Hampshire Co.* Municipal ownership. Oldest town hall in continuous use in the State; served as both a house of worship and meeting house until 1839 law separated church and state functions. Exterior painting. \$1,000.

FAIRBANKS HOUSE (25-72-00022-00). *Dedham, Norfolk Co.* Private ownership (Fairbanks Family of America). One of America's oldest frame dwellings, built in 1636-8 by Jonathan Fayerbanke and maintained by eight generations of the family. Now a museum. Architectural research to determine restoration requirements. \$2,500. ■

QUINCY HOMESTEAD (25-72-00023-00). *Quincy, Norfolk Co.* State ownership. One of the few houses in the State in which the ele-

ments of a 17th century structure incorporated in a later building are clearly visible; the historic home of a prominent American family. Exterior painting; repair of roof and corner-sag. \$10,000.

AFRICAN MEETINGHOUSE (25-72-00027-00). *Boston, Suffolk Co.* Oldest New England building specifically associated with Black Americans and a focal point for the origins of the abolition movement. Acquisition by The Museum of Afro-American History. \$13,122.

AFRICAN MEETINGHOUSE (25-72-00028-00). See above (72-00027-00). Completion of acquisition. \$6,878.

OLD NORTH CHURCH, CHRIST CHURCH (25-73-00041-00). *Boston, Suffolk Co.* Private ownership (Christ Church in the City of Boston, Inc.). Boston's oldest surviving church (1723), built from Christopher Wren's prototypes. Housed protest meetings during Revolution and signalled Paul Revere's ride. Restoration of church bell support. \$2,500. ■

CITIZENS HALL (25-73-00049-00). *Stockbridge, Berkshire Co.* Private ownership. (Berkshire County Historical Society). A

schoolbuilding constructed in 1870 to be used as a school and community center. Restoration, including the rebuilding of stairs and installation of utilities to code requirement. \$5,000.

AFRICAN MEETINGHOUSE (25-73-00053-00). See above (72-00027-00). Immediate stabilization. \$9,911.

SPENCER-PIERCE-LITTLE HOUSE (25-73-00054-00). *Newbury, Essex Co.* Private ownership (Society for the Preservation of New England Antiquities). One of the oldest surviving farm complexes in New England, erected sometime between 1630 and 1700. Unusually large barn and stone house, both shingle-covered, are two of period's finest examples. Restoration of barn foundation. \$7,589. ■

FOWLE-REED WYMAN HOUSE (25-73-00054-10). *Arlington, Middlesex Co.* Oldest house in Arlington, built ca. 1706 on an historic tract of land belonging to Squaw Sachems, widow of former chief of Pawtucket Indians. Partial acquisition by Schwamb Mill Preservation Trust from private owner. \$7,500.

JOB LANE HOUSE (25-74-00055-00). *Bedford, Middlesex Co.* Significant as oldest dwelling in Bedford (1664). Particularly important militarily; located on the town's outskirts, it was garrisoned during King William's War (1675). Acquisition by Bedford Historical Commission from private ownership. \$19,775.

ROCKY HILL MEETINGHOUSE AND PARSONAGE (25-74-00057-00). *Amesbury, Essex Co.* Private ownership (SPNEA). An example of Country Meetinghouse, built in 1785. Work to include reroofing to original cedar shingle. \$5,007.

FULTON-COMMERCIAL STREETS DISTRICT (25-74-00064-00). *Boston, Suffolk Co.* Private (individual) ownership. Uniquely coherent block of commercial architecture and one of last remnants of Boston's waterfront of the 19th century. Restoration of masonry. \$10,000.

HOLYOKE-FRENCH HOUSE (25-74-00072-00). *Bedford, Essex Co.* Private ownership (Bedford Historical Society). 1760, late Colonial house is significant for its stylistic purity. Built by Samuel Holyoke, a Boston merchant; remained in the family until 1866. Installation of alarm systems. \$2,000.

MAJOR JOSEPH GRISWOLD HOUSE (25-74-00073-00). *Buckland, Franklin Co.* Private (individual) ownership. Federal style brick house associated with Mary Lyon, a pioneer in providing advanced education for women. Work to include washing, painting and wallpapering of the third floor ballroom. \$622.

OLD CHELMSFORD GARRISON HOUSE COMPLEX (25-74-00077-05). *Chelmsford, Middlesex Co.* Private ownership (Old Chelmsford Garrison House Association). 17th century home of Thomas Adams, of the distinguished family of Braintree and Quincy, and the last remaining garrison of Chelmsford. Preservation survey. \$2,225. ■

FAIRBANKS HOUSE (25-74-00078-00). *Dedham, Norfolk Co.* See above (72-00022-00). Repair of foundation, exterior wooden walls and drainage system. \$11,800.

OLD DEERFIELD VILLAGE HISTORIC DISTRICT: DWIGHT-BARNARD TOBACCO BARN (25-74-00080-00). *Deerfield, Franklin Co.* Private ownership (Historic Deerfield, Inc.). One of few remaining examples of a Connecticut River Valley tobacco barn typical of the period, circa 1898. Exterior restoration; foundation and roof stabilization. \$4,300.

NORTH EASTON HISTORIC DISTRICT: OAKES MEMORIAL HALL (25-74-00081-00). *North Easton, Bristol Co.* Municipal ownership. Built in 1879, this is one of H. H. Richardson's outstanding designs; landscape designed by F. L. Olmstead. Restoration of original roof tile. \$9,000.

NORTH EASTON RAILROAD STATION (25-74-00082-00). *Easton, Bristol Co.* Private ownership (Easton Historical Society). The best example of small stations designed by H. H. Richardson, 1881, in his distinctive Richardson Romanesque style. Restoration, including sanding and painting of exterior. \$1,485.

HANCOCK TOWN HALL (25-74-00085-00). *Hancock, Berkshire Co.* Municipal ownership. Adaptation of Greek Revival style to meet the needs of a small New England Community. Built in 1852, it continues to serve as a town hall. Relocation of structure to insure its preservation. \$7,000.

OLD SHIP MEETINGHOUSE (25-74-00086-00). *Hingham, Plymouth Co.* Private ownership (First Parish of Hingham). 17th century vernacular wooden structure is significant as the earliest surviving New England church. Replacement of exterior doors and repair of ceiling plate beams. \$1,750. ■

JOHN WHIPPLE HOUSE (25-74-00087-00). *Ipswich, Essex Co.* Private ownership (Ipswich

Historical Society). One of the earliest surviving New England homes. Built in 1640 and continually adapted throughout the century. Installation of sewer systems. \$1,575. ■

JEREMIAH LEE HOUSE (25-74-00089-00). *Marblehead, Essex Co.* Private ownership (Marblehead Historical Society). An example of Colonial architecture, built in 1768. Work to include stabilization of exterior walls, exterior painting, shoring of kitchen ell. and replacement of attic floor. \$5,600. ■

GRACE EPISCOPAL CHURCH (25-74-00090-00). *Medford, Middlesex Co.* Private ownership (Grace Episcopal Church). This is H. H. Richardson's oldest surviving church in the United States, designed in 1867 and constructed in 1868-72. Restoration of pipe organ. \$2,000.

JETHRO COFFIN HOUSE (NANTUCKET HISTORIC DISTRICT) (25-74-00091-00). *Nantucket, Nantucket Co.* Private ownership (Nantucket Historical Association). An example of 17th century colonial architecture; mill built in 1746. Restoration of roofs. \$3,000. ●

SPENCER-PIERCE-LITTLE HOUSE (25-74-00094-00). See above (73-00054-00). Structural stabilization. \$6,000. ■

PEABODY TOWN HALL (25-74-00096-00). *Peabody, Essex Co.* Municipal ownership. 1883 Municipal building of French design, including gas chandeliers. Preparation of preservation planning study. \$2,000.

PELHAM TOWN HALL HISTORICAL DISTRICT: HISTORICAL SOCIETY MUSEUM (25-74-00098-00). *Pelham, Hampshire Co.* Municipal ownership. A small white clapboard 1839 Greek Revival building, originally a church. Work on supporting columns in basement, floor, and exterior painting. \$2,000.

PELHAM TOWN HALL HISTORIC DISTRICT: PELHAM TOWN HALL (25-74-00099-00). See above (72-00019-00). Updating of plumbing. \$2,150.

FIRST UNIVERSALIST CHURCH (25-74-00100-00). *Provincetown, Barnstable Co.* Private (church) ownership. Greek Revival church significant for its interior trompe d'oeil painting. Project work, including stabilization of the church and bell tower. \$4,500.

BOARDMAN HOUSE (25-74-00104-00). *Saugus, Essex Co.* Private ownership (SPNEA). An outstanding survivor of 17th century New England. Restoration, including removal of existing non-original wood shingles and reroofing of rear slope of house. \$1,975. ■

CITIZENS HALL (25-74-00105-00). See above (73-00049-00). Continuing work, including electric service, painting, interior and exterior repair. \$5,700.

THE VALE (THEODORE LYMAN ESTATE) (25-74-00106-00). *Waltham, Essex Co.* Private ownership (SPNEA). Mansion designed by architect Samuel McIntire. erected in 1793-98. One of the few landscaped estates to survive largely intact from the 18th century. Exterior painting. \$1,287. ■

LOAMMI BALDWIN MANSION (25-74-00107-00). *Woburn, Middlesex Co.* See above (72-00015-00). Exterior restoration. \$3,000.

MECHANICS HALL (25-74-00110-00). *Worcester, Worcester Co.* Private ownership (Worcester County Mechanics Association). Example of 19th century Italian Renaissance Revival architecture, noted for its acoustics. Feasibility study to be conducted. \$8,700.

FANEUIL HALL (25-74-00115-00). *Boston, Suffolk Co.* Municipal ownership. Original, 18th century, public market place was the site of colonial protest against Britain and a center of the 19th century abolitionist movement. Exterior restoration. \$67,000. ■

OLD SOUTH MEETINGHOUSE (25-74-00120-00). *Boston, Suffolk Co.* Private ownership (Old South Meeting House Association). Erected by Joshua Blanchard, who later built the Hancock House and original Faneuil Hall; pre-Revolutionary structure, site of

many protest meetings against British Parliament. Repair and updating of mechanical systems. \$20,000. ■

OLD STATEHOUSE (25-74-00121-00). *Boston, Suffolk Co.* Municipal ownership. Georgian building served as statehouse from 1776-78. Meeting place of colonial courts as well as for civic and military affairs. Roofing; updating of electrical system; and installation of a smoke detection system. \$33,000. ■

CAMBRIDGE COMMON HISTORIC DISTRICT: HARVARD BURIAL SQUARE (25-74-00124-00). *Cambridge, Middlesex Co.* Municipal ownership. 1635 yard contains 80 headstones, including graves of Revolutionary War heroes, Harvard presidents, and the 1734 milestone, "8 miles to Boston." Cleaning and resetting of headstones. \$10,000.

CHRIST CHURCH (25-74-00125-00). *Cambridge, Middlesex Co.* Private (church) ownership. 1759 structure designed by Peter Harrison. Used as a barracks during Revolutionary War; its organ pipes were melted into bullets. A British officer is buried in the basement. Exterior restoration. \$18,600.

CAMBRIDGE COMMON HISTORIC DISTRICT: FIRST UNITARIAN CHURCH (25-74-00147-00). *Cambridge, Middlesex Co.* Private ownership (First Parish in Cambridge). Built for the Unitarian branch of the First Church after the congregation split in 1829. Interior and exterior restoration. \$22,300.

MEMORIAL HALL, HARVARD UNIVERSITY (25-74-00148-00). *Cambridge, Middlesex Co.* Private ownership (President and Fellows of Harvard College). One of the most

dramatic examples of 1870's Victorian Gothic, remaining largely unaltered. Designed by William Ware and Henry Van Brunt. Preservation/restoration study. \$10,000. ■

FOWLE-REED WYMAN HOUSE (25-74-00148-07). See above (73-00054-10). Partial acquisition by the Scwamb Mill Preservation Trust from private owner. \$16,400.

FORT INDEPENDENCE (25-75-00175-00). *South Boston, Suffolk Co.* State ownership. Castle Island, since 1634, has been the site of defensive fortifications for Boston Harbor. This 1835-51 brick and granite pentagon is a typical seacoast fortification of pre-Civil War period. Interior and exterior restoration. \$51,200.

WILLIAM LLOYD GARRISON HOUSE (25-75-00179-00). *Roxbury, Suffolk Co.* Private ownership (Society of St. Margaret). Two-story, clapboard structure, home (1864-79) of the outspoken abolitionist and editor of the *Liberator* from 1831-1866. Preservation and landscaping of front gardens. \$4,868. ■

TOWN HILL DISTRICT: AUSTIN HOUSE (25-75-00206-00). *Charlestown, Suffolk Co.* Private ownership (Charlestown Development Corp.). One of two remaining freestanding structures of splitstone in Charlestown. To be returned to 19th century appearance; 20th century additions will be removed; and stone work repaired. \$15,000.

EDWARD BELLAMY HOUSE (25-75-00229-00). See above (71-00006-08). Additional funds for partial acquisition. \$9,280. ■

LOUISA MAY ALCOTT HOUSE (ORCHARD HOUSE) (25-75-00232-00). *Concord, Middlesex Co.* Private ownership (Louisa May Alcott Memorial Association). Housed the Concord School of Philosophy; used as lecture hall by A. Bronson Alcott and R. W. Emerson, among others, from 1878-1888. Interior restoration. \$2,800. ■

WRIGHT'S TAVERN (25-75-00233-00). *Concord, Middlesex Co.* Private ownership (Trustees of the First Parish Church of Concord). 1747 structure, significant because both Minutemen and British Redcoats met within its walls within a few hours of each other on April 19, 1775. Testing of insulation and rewiring. \$3,000.

THE HADLEY FALLS COMPANY HOUSING DISTRICT: 2 - 20 CENTER STREET (25-75-00244-00). *Holyoke, Hampden Co.* Multiple private ownership. Begun in 1848 by Hadley Falls Company; the earliest of few examples of housing built by a manufacturer for employees and the best tenement architecture of two decades. New roof and chimney restoration. \$6,800.

FIRST CHURCH OF CHRIST (25-75-00245-00). *Lancaster, Worcester Co.* Private (church) ownership. Probably the finest of Charles Bulfinch's existing churches, in Adamesque-Federal style, designed and constructed in 1816. Painting of vestibule, balustrades and floors. \$1,000. ■

HANCOCK-CLARKE HOUSE (25-75-00248-00). *Lexington, Middlesex Co.* Private ownership (Lexington Historical Society). 1698 structure was the boyhood home of John Hancock from 1744-50. To be restored to 18th century appearance. Funds for structural investigation of building. \$750. ■

DANIEL BROOKS HOUSE (25-75-00249-00). *Concord, Middlesex Co.* Private ownership. One of the finer examples of early American small houses, built in 1695; the ancestral home of the Brooks family for 230 years. Restoration of front door; painting of house; repair of chimney. \$2,012. ■●

THE GRANGE (25-75-00250-00). *Lincoln, Middlesex Co.* Private ownership (Society for the Preservation of New England Antiquities). The history of this 16 acre estate spans 250 years. Of particular interest are Federal period

changes (1797-98) attributed to Charles Bulfinch. Shutters, balustrade, and sections of the roof will be repaired. \$9,604.

FIRST PARISH UNITARIAN CHURCH (25-75-00253-00). *Medfield, Norfolk Co.* Private (church) ownership. Constructed in 1789 from designs by Captain Joseph Bacon. The building is framed in unusually heavy oak timbers. Repair of roof. \$6,400.

NANTUCKET HISTORIC DISTRICT: FRIENDS MEETINGHOUSE (25-75-00257-00). *Nantucket, Nantucket Co.* Private ownership (Nantucket Historical Assoc.). 1838 meeting house reflects period when Quakers dominated political, social and financial life. Exterior repairs. \$685.

PARSON CAPEN HOUSE (25-75-00303-00). *Topsfield, Essex Co.* Private ownership (Topsfield Historical Society). Built in 1683 by Rev. Joseph Capen; eloquent reflection of English heritage of builders. Exterior restoration and interior carpentry repairs. \$6,100.

GOLDEN BALL TAVERN (25-75-00306-00). *Weston, Middlesex Co.* Private ownership (Golden Ball Tavern Trust). 1768 structure is significant as an example of local Georgian colonial architecture. British spies housed

here during Revolution. Roofing repairs and installation of a smoke detection system. \$5,470.

MIDDLESEX CANAL (25-75-00308-00). *Lowell, Middlesex Co.* Oldest canal of its size in the United States. Completed in 1803, its use peaked between 1820-30, facilitating exchange of goods between Boston and otherwise inaccessible points north. Acquisition by Woburn Historical Committee from private owner. \$9,600.

HERMAN MELVILLE HOUSE (ARROWHEAD) (25-75-00312-05). *Pittsfield, Berkshire Co.* Structure built in 1794; Melville's home from 1850-1863. *Moby Dick* was written here in 1851. To be acquired by the Berkshire County Historical Society from private owner. \$7,900.

NANTUCKET HISTORIC DISTRICT: WILLIAM HADWEN HOUSE (25-75-00315-00). *Nantucket, Nantucket Co.* Private ownership (Nantucket Historical Association). Neo-classical mansion was built in 1845 by a wealthy whale oil merchant and candle maker. Interior stabilization. \$925.

NANTUCKET HISTORIC DISTRICT: NATHANIEL MACY HOUSE (25-75-00316-00). *Nantucket, Nantucket Co.* Private ownership (Nantucket Historic Association). 1720 structure, built in Sherburne section of Island; moved in 1740 to its present location. Excellent example of 17th century building traditions. Exterior restoration. \$2,640.

Partial interior restoration, including carpentry, plastering, and painting. \$10,000.

WISNER HOUSE (PINE GROVE) (26-71-00006-00). *Pontiac, Oakland Co.* Private ownership (County Pioneer Society). A Greek Revival house of the 1840's, home of Michigan's thirteenth governor. Interior and exterior restoration. \$4,000.

MANN HOUSE (26-71-00007-00). *Concord, Jackson Co.* State ownership. A late 19th century Victorian house. Interior and exterior restoration. \$3,500.

MACKINAC POINT LIGHTHOUSE (26-71-00011-00). *Mackinaw City, Cheboygan Co.* State ownership. Late 19th century lighthouse. Restoration of brickwork. (Grant supplemented by Upper Great Lakes Regional Commission funding in the amount of \$25,000.) \$5,000.

FORT WILKINS (26-71-00012-00). *Copper Harbor, Keweenaw Co.* State ownership. A fort established in the 1840's to protect mining activities of the U. S. Mineral Land Agency. Restoration of various structures. \$3,805.

C & O RAILROAD STATION (CHICAGO & WEST MICHIGAN RAILWAY STATION, PERE MARQUETTE RAILWAY STATION) (26-71-00020-00). *Petoskey, Emmet Co.* Municipal ownership. Fine example of 19th century railroad station architecture. Structural repairs; carpentry, masonry, and other work. \$7,403.90.

O'NEILL SITE (26-71-00025-00). *Norwood Township, Charlevoix Co.* Private (individual) ownership. A multi-component prehistoric occupation site spanning several centuries. Excavation and analysis of materials. \$4,750.

HONOLULU HOUSE (ABNER PRATT HOUSE) (26-71-00026-00). *Marshall, Calhoun Co.* Private ownership (Marshall Historical Society). A remarkable house dating from 1860, modelled on Hawaiian prototypes. Exterior painting and carpentry. \$1,000.

JOHN JOHNSTON HOUSE (26-71-00027-00). *Sault Ste. Marie, Chippewa Co.* Private ownership (County Historical Society). One of the oldest structures on the Upper Great Lakes. Restoration as part of the waterfront development program. (Grant supplemented by Upper Great Lakes Regional Commission funding in the amount of \$115,000.) \$5,000.

WAGNER'S BLOCK: VAN OSDEL BUILDING (26-72-00047-00). *Marshall, Calhoun Co.* One of the few remaining Van Osdel-designed buildings. Acquisition of an exterior easement by the Marshall Historical Society from private owner to enable exterior preservation. \$6,000.

CHARLES H. HACKLEY HOUSE (26-72-00050-00). *Muskegon, Muskegon Co.* Private ownership (Hackley Foundation, Inc.). An unusual Queen Anne style frame house. Ex-

terior restoration as a focal point in a downtown renewal project. \$6,000.

CALUMET THEATRE (26-72-00057-00). *Calumet, Houghton Co.* Municipal ownership. An opera house built in the grand style before the turn of the century. (Grant supplemented by Upper Great Lakes Regional Commission funding in the amount of \$30,000.) \$9,000.

FAYETTE: SUPERINTENDENTS QUARTERS AND OPERA HOUSE (26-72-00059-00). *Fayette, Delta Co.* State ownership. A 19th century iron smelting town. Restoration of hotel. \$6,000.

FORT WAYNE (26-72-00065-00). *Detroit, Wayne Co.* County ownership. A 19th century fort built to provide protection against a British attack from Canada. Purchase of restoration materials. \$7,005.

FORT WAYNE (26-72-00066-00). See above (72-00065-00). Emergency purchase of restoration materials. \$5,000.

VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN HISTORIC DISTRICT: HUNTER'S WHIP (26-73-00069-00). *Franklin, Oakland Co.* Multiple municipal and private ownership. An area containing a variety of valuable mid and late 19th century buildings. Acquisition by the city of Hunter's Whip property for future restoration as a public building. \$4,000.

ORCHESTRA HALL (26-73-00071-00). *Detroit, Wayne Co.* Municipal ownership. A brick and limestone structure built in 1919 to house the Detroit Symphony Orchestra; has served also as a church and movie house. First phase of restoration, specifically a restoration study. \$5,000.

FORT MICHILIMACKINAC (26-74-00092-00). *Mackinaw City, Emmet Co.* State ownership. An important military and fur trading post in the Upper Great Lakes region from 1715 to 1780. Archeological excavation of the 18th century powder magazine. \$5,000. ■

MACKINAC ISLAND: FORT MACKINAC OFFICERS' STONE QUARTERS (26-74-00094-00). *Mackinac Island, Mackinac Co.* State ownership. Part of an important military fort built in 1780 to protect a crucial military and economic region. Restoration of stonework, wood deck, and shutters, and interior and exterior painting. \$10,000. ■

CAPITOL HILL SCHOOL (26-74-00099-00). *Marshall, Calhoun Co.* State ownership. A red brick schoolhouse built in 1860 and 1861 in the Gothic Revival style. Painting of exterior trim; tuckpointing; and foundation repairs. \$2,500.

SAINT CECILIA SOCIETY BUILDING (26-74-00112-00). *Grand Rapids, Kent Co.* Private ownership (St. Cecilia Music Society). A Second Renaissance Revival Music Hall built in 1894. Architectural plans will be prepared. \$3,000.

FORT WAYNE: BUILDING 205—GUARD HOUSE (26-74-00121-00). *Detroit, Wayne Co.* Municipal ownership. Constructed in 1809. Repairs and painting of exterior woodwork; installation of exterior doors; brick repairs; restoration of porch and chimney. \$7,500.

KALAMAZOO STATE HOSPITAL WATER TOWER (26-74-00121-07). *Kalamazoo, Kalamazoo Co.* Private ownership (Ladies



MARINE MILL SITE (27-72-00021-00). *Marine-on-St. Croix, Washington Co.* Site containing ruins of Minnesota's first commercial sawmill, founded in 1839. Acquisition by the Minnesota Historical Society. \$10,405.97.



FLATBUSH TOWN HALL (36-73-00062-00). *Brooklyn, Kings Co.* Municipal ownership. A polychrome, eclectic building constructed in the Ruskinian Gothic Revival style in 1875. Preparation of historic structures report. \$2,000.

W. & L.E. GURLEY CO. (36-73-00068-00). *Troy, Rensselaer Co.* Private ownership (W. & L.E. Gurley Company). An unusual example of an industrial building, dating from 1862, that is compatible with neighboring residential structures and the home of the Gurley Company, one of the oldest manufacturers of surveyor's instruments in the world. Exterior rehabilitation. \$15,000.

BINGHAMTON CITY HALL (36-73-00074-00). *Binghamton, Broome Co.* Municipal ownership. A building constructed shortly before the turn of the century that is an integral part of the city's urban fabric. Preparation of an historic structures report and restoration of mechanical systems. \$20,000.

OTSEGO COUNTY COURTHOUSE (36-73-00075-00). *Cooperstown, Otsego Co.* County ownership. A building constructed in 1880 that has since sheltered the county legal system. Preparation of an historic structures report. \$3,000.

UNION HOTEL (36-73-00076-00). *Sacket Harbor, Jefferson Co.* State ownership. One of upstate New York's finest examples of a functional and monumental public building of the decades following the Revolutionary War. Repair of roof, and replacement of utility systems. \$20,000.

OLD MERCHANT'S HOUSE (SEABURY-TREDWELL HOUSE) (36-73-00083-00). See above (71-00019-02). Continuing restoration, including exterior, shutters, and iron work. ■

EARLVILLE OPERA HOUSE (DOUGLASS OPERA HOUSE) (36-73-00083-05) *Earlville, Chenango Co.* Private ownership (Earlville Opera House, Inc.). A building of the late 1880's representative of the State's rural opera house culture. Preparation of historic structures report to guide future restoration as a theater. \$1,000.

TEN BROECK MANSION (36-73-00083-06). *Albany, Albany Co.* Private ownership (Ten Broeck Historical Society). One of the oldest homes along the upper Hudson River. Preparation of historic structures report. \$2,500.

OLD LUTHERAN PARSONAGE (36-73-00083-07). *Schoharie, Schoharie Co.* County ownership. A rare example of half timbered construction dating from 1743 that is believed to be the only building in the area to have survived the raids of the French and Indian Wars. Restoration of chimneys, windows, exterior wood sheathing, floors, and plaster. \$10,000.

TROY PUBLIC LIBRARY (HART MEMORIAL LIBRARY) (36-73-00083-08). *Troy, Rensselaer Co.* Private ownership (Troy Public Library). An Italian Renaissance structure of white Vermont marble dating from 1899 that is one of the city's handsomest buildings. Restoration of roof, balustrade, and skylights. \$46,250.

ERWIN LIBRARY AND PRATT HOUSE (36-73-00083-09). *Boonville, Oneida Co.* Private ownership (Erwin Library and Institute). Adjacent buildings that are excellent examples of late 19th century domestic architecture. Preparation of historic structures report. \$1,000.

KNICKERBOCKER MANSION (36-73-00083-10). *Schaghticoke, Rensselaer Co.* Private ownership (Knickerbocker Historical Society). A Federal style building dating from 1770 with Carpenter Gothic and Italianate trim that was occupied by the prominent Knickerbocker family for nearly 180 years. Restoration of roof gutters, brickwork, and masonry. \$1,000.

NEW YORK BOTANICAL GARDENS (36-74-00090-00) *The Bronx, Bronx Co.* Municipal ownership (New York City). A 250-acre romantic garden complex of the late 19th century. Renovation of steam-heating system. \$75,000. ■

CLINTON HOUSE (36-74-00096-00). *Ithaca, Tompkins Co.* A three-story masonry hotel dating from 1830. Interior and exterior restoration and utility improvements. \$35,000.

EARLVILLE OPERA HOUSE (DOUGLAS OPERA HOUSE) (36-74-00097-00). See above (73-00083-05). Restoration of roof, exterior brick, and window frames; preparation of measured drawings. \$2,500.

BENJAMIN C. MOORE MILL (LOCKPORT CITY HALL, HOLLY WATER WORKS) (36-74-00110-00). *Lockport, Niagara Co.* Municipal ownership. A flour mill of the 1870's that is now the Lockport City Hall. Preparation of historic structures report prior to restoration. \$1,500.

ABIGAIL ADAMS SMITH HOUSE (STABLE) (36-74-00112-00). *New York, New York Co.* Private ownership (Colonial Dames of America). A handsome Federal style stone building, erected in 1799, and originally serving as a stable and carriage house. Kitchen chimney will be made functional for use in museum demonstrations. \$1,900.

OSWEGO CITY HALL (36-74-00114-00). *Oswego, Oswego Co.* Municipal ownership. An elegant example of the Second Empire style as applied in public architecture of the 1870's. Preparation of plans, specifications, and an historic structures report for future restoration. \$25,000.

SAG HARBOR VILLAGE DISTRICT: MUNICIPAL BUILDING/MONTAUK HOSE COMPANY (36-74-00117-00). *Sag Harbor, Suffolk Co.* Municipal ownership. Two adjoining buildings that form a key visual element in the historic area. Preparation of an historic structures report to guide future restoration. \$1,218.

TERRA COTTA (36-74-00128-00). *Alfred, Allegany Co.* Private ownership (Alfred Historical Society). ERWIN LIBRARY AND PRATT HOUSE (36-74-00156-00). See above (73-00083-09). Continuing restoration of Pratt House to prevent further exterior deterioration. \$5,000.

ALLEN STEINHEIM MUSEUM (36-74-00164-00). *Alfred, Allegany Co.* Private ownership (Alfred University). A castle-like building dating from 1876 erected from a multitude of natural materials. Preparation of historic structures report to guide future restoration. \$2,000.

JONATHAN CHILD HOUSE AND BREWSTER-BURKE HOUSE HISTORIC DISTRICT: BREWSTER-BURKE HOUSE (36-74-00170-00). See above (71-00006-00). Restoration of interior to period style. \$20,000.

HERKIMER COUNTY COURTHOUSE (36-74-00191-00). *Herkimer, Herkimer Co.* County ownership. A brick structure dating from the 1870's that has an octagonal tower and that is a focal point at a major city intersection. Preparation of historic structures report to guide restoration. \$2,000.

HERKIMER COUNTY JAIL (36-74-00192-00). *Herkimer, Herkimer Co.* County ownership. An imposing Federal style build-

RUTGER-STEUBEN PARK HISTORIC DISTRICT: KERNAN HOUSE (36-74-00193-00). *Utica, Oneida Co.* A Greek Revival building dating from c. 1850 that is an integral feature of the historic district. Acquisition by the Junior League of Utica for use as a community center. \$8,000.

RUTGER-STEUBEN PARK HISTORIC DISTRICT: KERNAN HOUSE (36-74-00194-00). See above (74-00193-00). Preparation of historic structures report to guide restoration.

UNTERMYER PARK (36-74-00195-00). *Yonkers, Westchester Co.* Municipal ownership. A 19th century Beaux-Arts garden in Grecian style. Restoration of gardens and structures in the park. \$35,000.

HALL OF LANGUAGES, SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY (36-74-00196-00). *Syracuse, Onondaga Co.* Private ownership (Syracuse University). The first building constructed on the planned campus in 1873, and the only known university building designed by the pioneering architect Horatio Nelson White. Preparation of historic structures report to guide restoration. \$5,000.

HAMILTON WHITE HOUSE (36-74-00197-00). *Syracuse, Onondaga Co.* Private ownership (Park Central Presbyterian Church). A handsome Greek Revival structure dating from 1845 and an important visual downtown landmark. Masonry restoration and various exterior improvements. \$10,000.

GENESEE COUNTY COURTHOUSE (26-74-00198-00). *Batavia, Genesee Co.* County ownership. A limestone structure in Greek Revival style dating from 1841 and an important city landmark. General interior and exterior restoration and improvements. \$40,000.

CITY HALL (36-74-00201-00). *Plattsburgh, Clinton Co.* Municipal ownership. An excellent example of early 20th century interpreta-

tion of the classical tradition. Preparation of structures report to guide restoration for continuing use as the center of city government. \$2,000.

CALEB HYATT HOUSE (CUDNER-HYATT HOUSE) (36-74-00202-00). *Scarsdale, Westchester Co.* Private Ownership. This clapboard dwelling significant to early settlement in the area is to be acquired from a private owner by the Scarsdale Historical Society. \$10,000.

SCHUYLER FLATTS (36-74-00207-00). *Colonie, Albany Co.* Municipal ownership. This archeological site occupied from prehistoric to Dutch settlement times, is to be acquired by the town of Colonie from a private owner. \$25,000.

BOX HILL ESTATE (36-74-00210-00). *Saint James, Suffolk Co.* Private ownership. This 19th century Georgian Revival house was the summer residence of architect Stanford White. Project work includes reshingling of the water tower. \$5,500.

VAN CORTLANDT MANOR (36-75-00250-00). *Croton-on-Hudson, Westchester Co.* This last remaining undeveloped parcel of an important estate is to be acquired by Sleepy Hollow Restoration, Inc. \$25,000. ■

BRICK CHURCH CORNERS (36-75-00324-00). *Ontario, Wayne Co.* The town of Ontario Historical Society will acquire a parcel of open land from private owners to protect this unspoiled rural crossroads. \$9,000.

CHURCH OF THE NAZARENE (36-75-00362-00). *Essex vic., Essex Co.* Private ownership. This simple rural chapel is an example of Richard Upjohn's standard ecclesiastical designs. Project work includes repair of stained-glass windows. \$4,500.

GRACE CHURCH AND DEPENDENCIES (36-75-00392-00). *New York City.* Private ownership. The facades of four Gothic Revival townhouses adjacent to the Renwick-designed Grace Church will be restored. \$50,000.



Restoration of railings and porch floors; insulation for first floor. \$2,500.

REED GOLD MINE (37-71-00008-00). *Concord vic., Cabarrus Co.* Unspoiled site of the discovery of nuggets that triggered the nation's first gold rush. Acquisition of c. 250 acres by the State. \$29,599.72. ■

BURWELL SCHOOL (37-71-00010-00). *Hillsborough, Orange Co.* Private ownership (Historic Hillsborough Commission). A Presbyterian female boarding academy from 1837 to 1857. Restoration of wood shingle roof and general interior repairs. \$3,500.

CUPOLA HOUSE (37-71-00012-00). *Edenton, Chowan Co.* Private ownership (Cupola House Association). A two-story frame house combining 17th century architectural forms with 18th century Georgian motifs. Restoration of shingle roof and entrance porch. \$1,000. ■

FORT DEFIANCE (37-71-00013-00). *Lenoir vic., Caldwell Co.* Private ownership (Fort Defiance, Inc.). Home of William Lenoir, Revolutionary officer, politician, and president of the University of North Carolina's first board of trustees. Plans and specifications; replacement of sash and doors; installation of wood shingle roof. \$5,500.

HEZEKIAH ALEXANDER HOUSE (37-71-00015-00). *Charlotte, Mecklenburg Co.* Private ownership (Alexander House Foundation, Inc.). A 1774 house built of native piedmont stone and oystershell mortar. Masonry repointing; repairs to windows, doors, and roof. \$4,000.

HOPE PLANTATION (37-71-00016-00). *Windsor vic., Bertie Co.* Private ownership (Historic Hope Foundation). Home of David Stone, early 19th century governor and U. S. Senator. Restoration of fireplaces, hardware and floors; installation of electrical and climate control systems. \$5,000.

JOEL LANE HOUSE (37-71-00017-00). *Raleigh, Wake Co.* Private ownership (North Carolina Society of the Colonial Dames of America). A small frame dwelling, home of a landowner active in politics in the late 18th century. Reconstruction of chimneys; repair of foundations, weatherboards, porch, and dormers. \$6,000.

BUCK SPRING PLANTATION (NATHANIEL MACON HOUSE) (37-71-00018-00). *Vaughan vic., Warren Co.* County ownership. Plantation dwelling built in 1781 by Nathaniel Macon, U. S. Representative and Senator. Structural repair and restoration of original log corn crib. \$4,000.

RICHMOND HILL LAW SCHOOL (37-71-00019-00). *Richmond Hill vic., Yadkin Co.* Private ownership (County Historical Society). Home and law school of Richmond M. Pearson, Chief Justice of the North Carolina Supreme Court from 1850 to 1878. Preparation of restoration plans; stabilization of walls and roof structure; weatherproofing. \$5,500.

WRIGHT TAVERN (37-71-00021-00). *Wentworth, Rockingham Co.* Private ownership (County Historical Society). Preparation of interior and exterior restoration, electrical, and mechanical designs and specifications; repair of chimneys; installation of insulation and mechanical/electrical systems. \$7,500.

HARPER HOUSE (BENTONVILLE BATTLEGROUND STATE HISTORIC SITE) (37-72-00043-00). *Newton Grove vic., Johnson Co.* State ownership. Site of the last full-scale Civil War action in which the Confed-

erate command chose the ground and initially attacked. Restoration of a portion of the Harper House, an early 19th century building that served as a Union and Confederate hospital at different times during and after the battle. \$2,500.

HALIFAX HISTORIC DISTRICT: CLERK'S OFFICE (37-72-00050-00). *Halifax, Halifax Co.* State ownership. One of four historic structures at the Halifax State Historic Site. Exterior restoration. \$3,500.

FORT DOBBS (37-73-00056-00). *Statesville vic., Iredell Co.* State ownership. A 1750 fort, the only site in the State associated with the French and Indian War. Construction and sodding of moat and parapet; raising of ground level. \$7,500.

JAMES IREDELL HOUSE (37-73-00059-00). See above (72-00027-00). Continuing restoration, including removal of non-original wing, rear porch and interior restoration, mechanical work, and carriage house rehabilitation. \$16,000.

FORT DEFIANCE (37-73-00060-00). See above (71-00013-00). Continuing restoration, principally on interior. \$20,000.

SOMERSET PLACE STATE HISTORIC SITE (37-73-00063-00). *Creswell vic., Washington Co.* State ownership. A mid-18th century plantation complex. Restoration of kitchen, store house, and ice house. \$9,000.

PALMER-MARSH HOUSE (37-73-00064-00). *Bath, Beaufort Co.* State ownership. A 1750 building once used as a chandlery. Repointing of chimneys; interior replastering and paint-

ing; installation of mechanical and electrical systems. \$10,000. ■

HALIFAX HISTORIC DISTRICT: CONSTITUTION HOUSE (37-73-00065-00). See above (72-00029-00). Restoration of roof, stairways, floors, and hardware; painting; mechanical and electrical work. \$10,000.

HALIFAX HISTORIC DISTRICT: OWENS HOUSE (37-73-90065-01). *Halifax, Halifax Co.* One of four historic buildings at the Halifax State Historic Site. Restoration of plaster walls, ceilings, and shed dormer windows; chimney stabilization; painting. \$4,000.

HARPER HOUSE (BENTONVILLE BATTLEGROUNDS STATE HISTORIC SITE) (37-73-00066-00). See above (72-00043-00). Continuing restoration of the Harper House. \$26,000.


ST. PHILIP'S CHURCH RUINS (37-73-00067-00). *Orton vic., Brunswick Co.* State ownership. One of four colonial churches remaining in the State. Stabilization of the ruins. \$27,500.

DUKE HOMESTEAD AND TOBACCO FACTORY (37-74-00097-02). *Durham vic., Durham Co.* State ownership. This factory is significant as the final manufacturing establishment used by Washington Duke which eventually led to the American Tobacco Company, formed in 1880. Project work to include architectural fees, structural repairs and exterior restoration. \$15,281. ■

SALLY-BILLY HOUSE (37-74-00098-00). *Halifax, Halifax Co.* State ownership. Built around 1800, the house is an apparently unique member of a group of tripartite houses produced in the area in the late eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries. Reconstruction of the roof and restoration of the original exterior paint colors. \$37,500.

SALLY-BILLY HOUSE (37-75-00147-00). See above (74-00098-00). Continuing restoration. \$10,000.

ZOAR HISTORIC DISTRICT: DAIRY STORE (39-71-00008-00). *Zoar, Tuscarawas Co.* State ownership. A village, settled in 1817 by separatists from Germany, that operated on a communal basis, now a State memorial. Stabilization of dairy store building. \$15,991.01.

ZOAR HISTORIC DISTRICT: NO. 1 HOUSE (39-71-00009-00). See above (71-00008-00). Restoration of Number One House, a building dating from the 1830's, to include mechanical and electrical work, masonry and woodwork repairs. \$8,113.77.

EAST LIVERPOOL POTTERY (39-72-00012-00). *East Liverpool, Columbiana Co.* State ownership. An 1840's pottery in the heart of this once-thriving center for production of yellow ware and Rockingham. Major structural repairs to bottle kiln and walls to enable subsequent restoration as a working museum of the early Ohio pottery industry. \$14,000.

FORT LAURENS SITE (39-72-00014-00). *Bolivar vic., Tuscarawas Co.* State ownership. A fort erected in 1778 as part of Washington's "great trail" of blockhouses from Fort Pitt to the British stronghold at Detroit. Research and excavation to identify locations of fort walls; stabilization of findings. \$6,370.

TALLMADGE TOWN SQUARE HISTORIC DISTRICT: CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH (39-72-00016-00). *Tallmadge, Summit Co.* State ownership. Excellent example of the transplanting of New England architecture, and important element in the Historic District. Research; restoration of steeple, foundation and interior; removal of addition. \$20,000.

OLD COURTHOUSE (39-72-00020-00). *Dayton, Montgomery Co.* County ownership. A Greek Revival building of native limestone dating from the mid-1800's. Research, stabilization, and exterior and interior restoration. \$10,000.

JAMES A. GARFIELD HOME, LAWNFIELD (39-73-00025-00). *Mentor, Lake Co.* Private ownership (Western Reserve Historical Society). Home of the twentieth President. Roof restoration. \$10,000. ■

SEIP EARTHWORKS AND DILL MOUNDS DISTRICT *Ross Co.* State and private ownership. One of the best preserved prehistoric Indian sites in the Ohio Valley. Archeological investigation to acquire evidence about Hopewell Indian Culture. \$6,516.

JAMES A. GARFIELD HOME, LAWNFIELD (39-73-00030-00). See above (73-00025-00). Installation of fire protection system and interior restoration. \$10,000.

TALLMADGE TOWN SQUARE HISTORIC DISTRICT: CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH (39-74-00034-00). See above (74-00016-00). Repairs to exterior woodwork and windows; new shake roof, gutters, and downspouts; and exterior painting. \$25,000.

CINCINNATI CITY HALL (39-74-00039-00). *Cincinnati, Hamilton Co.* Municipal ownership. Dedicated in 1893, the best extant example of Romanesque Revival architecture in Cincinnati. Purchase of roofing materials. \$10,000.

OHIO THEATRE (39-74-00043-00). *Columbus, Franklin Co.* Private ownership (Columbus Association for the Performing Arts). This 1928 "movie palace" is one of the best remaining examples of early 20th century theaters. Repair of seats, floors, and wiring. \$12,000.

PENNSYLVANIA HOUSE (39-74-00045-00). *Springfield, Clark Co.* Private ownership (Lagonda chapter of the D.A.R.). An 1822 Federal style structure, typical of the inn and tavern buildings where travelers on the National Road were served in the first half of the nineteenth century. Interior restoration and drainage repairs. \$3,000.

OLD WEST END DISTRICT: COLLINGWOOD PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (39-74-00047-00). *Toledo, Lucas Co.* Private (church) ownership. Built in 1899-1902 in a style freely combining Gothic and Romanesque elements. The carved capitals represent the heads of local personages. Repairs to the heating system. \$1,950.

ZACHARIAH PRICE DeWITT CABIN (39-74-00057-00). *Oxford vic., Butler Co.* State ownership (Miami University). An 1805 log cabin, the home of Zachariah Price DeWitt, a prominent early settler in Oxford. Exterior restoration. \$2,000.

ZENO KENT HOUSE (39-74-00058-00). *Aurora, Portage Co.* Private (individual) ownership. Zeno Kent came to Ohio from Connecticut and built his home in 1821 in the style of a Connecticut colonial farmhouse. An elegant residence for the period and location. Replacement of roof and gutters. \$3,000.

SHAWNEE LOOKOUT ARCHEOLOGICAL DISTRICT: DUPONT SITE (39-74-00072-05). *Cleves vic., Hamilton Co.* Private ownership (Cincinnati Gas and Electric Co.). Noted for its wealth of varied prehistoric remains dating from archaic and later times. Investigation of the remaining unexcavated areas. \$6,000.

E. 2ND STREET DISTRICT: HIVLING-KINNEY HOUSE (39-74-00072-07). *Xenia, Greene Co.* Private (individual) ownership. Built in 1863 by Abraham Hivling, and served for many years as the home of the prominent poet, journalist and Ohio statesman, Coates Kinney. Restoration of the railings, columns, and front porch roof. \$1,600.

FRANKLIN PARK CONSERVATORY (39-75-00077-00). *Columbus, Franklin Co.* Municipal ownership. A glass, stone and steel greenhouse erected in 1895. Renovation of the radiation system. \$30,000.

WEST MAIN STREET DISTRICT: FIRELANDS MUSEUM (39-75-00089-00). *Norwalk, Huron Co.* Private ownership (Firelands Historical Society). A transitional Federal-Greek Revival style house built in 1835 for

the editor of the *Norwalk Reflector*. Restoration of porch woodwork; stabilization of the roof. \$865.

SHANDY HALL (39-75-00091-00). *Geneva, Ashtabula Co.* Private ownership (Western Reserve Historical Society). A very early (1815) and well-preserved wooden home, the residence of Robert Harper, a lawyer who was active in state and local politics. Stabilization of the foundation. \$10,000.

OLD DISTRICT 10 SCHOOLHOUSE (39-75-00097-00). *Middleburg Heights, Cuyahoga Co.* Municipal ownership. A 1½ story slate roofed brick building built in 1912, designed to be the area school for children in grades one through twelve. Restoration of the roof and repointing of the masonry. \$2,500.

CUVIER PRESS CLUB (39-75-00098-00). *Cincinnati, Hamilton Co.* Municipal ownership. A fine sandstone and brick townhouse built in 1861-1862 in an elaborate Italianate design. Preparation of a material and finishes study and restoration of the second story wood floors. \$2,000.


FAIRPORT MARINE MUSEUM (39-75-00098-00). *Fairport Harbor, Lake Co.* Municipal ownership. A lighthouse and keeper's dwelling constructed in 1871 as the Fairport Harbor Coast Guard Light Station Reservation. Throughout the nineteenth century Fairport was a gateway for settlers arriving from the east. Stabilization and repointing of brick walls; repair of copper dome. \$3,755.

MEDINA COUNTY COURTHOUSE (39-75-00124-00). *Medina, Medina Co.* County ownership. Built in 1841 and 1873, a three-story building with an elaborate mansard roof and clock tower. Repair of the roof, tower, cornice, masonry, sash, porch, steps, and doors. \$7,500.

FOUNDERS HALL, HEIDELBERG COLLEGE (39-75-00126-00). *Tiffin, Seneca Co.* Private ownership (Heidelberg College). Begun in 1852, two years after the founding of


Heidelberg College. One of the best extant Greek Revival style buildings in Ohio. Replacement of the roof. \$6,750.

SAMUEL SPITLER HOUSE (39-75-00130-00). *Brookville, Montgomery Co.* Private ownership (Brookville Historical Society). Built in 1894, one of the best examples of Queen Anne style architecture in Ohio. It is said to have had the first bathroom in Brookville. Restoration of the porches and exterior painting. \$3,000.

FORT TOWSON (40-72-00008-00). *Fort Towson vic., Choctaw Co.* Site of Oklahoma's second oldest military post containing a few sections of wall and the foundations of buildings. Acquisition by the State of 40 acres that include significant portions of the ruins. \$5,000.

FORT WASHITA: SOUTH BARRACKS BUILDING (40-72-00015-00). See above (71-00005-00). Continuing restoration. \$11,697. ■

WHITE HOUSE OF THE CHICKASAWS (40-72-00021-00). *Emet vic., Johnston Co.* Home of the last Governor of the Chickasaw Nation and an interesting example of Victorian "Steamboat" architecture. Preparation of plans for future restoration work. \$2,000.

FORT WASHITA (40-73-00023-00). See above (71-00005-00). Continuing restoration. \$41,750. ■

DEER CREEK SITE (40-73-00028-00). *Newkirk vic., Kay Co.* Private (individual) ownership. A well-preserved site believed to have been occupied by the Wichita or related Indian groups during the first half of the 18th century; also site of a French trading post known as Ferdinandino. Archeological survey to determine future site development requirements. \$1,000. ■

FORT TOWSON (40-73-00033-00). See above (72-00008-00). Archeological survey and stabilization. \$14,332.



FORT DALLE'S SURGEON'S QUARTERS (41-73-00014-00). *The Dalles, Wasco Co.* Private ownership (Oregon Historical Society). A c. 1860 symmetrical bracketed cottage, only remaining structure at the fort site and the State's most notable example of a pattern book design. Replacement of roof and installation of fire protection system. \$3,874.

DEADY HALL (41-73-00016-00). *Eugene, Lane Co.* State ownership. A primary example of Italianate style with a mansard roof, constructed in 1876; originally housed the entire University of Oregon. Repair of brick work; reconstruction of massive parapet. \$17,408.

OLD STONE HOUSE (41-73-00018-00). *Vale, Malheur Co.* County ownership. A building dating from 1872, constructed of locally quarried sandstone, that epitomizes stone architecture of the settlement period and served as a way station along the historic Oregon Trail. Restoration of doors; repair and moistureproofing of foundations; and repair of mortar joints. \$2,250.

THOMAS KAY WOOLEN MILL (41-74-00024-00). *Salem, Marion Co.* Private ownership (Mission Mill Museum Association). 1889 structure is typical of the textile factories that played a vital role in Salem's economy after 1850; also, the longest-lived textile manufactory in Salem. ASTORIA COLUMN (41-75-00035-00). *Astoria, Clatsop Co.* Municipal ownership. 1926 commemorative structure at the mouth of the Columbia River marks the location of the River's discovery, in 1792, by Robert Gray; the western terminus of the Lewis and Clark Expedition in 1805; and the site of Fort Astoria erected in 1811. TENDER'S DWELLING #2 (41-75-00036-00). *Cascade Locks, Hood River Co.* Municipal ownership (Port of Cascade Locks). Constructed in 1878; opened in 1896, locks facilitated traffic over the Columbia River Cas-



HANS HERR HOUSE (42-71-00013-00). *Lancaster, Lancaster Co.* Private ownership (Lancaster Mennonite Conference Historical Society). The oldest dwelling in the county (1719) and oldest Mennonite meeting place in America. Architectural research; plans; restoration; and utility improvements. \$37,041.

ALLEGHENY POST OFFICE (OLD NORTH POST OFFICE) (42-72-00023-00). *Pittsburgh, Allegheny Co.* A superb example of the Italian Renaissance Revival style of architecture. Acquisition by the Pittsburgh History and Landmarks Foundation. \$58,281.

COLONIAL GERMANTOWN HISTORIC DISTRICT: THEOBOLD ENDT HOUSE (42-72-00023-03). *Philadelphia, Philadelphia Co.* Private ownership (Germantown Historical Society). Site of the first unity conference of the German Protestant churches and sects in America. Acquisition by the Society. \$12,500.


ANDREW ELLICOTT HOUSE (42-72-00023-04). *Lancaster, Lancaster Co.* Georgian townhouse to be restored as a cultural center and memorial. Acquisition by Lancaster County Preservation Trust. \$19,168.81.

HANS HERR HOUSE (42-72-00023-05). See above (71-00013-00). Continuing restoration, primarily of grounds. \$3,260.

PAGODA (42-72-00023-14). *Reading, Berks Co.* Municipal ownership. A replica of a Japanese castle tower, built in 1908. Installation of a heating system. \$4,102.19.

WASHINGTON'S HEADQUARTERS (42-73-00034-07). *Valley Creek Road near junction of Pa. 252 & 23, Montgomery Co.* State ownership. The historic area occupied by Washington's troops during the bitter winter of 1777-1778 which saw the emergence of a strong Revolutionary Army from the defeated force that set up camp in December 1777. Improvements and landscaping for the headquarters building, bakehouse, and stable included in Washington's headquarters complex. \$91,000.

Stone and frame grist mill, built in 1874, the third mill built along Pidcock Creek and an integral part of the Thompson-Neely House complex. THE ATHENAEUM OF PHILADELPHIA (42-74-00076-00-B). *Philadelphia, Philadelphia Co.* Private ownership (Athenaeum Society). 1847, red sandstone building in the Italian Renaissance Revival style, is the oldest library in Philadelphia. Federal Style mansion, built in 1800 by a wealthy merchant, containing a large, curved central bay and rich interior. Extensive interior and exterior restoration. \$72,250.

BRYN MAWR (HARRITON) (42-75-00133-00). *Bryn Mawr, Montgomery Co.* Municipal ownership. Stone house dating from 1704. Owned by Charles Thompson,

educator and Secretary of the Continental Congress. Restoration of first and second floors; rebuilding of cellar entrance. \$15,000.

MORAVIAN SUN INN (42-75-00135-00). *Bethlehem, Northampton Co.* Built in 1758 to accommodate visitors to the Moravian community; an important social and political center. Acquisition from the Sun Inn Realty, Inc. by the Sun Inn Preservation Association. \$75,000.


CAMBRIA PUBLIC LIBRARY BUILDING (42-75-00176-00). *Johnstown, Cambria Co.* A fine example of French Gothic architecture, constructed in 1890-91 to replace the original building destroyed by the Jamestown Flood of 1889. EBENEZER MAXWELL HOUSE (42-75-00180-00). *Philadelphia, Philadelphia Co.* Private ownership (Ebenezer Maxwell House Inc.). Three story stone structure, one of Philadelphia's finest Victorian houses, built in 1859. Roof and wooden cornices to be repaired. \$15,000.





MARTIN HALL (44-71-00021-01). *Providence, Providence Co.* Private ownership (Providence College). A 19th century Italianate villa style house. Restoration of porch, balcony, bay windows, and roof. \$10,052.

CLARKE STREET MEETINGHOUSE (SECOND CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH) (44-71-00021-02). *Newport, Newport Co.* Private ownership (St. Joseph's Church of Newport). A building dating from 1735 with later Greek Revival details, still later wings, and Victorian ornament. Restoration, to include painting, stabilization, and roof; foundation; and exterior woodwork repairs. \$10,500.

JOHN W. ARNOLD HOUSE (44-72-00044-00). *Warwick, Kent Co.* Private ownership (Warwick Historical Society). Simple 18th century farm house that will serve as the Society's museum. Painting; rewiring; utility improvements; reroofing; chimney repair; and structural protective treatment. \$2,500.

FORT ADAMS STATE PARK (44-72-00047-03). *Newport, Newport Co.* State ownership. A fort used continuously from 1799 to the early 20th century. Recording of outer walls; preparation of site plan; and program to identify and safeguard artifacts. \$2,578.70.

LEVI H. GALE HOUSE (NEWPORT HISTORIC DISTRICT) (44-73-00073-00). *Newport, Newport Co.* Private ownership (Congregation Jeshuat Israel). Fine Greek Revival building dating from 1835. Exterior painting; replacement of rainspouts. \$2,500.

ARMORY OF THE KENTISH GUARDS (44-74-00101-00). See above (73-00057-00). Second phase of restoration, specifically exterior and interior painting. \$1,000.

KAY STREET-CATHERINE STREET-OLD BEACH ROAD HISTORIC DISTRICT: MOUNT ZION A.M.E. CHURCH (44-74-00104-00). *Newport, Newport Co.* Private ownership (Trustees of Mount Zion A.M.E. Church). A building erected in 1850 as the dining and dancing hall of the Bellevue Hotel and purchased in 1875 by Newport's largest Black congregation. Reroofing and interior rewiring. \$5,500.

KAY STREET-CATHERINE STREET-OLD BEACH ROAD HISTORIC DISTRICT: RALPH IZARD HOUSE (44-74-00116-00). *Newport, Newport Co.* Private (individual) ownership. One of four large estates dominating the area northeast of Bellevue Avenue in the days when Newport was America's most fashionable summer resort, built in 1850 for a prominent South Carolina family. KAY STREET-CATHERINE STREET-OLD BEACH ROAD HISTORIC DISTRICT: SAMUEL TILTON HOUSE (44-74-00126-00). *Newport, Newport Co.* Private (individual) ownership. One of the finest late 19th century summer houses in Newport and an important example of American domestic architecture of the early 1880's Reconstruction of chimneys and extensive shingle work. \$5,000.

WILLIAM KING COVELL III HOUSE (44-74-00129-00). See above (73-00076-00). Second phase of restoration, specifically completion of roofing. \$4,000.

JOY HOMESTEAD (44-74-00132-00). *Cranston, Providence Co.* Private ownership (Cranston Historical Society). A mid-18th


century gambrel-roofed dwelling. Partial interior and exterior restoration. \$10,000.

MARTIN HALL (44-74-00135-00). See above (71-00021-01). Second phase of restoration, including repairs to roof trim, masonry, and exterior wood trim. \$10,000.

STATEHOUSE (44-74-00137-00). *Providence, Providence Co.* State ownership. A building erected at the end of the 19th century, designed by McKim, Mead & White, that houses the offices of the Governor, the legislative chambers, and other major State offices. Study to identify restoration procedures. \$2,500.

TRINITY SQUARE REPERTORY THEATER (MAJESTIC THEATRE) (44-74-00139-00). *Providence, Providence Co.* Private ownership (Trinity Square Repertory Company). An excellent example of the extravagant film palaces of the early 1900's. Restoration of facade. \$20,000.

SLATERSVILLE HISTORIC DISTRICT: SLATERSVILLE CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH (44-74-00141-00). *North Smithfield, Providence Co.* Private (church) ownership. A Greek Revival building erected in 1838 and enlarged in the 1890's typifying the small but imposing rural churches of the period. Restoration of windows. \$5,000.

FORMER IMMACULATE CONCEPTION CHURCH (44-74-00143-00). *Westerly, Washington Co.* A well-preserved example of late 19th century carpenter Gothic architecture. Acquisition by the Community Chorus of Westerly. \$20,000.

FORT ADAMS STATE PARK (44-74-00144-04). See above (72-00047-03). Repair and repointing of retaining walls, parapets, stairs, scarps, and embrasures, and improvements to drainage system. \$200,000.

MOSHASSUCK SQUARE HISTORIC DISTRICT (AMERICAN SCREW CO. FACTORIES): STILLMAN WHITE BRASS FOUNDRY (44-74-00145-00). *Providence, Providence Co.* Private ownership (Stillman White Associates). A building dating from the 1850's, one of a group of structures that formed the city's first large industrial district. Restoration and cleaning of brick, and repairs to stack and gutters. \$15,000.

CLARKE STREET MEETINGHOUSE (SECOND CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH) (44-74-00146-00). See above (71-00021-02). Second phase of restoration, including various exterior repairs and improvements. \$19,000.

FORT ADAMS STATE PARK (44-74-00147-00). See above (72-00047-03). Continuing restoration, specifically rehabilitation of counter scarp. \$50,000.

SIXTH DISTRICT COURTHOUSE (44-74-00151-00). See above (73-00081-00). Second phase of restoration, specifically continuing work on architectural and archeological studies and preparation of specifications. \$5,500.00.

BENJAMIN CHURCH HOUSE (44-75-00155-00). *Bristol, Bristol Co.* Municipal ownership. See above (72-00029-00). Repainting of exterior and repainting of shutters. \$3,000.

GREENE-BOWEN HOUSE (44-75-00161-00). *Warwick, Kent Co.* Private ownership (Warwick Historical Society). 1715 structure is a

prime example of the final phase of the evolution of the characteristic Rhode Island house. Architectural and archeological research. \$15,800.

CONANICUT BATTERY (44-75-00164-00). *Jamestown, Newport Co.* Municipal ownership. Built in 1776 by Americans for defense, it was used by the British from 1776-78 to blockade Narragansett Bay. \$3,500.

WHITEHALL (44-75-00165-00). *Middletown, Newport Co.* Private ownership (Society of Colonial Dames in America). Country retreat of Bishop George Berkeley, erected in 1729. Fine example of early Georgian architecture. Acreage around the house to be acquired by the Society of Colonial Dames from private ownership. \$12,500.

NEWPORT HISTORIC DISTRICT: LIGHTING (44-75-00166-00). *Newport, Newport Co.* Municipal ownership. Installation of fifty gas street lights, resembling those of the 1870's and 1880's, on Pelham Street, one of the earliest gaslit streets in the country. \$14,000. ■●

NEWPORT CASINO (44-75-00170-00). *Newport, Newport Co.* Private ownership (National Lawn Tennis Hall of Fame). Site of the first official U. S. Lawn Tennis Championships in 1881. Restoration of exterior woodwork; repainting of chimneys. \$15,000.

COMMON BURYING GROUND AND ISLAND CEMETERY (44-75-00172-00). *Newport, Newport Co.* Municipal ownership. Gravestones, dating from the 1660's, are considered masterpieces of colonial art. Damaged gravestones will be cleaned and repaired. \$3,500.

NEWPORT HISTORIC DISTRICT: SAINT MARY'S ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH (44-75-00177-00). *Newport, Newport Co.* Private ownership (St. Mary's R. C. Church). 1849 brownstone building is the oldest Catholic parish in Rhode Island and a fine example of Gothic Revival architecture. Restoration of tower. \$40,000. ■●

KAY STREET-CATHERINE STREET-OLD BEACH ROAD HISTORIC DISTRICT: SAMUEL TILTON HOUSE (44-75-00179-00). *Newport, Newport Co.* Private ownership. See above (74-00126-00). Painting and reshingling of exterior walls. \$5,500.

WILLIAM KING COVELL III HOUSE (44-75-00180-00). See above (73-00076-00). Restoration of chimneys. \$1,300.

UNION CHURCH (44-75-00181-00). *Portsmouth, Newport Co.* Private ownership (Portsmouth Historical Society). 1866 church is significant as the site of the first skirmishes between British and American forces in the Battle of Rhode Island. Work to include carpentry and painting. \$1,500.

BROWN AVENUE HISTORIC DISTRICT: DAME FARM (44-75-00185-00). *Johnston, Providence Co.* State ownership. A typical, moderate-sized family farm, owned and worked by generations of old-line Yankee farmers for over 125 years. Represents a fast disappearing aspect of Rhode Island life. Stabilization of various buildings; reshingling of roof. \$6,000.

CLEMENCE-IRONS HOUSE (44-75-00186-00). *Johnston, Providence Co.* Private ownership (Society for the Preservation of New England Antiquities). Built in 1680, the dwelling is a fine example of the Rhode Island "stone-ender" with the western end and chimney almost completely of stone. Replacement of rotted door sill; repointing of chimney. \$2,000.

LIMEROCK VILLAGE HISTORIC DISTRICT: LIMEROCK GRANGE/NORTH GATE (44-75-00188-00). *Lincoln, Providence Co.* Private ownership (Blackstone Valley Historical Society). Tollhouse erected in 1807 by the Louisquisset Turnpike Company to regulate commercial activity between Massachusetts and Providence. Updating of heating and electrical systems. \$3,500.

MARTIN HALL (44-75-00195-00). See above (71-00021-01). Repair to granite steps and stucco walls; repointing of stone masonry. \$10,000.

MOSHASSUCK SQUARE HISTORIC DISTRICT (AMERICAN SCREW CO. FACTORIES): STILLMAN WHITE BRASS FOUNDRY (44-75-00197-00). See above (74-00145-00). Replacement of flooring. \$5,000.

THE TOWERS (44-75-00206-00). *Narragansett, Washington Co.* Municipal ownership. Stone remnant of Narragansett Casino, designed by McKim, Mead and White in 1883. Cleaning of stone surface; repainting; roofing. \$43,828.


KINGSTON VILLAGE HISTORIC DISTRICT: KINGSTON FREE LIBRARY (44-75-00210-00). *South Kingston, Washington Co.* Private ownership (Kingston Free Library). One of five original state houses where Rhode Island General Assembly met from 1776-91. Altered in 1876 by the addition of a mansard roof. Repairs of cornice, trim and wood shingles. Restoration to 1876 appearance. \$10,000.

Cokesbury and vic., Greenwood Co. County ownership (Cokesbury Historical and Recreation Commission). A village founded in 1824 by Methodists from nearby Tabernacle; The College was constructed in 1854. Restoration plans and specifications, and comprehensive master plan. \$12,500.

BURT-STARK HOUSE (45-71-00019-00).
Abbeville, Abbeville Co. County ownership (Abbeville County Historic Preservation Commission). A mid-19th century frame structure that was the home of Armistead Burt, member of the U. S. and Confederate Congresses, and the site of the final Confederate cabinet meeting. Restoration of exterior and grounds. \$10,004.50.

KETCHIN BUILDING (45-71-00021-00).
Winnsboro, Fairfield Co. County ownership.

An unusual example of Federal architecture dating from c. 1830. Restoration of brickwork and exterior millwork. \$25,000.

JACOB KELLEY HOUSE (45-71-00027-00).
Hartsville vic., Darlington Co. County ownership (Darlington County Historical Commission). A building that evolved from a one-story log house predating 1830 into a plantation house. Structural rehabilitation; exterior and interior repairs; and utility improvements. \$6,250.

OLD DORCHESTER (45-72-00043-00). *Summerville vic., Dorchester Co.* State ownership. Site of a settlement established in 1695, abandoned after the Revolution, and today retaining evidence of a 1753 church and 1775 fort. Archeological excavation and stabilization of the fort. \$15,000.

LANDSFORD CANAL (45-72-00044-00).
Rowell, Chester Co. State ownership. The only such waterway in an unaltered condition remaining in the State. Relocation and stabilization of lock keeper's house. \$48,130.

Jacksonboro vic., Colleton Co. (Private ownership (Colleton County Historical Society)). Ruins of a church building that was for many years the sole Anglican worship place in the region. Stabilization and repair of exterior walls. \$1,500.

JENNINGS-BROWN HOUSE (45-73-00066-00). *Bennettsville, Marlboro Co.* County ownership. A building dating from 1827, the earliest two-story house remaining in the community. Acquisition by county Historic Preservation Commission. \$15,000.

JENNINGS-BROWN HOUSE (45-73-00066-00). See above (73-00066-00). Preparation of plans and specifications for restoration, and restoration of walls and roof. \$7,500.

Columbia, Richland Co. State ownership. The

CHESTER HISTORIC DISTRICT (45-73-00096-00). *Chester, Chester Co.* Multiple public and private ownership. The historic commercial heart of town. Feasibility studies, evaluations, and recommendations for preservation. \$5,000.

CHARLESTON HISTORIC DISTRICT (45-73-00101-00). *Charleston, Charleston Co.* Multiple public and private ownership. District with more than 650 18th and 19th century buildings, some dating from as early as 1712. Survey and planning. \$20,000. ■●

HAGOOD MILL (45-73-00102-00). *Pickens vic., Pickens Co.* County ownership (Pendleton Historical and Recreational Commission). An unpretentious industrial building, one of the few such mills extant in the state, reflecting pioneer life of the early 19th century. Restoration of the mill and raceway. \$9,020.31.

GEORGETOWN HISTORIC DISTRICT: KAMINSKI BUILDING (45-73-00103-00). *Georgetown, Georgetown Co.* Three-story, brick building constructed in 1840 and altered several times. An excellent example of a turn-of-the-century commercial building. Acquisition by Georgetown County Historical Commission from a private individual. \$15,000.

HAMPTON PLANTATION (45-73-00104-00). *McClellanville vic., Charleston Co.* State ownership. A classically styled frame structure ca. 1735, 1791. Restoration, including exterior repairs, painting, and the removal of recent interior modifications. \$25,000. ■

LANDSFORD CANAL (45-74-00111-00). See above (72-00044-00). Clearing; archeological excavation; and restoration of the walls. \$25,000.

ST. DAVID'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH AND CEMETERY (45-74-00118-00). *Cheraw, Chesterfield.* County ownership (Chesterfield County Historic Preservation Commission). A clapboard Meeting House style building, dated 1820's. Exterior restoration; sprinkler and alarm system. \$10,000.

JENNINGS-BROWN HOUSE (45-74-00119-00). See above (73-00066-00). Reconstruction of chimneys, porches and kitchen. \$22,500.

OLD NINETY SIX AND STAR FORT (45-74-00124-00). See above (73-00085-00). Archeological excavation of the southwest section of the village. \$15,350. ■

HORN CREEK BAPTIST CHURCH (45-74-00125-00). *Edgefield, Edgefield Co.* Private ownership (Edgefield Baptist Association). A meeting house which predates 1790. Project work to include foundation stabilization; exterior and interior restoration. \$3,000.

JOHN MARK VERDIEK HOUSE (45-74-00133-00). *Beaufort, Beaufort Co.* Private ownership (Historic Beaufort Foundation). An example of late 18th century low-country architecture. Interior and exterior restoration and the restructuring of a courtyard and small garden to historical appearance. \$65,000.

OCTAGON HOUSE (45-74-00136-00). *Laurens, Laurens Co.* Acquisition by Laurens County Arts Council of an early concrete wall structure built in 1859. \$5,000.

SIMONS COTTAGE (45-74-00145-00). *Columbia, Richland Co.* County ownership. Owned by a free Black musician prior to the Civil War. From initial meetings held in the house, built ca. 1850, a Black church was later established. Architectural research; exterior; interior, and fence and walk restoration. \$30,000.

HISTORIC CAMDEN REVOLUTIONARY WAR RESTORATION: KERSHAW (CORNWALLIS) HOUSE (45-74-00161-00). *Camden, Kershaw Co.* Municipal ownership. The Kershaw (Cornwallis) House, built ca. 1778 in Fort Camden, served as British headquarters during the Revolutionary War and was burned by Union troops in 1865. Project work to include preliminary phases of reconstruction, and excavation of trench. \$25,000.

OLD COKESBURY HISTORIC DISTRICT AND MASONIC FEMALE COLLEGE CONFERENCE SCHOOL (45-74-00162-00). See above (71-00018-00). Carpentry; heating and airconditioning; and plastering. \$37,500.

WINNSBORO HISTORIC DISTRICT (45-74-00167-00). *Winnsboro, Fairfield Co.* Multiple public and private ownership. An upcountry town, founded in 1755. Architectural inventory; developmental guidelines; architectural design criteria. \$7,500.

MIDDLETON PLACE (45-74-00178-00). *Summerville vic., Dorchester Co.* Private ownership. (Middletton Place Foundation). The site of America's oldest landscaped gardens. South wing of the original plantation house still survives. Master plan; research report; interior restoration. \$25,000. ■

CHURCH OF THE HOLY CROSS (45-74-00184-02). *Stateburg, Sumter Co.* Private ownership (The Vestry of the Holy Cross). A Gothic Revival church built in 1850 constructed of pise de terre (rammed earth). Restoration, including repair of a collapsed wall, roof structure. \$87,500. ■

PON PON CHAPEL (45-74-00184-03). See above (72-00047-00). Continued stabilization of the ruins and reconstruction of the front facade. \$2,000.

EDGEFIELD HISTORIC DISTRICT:

OAKLEY PARK (45-75-00191-00). *Edgefield, Edgefield Co.* Private ownership (United Daughters of the Confederacy). Built in 1835 and later the residence of General Martin W. Gary, an organizer of the 1876 campaign to elect Wade Hampton governor. This election marked the end of the Reconstruction in South Carolina. Removal of non-original additions; replacement of the roof with a cedar shake roof; exterior painting. \$10,000.

OCTAGON HOUSE (45-75-00192-00). See above (74-00136-00). Plans and specifications. \$10,531.

TRINITY EPISCOPAL CHURCH AND CEMETERY (45-75-00195-00). *Abbeville, Abbeville Co.* Private (church) ownership. An 1860 stucco-covered structure in the Gothic Revival style. Interior repairs; restoration of original church furniture; resurfacing of the spire. \$62,500.

HISTORIC CAMDEN REVOLUTIONARY WAR RESTORATION: KERSHAW (CORNWALLIS) HOUSE (45-75-00230-00). See above (74-00161-00). Plans and specifications. \$6,000.

MARION HISTORIC DISTRICT (45-75-00233-00). *Marion, Marion Co.* Multiple public and private ownership. Marion, dating from the late 1700's, contains buildings and homes representing various styles of 19th century architecture. Survey and planning. \$5,000.

CHARLESTON HISTORIC DISTRICT: 16 MEETING STREET (45-75-00244-00). *Charleston, Charleston Co.* Private (individual) ownership. An 1876 residence in an elaborate Renaissance Revival style architecture. Plans and specifications. \$1,500.

McCRADY'S TAVERN AND LONG ROOM (45-75-00250-00). *Charleston, Charleston Co.* Private ownership (McCrady's Tavern Co., Ltd.). Used as a tavern from 1778 to the early twentieth century. George Washington was given a banquet in the Long Room in 1791. Plans and specifications; exterior restoration of the Long Room Building. \$50,000.



Missouri River. Acquisition of two adjacent lots by the Clay County Historical Society from a private individual. \$4,000.

AUSTIN-WHITEMORE MUSEUM (46-73-00008-00). See above (73-00007-04). Interior and exterior restoration; improvements to mechanical systems. \$21,000.

FORT SISSETON (46-74-00010-00). *Britton vic., Marshall Co.* State ownership. A significant frontier army post occupied by U. S. troops in the 1880's. Preparation of plans and specifications and stabilization of walls and foundations. \$3,917.

OLD MINNEHAHA COUNTY COURTHOUSE (46-74-00011-00). *Sioux Falls, Minnehaha Co.* Private ownership (Minnehaha County Historical Society). The best example of Richardsonian Romanesque architecture in the State. Restoration of 1890 appearance, including repair and stabilization of roof. \$39,194.

CUSTER COUNTY COURTHOUSE (46-74-00012-00). *Custer, Custer Co.* Private ownership (Custer County Historical Society). An example of Italianate architecture, dated 1881. Architectural research; plans and specifications; and minor repairs to exterior wall. \$8,228.

POCAHONTAS SCHOOLHOUSE (46-74-00013-00). *Dixon vic., Gregory Co.* Private ownership (Gregory County Historical Society). A typical frontier educational structure, dating from 1905. Interior and exterior restoration. \$282.

MAJOR JOHN A. 

CASTALIAN SPRINGS (BLEDSOE'S LICK) (47-72-00007-00). *Castalian Springs, Sumner Co.* State ownership. Site of one of the earliest settlements in middle Tennessee containing the largest known log house in the State. Acquisition of 14 acres. \$17,500. ■

CHRISTOPHER TAYLOR HOME (47-72-**

NETHERLAND INN AND COMPLEX (47-73-00023-00). *Kingsport, Sullivan Co.* Private ownership (Netherland Inn Association). A complex that flourished along the major road from Virginia into Tennessee during the period 1818 to 1850. Archeological work; installation of security and fire detection systems. \$16,000.

TRAVELLER'S REST (47-73-00024-00). *Nashville, Davidson Co.* Private ownership (National Society of the Colonial Dames of America in Tennessee). The late 18th century home of John Overton, jurist, politician, and close advisor to Andrew Jackson. Restore weaving house and smoke house; install protective material in main house windows. \$8,500.

THE LEE AND FONTAINE HOUSES OF THE JAMES LEE MEMORIAL (47-73-00025-00). *Memphis, Shelby Co.* Municipal ownership. An element of the Victorian Village District. Exterior restoration and repairs. \$10,000.

SAM DAVIS HOME (47-73-00026-00). *Smyrna, Rutherford Co.* State ownership. Complex dating from the 1850's, reflecting Civil War and agricultural historic themes. Archeology and planning for restoration. \$7,500.

MARBLE SPRINGS (47-73-00027-00). *Knoxville, Knox Co.* State ownership. Home of Tennessee's first Governor. Site planning and archeological research; drainage improvement; placing of electrical lines underground. \$5,000.

SOUTHWEST POINT (47-74-00038-00). *Kingston, Roane Co.* Municipal ownership. Site of Fort Southwest Point, U. S. Army garrison during period 1794-1807. Excavation to locate points of habitation and cultural activity. \$8,000.

OAKLANDS (47-74-00041-00). *Murfreesboro, Rutherford Co.* Private ownership (Oaklands Association). Mansion reflecting Southern architectural styles of the first half of 19th century. Served as military headquarters for both Confederate and Union forces during the Civil War. Replacement of roof. \$12,500.

VICTORIAN VILLAGE DISTRICT: MALORY HOUSE (47-74-00042-00). *Memphis, Shelby Co.* Private ownership (D.A.R., S.A.R., C.A.R. Chapter House Inc.). A twenty-five room mansion built in 1852 by Isaac Kirtland, prominent Memphis banker. Research

and preparation of master plan and drawings for restoration. \$7,340.

FORT GRANGER (47-74-00043-00). *Franklin, Williamson Co.* Municipal ownership. A Union fortress constructed in 1863 as an effort to control Confederate troop movements south of Nashville. Historical research and archeological excavation preliminary to restoration. \$3,000.

PINSON MOUNDS (47-74-00046-00). *Pinson vic., Madison Co.* State ownership. This site, dating from 200 to 600 A.D., consists of three distinct mound groups with associated palisade walls, covering 1,012 acres. Archeological research. \$10,000. ■

THE PRESTON FARM (47-74-00047-00). *Kingsport, Sullivan Co.* Private ownership (The Netherland Inn Association). Also known as the Exchange Place; a farm complex built in the early nineteenth century. Archeological investigation of the cook's cabin, the smoke house, and an early 19th century road. \$2,000.

RAMSEY HOUSE (47-74-00048-00). *Knoxville, Knox Co.* Private ownership (Association for the Preservation of Tennessee Antiquities [APTA]). The first stone home in Knox county, built in 1797, the residence of the Ramsey family, several of whose members played a prominent role in Tennessee history. Installation of a climate control system. \$10,000.

SAM HOUSTON SCHOOLHOUSE (47-74-00049-00). *Maryville, Blount Co.* State ownership. Built in 1794, this structure is the oldest surviving schoolhouse in the State and the only remaining building associated with Tennessee Governor Sam Houston. Historical, architectural, and archeological research and preparation of master plan. \$4,500.

CASTALIAN SPRINGS (BLEDSOE'S LICK) (47-74-00051-01). See above (72-00007-00). Acquisition by the State of approximately 8 acres surrounding Castalian Springs from a private individual. \$5,898.12. ■

BELLE MEADE (47-74-00052-00). *Nashville vic., Davidson Co.* State ownership (Deeded in trust to APTA). Greek Revival mansion constructed c. 1840, the primary structure on one of America's finest thoroughbred horse farms in the 19th century. Preparation of a historic structures report with recommendations for restoration. \$2,925.

BELMONT (47-74-00056-00). *Nashville, Davidson Co.* Private ownership (Belmont College). A mansion built in 1850 in a distinctive architectural style, an admixture of Italianate and Greek Revival elements. Restoration and repair of elaborate cornice. \$11,000.

RUGBY COLONY (47-74-00058-00). *Rugby, Morgan Co.* Private ownership (Rugby Restoration Association). Colony established by the noted English author, Thomas Hughes, in

1880. It included 65 distinctive Victorian buildings, 17 of which remain. Restoration of the roof of the Board of Aid Building; fire security for this structure, the Library, and Livingston Lisle. \$11,601.88.

TWO RIVERS (DAVID H. MCGAVOCK HOUSE) (47-74-00062-00). *Donelson, Davidson Co.* Municipal ownership (Metropolitan government of Nashville). A two-story 1859 mansion significant for its Italianate architecture. The property also includes a small brick residence dating from 1802. Architectural study of both structures preparatory to restoration. \$3,000.


IMMANUEL CHURCH (EPISCOPAL) (47-74-00074-00). *LaGrange, Fayette Co.* Private (church) ownership. An 1843 church used as an armory and hospital during the Civil War. Exterior cleaning and repointing. \$5,000.

JOHN AND LANDON CARTER HOUSE (THE MANSION) (47-74-00076-03). See above (71-00005-04). Architectural and historical research. \$3,725.


RUTHERFORD COUNTY COURTHOUSE (47-75-00080-00). *Murfreesboro, Rutherford Co.* County ownership. Constructed in 1859, one of only seven antebellum courthouses still extant in Tennessee. Preparation of a historical structures report and proposal for adaptive restoration. \$5,000.

HOLY TRINITY CHURCH (47-75-00089-00). *Nashville, Davidson Co.* Private (church) ownership. Constructed between 1852 and 1860, an outstanding example of early Gothic Revival architecture in Tennessee. Replacement of electrical system, \$10,000.

SHIELD'S STATION (47-75-00092-00). *Blaine, Grainger Co.* Private (individual) ownership. 1792 two-story frame building used as a store, tavern and residence. Presidents Jackson, Polk, and Andrew Johnson, all from Tennessee, were said to have sojourned there. Historical and architectural research preparatory to restoration. \$2,500.

GETHSEMANE LUTHERAN CHURCH (48-71-00007-00). *Austin, Travis Co.* State ownership. A brick building with Gothic Revival decorative features dating from 1883. Development of gardens and lawns linking the church and the Carrington House (see above) on the State Capitol grounds. \$15,402.31.

HAMMOND HOUSE (48-71-00009-00). *Calvert, Robertson Co.* Private ownership (Robertson County Historical Foundation, Inc.). A Gothic Revival house dating from the 1870's. Restoration plans and specifications; injection grouting of masonry walls; structural and utility improvements. \$6,000.

FORT MCKAVETT HISTORIC DISTRICT (48-71-00010-00). *Fort McKavett, Menard Co.* State ownership. Military post established in 1852, the buildings of which form the nucleus of the present town and comprise an historic district. Archeological, historical, and architectural research. \$10,000.

FORT LANCASTER (48-71-00011-00). *Shef-*

field vic., Crockett Co. State ownership. One in a series of forts erected along the western frontier of Texas to provide protection on the route to California. Archeological research. \$7,500.

FORT GRIFFIN (48-71-00012-00). *Albany vic., Shackelford Co.* State ownership. One in a series of forts erected along the western frontier. Archeological, historical, and architectural research. \$10,000.

FORT RICHARDSON (48-71-00013-00). *Jacksboro vic., Jack Co.* State ownership. A southwest frontier post that played a central role in the Red River War of 1874 and the events preceding it. Architectural and archeological research. \$5,000.

MISSION CONCEPCION (48-72-00016-00). *San Antonio, Bexar Co.* Private ownership (Archdiocese of San Antonio). Best preserved of all the Texas mission units, with a massive Mexican Baroque church and adjacent convent. Archeological investigation for future restoration. \$6,000. ■

URSULINE ACADEMY (48-72-00020-00). *San Antonio, Bexar Co.* A mid-19th century convent showing French architectural influence that was one of three Ursuline Convents important in the State's early history. Acquisition of one wing by the San Antonio Conservation Society from private owner to complete the Society's ownership of the main buildings of the Academy complex. \$11,862.

ASHTON VILLA (48-72-00022-00). *Galveston, Galveston Co.* Private ownership (Galveston Historical Foundation, Inc.). A brick Italianate mansion built in 1857. Interior and exterior carpentry and millwork. \$12,500.

LUBBOCK LAKE SITE (48-73-00033-00). *Lubbock vic., Lubbock Co.* Municipal ownership. A stratified kill site containing bones of typical Pleistocene animals. Excavation; study of specimens; carbon 14 dating; and preparation of final report. \$27,000.

MONROE-CROOK HOUSE (48-73-

00040-00). *Crockett, Houston Co.* Private ownership (George W. Crook and Hallie M. Crook Memorial, Inc.). An 1854 Greek Revival house, a high point in the architecture of the early statehood period. Exterior and interior restoration. \$22,500.

1884 HOUSTON COTTON EXCHANGE BUILDING (48-73-00042-00). *Houston, Harris Co.* Private ownership (Michael Tribe Associates). A superb Victorian commercial building. Exterior restoration. \$25,000.

MENGER SOAP WORKS (48-73-00045-02). *San Antonio, Bexar Co.* Private ownership (San Antonio Development Agency). Built in 1850 by a German immigrant, this limestone vernacular building is significant as the only pre-Civil War industrial structure in Texas. \$8,500.

FORT CONCHO (48-74-00047-00). *San Angelo, Tom Greene Co.* Municipal ownership. Established in 1867 as an army post for the protection of the Texas frontier. Acquisition by the City of San Angelo from private ownership. \$18,975.



MONROE-CROOK HOUSE (48-74-00078-00). See above (73-00040-00). Interior restoration of second floor, including painting; woodwork repair; floor refinishing. \$10,500.

HAMMOND HOUSE (48-74-00079-00) See above (71-00009-00). Restoration of exterior brickwork; interior plaster repair; carpentry; and repair of hardware and lighting fixtures. \$21,000.

HAMMOND HOUSE (48-74-00079-06). See above (71-00009-00). Exterior stabilization and reconstruction of brick walls. \$4,000.

LAVACA COUNTY COURTHOUSE (48-74-00080-00). *Hallettsville, Lavaca Co.* Municipal ownership. Built in 1899, a magnificent Richardsonian country courthouse of limestone. Extensive restoration of 164 windows. \$22,000.

STAFFORD BANK AND OPERA HOUSE (48-74-00083-00). *Columbus, Colorado Co.* Private ownership (Magnolia Homes Tour, Inc.). Outstanding example of Second Empire architecture in Texas designed by N. J. Clayton. The first floor served as a bank; the second, as an opulent opera house. To be restored to its 1886 appearance. \$55,000.

MISSION CONCEPCION (48-74-00084-04). See above (72-00016-00). Archeological investigation. \$3,750. ■

MAGOFFIN HOMESTEAD (48-75-00097-00). *El Paso, El Paso Co.* 1875 adobe Territorial style residence of the Victorian period, built around a central patio. Acquisition by the public (joint venture of the City of El Paso and the State of Texas) from multiple private ownership. \$30,000.

URSULINE ACADEMY (48-75-00132-00). See above (48-72-00020-00). Archeological research; structural renovation; installation of drainage system. \$20,000.

SAN JOSE MISSION NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE (48-75-00137-00). *San Antonio, Bexar Co.* Private ownership (Archdiocese of San Antonio). Archeological research and investigation to determine significance of cultural material recovered within the compound area. \$1,200.

MISSION SAN FRANCISCO DE LA ESPADA (48-75-00138-00). *San Antonio, Bexar Co.* Private ownership (Archdiocese of San Antonio). Second mission erected in East Texas. Vital part of 18th c. Spanish conquest to Christianize and civilize the frontier. Archeological investigation. \$1,410.

MISSION SAN JUAN CAPISTRANO (48-75-00139-00). *San Antonio, Bexar Co.* Private ownership (Archdiocese of San Antonio). 1731 complex that flourished as a compound until 1824. Still a functioning parish. Archeological investigation to establish original construction of building. \$10,498.

MANSFIELD CUT UNDERWATER ARCHEOLOGICAL DISTRICT (48-75-00140-00). *Port Isabel vic., Kenedy and Willacy Cos.* State ownership. Includes at least three 1553 Spanish shipwrecks, earliest verified wrecks in this hemisphere. Underwater archeological investigation. \$18,000.

CHURCH OF NUESTRA SENORA DE LA CANDELARIA Y GUADALUPE (48-75-00144-00). *San Antonio, Bexar Co.* Private ownership (Archdiocese of San Antonio).

Original parish church of the first civil settlement (1731) in the Spanish Province of Texas. Archeological research. \$5,000.

FAYETTE COUNTY COURTHOUSE AND JAIL (48-75-00145-00). *LaGrange, Fayette Co.* Municipal ownership. Three-story 1891 Romanesque Revival stone building with clock tower. Exterior restoration to 1890's appearance. \$25,000.

SEMINOLE CANYON ARCHEOLOGICAL DISTRICT (48-75-00145-03). *Comstock, Val Verde Co.* Multiple private ownership. Six mile tributary of the Rio Grande, one of the richest Indian pictograph areas in the world. Acquisition of 660 acres by State from private owners. \$41,215.





Significant for its unique masonry and tile "Shingle Style" architecture. Cleaning of exterior brick walls; restoration of wooden trim; interior restoration of ballroom and banquet hall. \$14,615.







PLYMOUTH HISTORIC DISTRICT: AZRO JOHNSON FARM (50-72-00021-00). *Plymouth, Windsor Co.* A 162 acre farm containing early 19th century buildings, an integral part of the historic scene. Acquisition by the State. \$62,000.

MOUNT INDEPENDENCE (50-73-00030-00). *Orwell, Addison Co.* State owner-

ship. A Revolutionary War fort on Lake Champlain, officially part of the Fort Ticonderoga complex, which served as the focus of the Northern Department defenses from mid-1776 to mid-1777. Archeological research; reconstruction of a 50-foot boat (gondola), a replica of one of the vessels built at Benedict Arnold's direction in 1776; restoration of timber house; installation of fencing and trails. \$36,250.

PLYMOUTH HISTORIC DISTRICT: ALDRICH HOUSE (50-74-00035-00). *Plymouth, Windsor Co.* A one story frame structure. Acquisition by the State. \$30,430.

BARRE CITY HALL AND OPERA HOUSE (50-74-00040-00). *Barre, Washington Co.* Municipal ownership. Four-story brick structure of Classic Revival style containing one of the finest nineteenth century unaltered theater interiors in northern New England. Architectural supervision and technical services. \$5,000.

RIPTON COMMUNITY HOUSE (50-74-00041-00). *Ripton, Addison Co.* Municipal ownership. Frame church built in 1864, now used as a community center; the architectural nucleus of this Vermont mountain village. Structural stabilization; restoration to bring mechanical and electrical services to code. \$9,000.

WOODSTOCK VILLAGE HISTORIC DISTRICT: MIDDLE BRIDGE (50-74-00052-01). *Woodstock, Windsor Co.* Municipal ownership. Of Town lattice truss design, one of the last authentic covered bridges to be built in New England employing traditional materials and construction methods. Replacement of roof and siding; repair of structural damage. \$31,192.

UPPER FALLS COVERED BRIDGE (50-75-00085-00). *Perkinsville vic., Windsor Co.* Municipal ownership. Circa 1870 covered bridge exhibiting vernacular Greek Revival detailing and use of Town lattice truss. Repairs to woodwork and dry wall masonry abutment. \$8,000.

OLD RED MILL (50-75-00102-00). *Jericho Village, Chittenden Co.* Private ownership (Jericho Historical Society). Late nineteenth century frame and fieldstone mill, one of the first to utilize the roller method of processing grain. Roofing; door and window restoration; earth and concrete work in basement. \$30,285.

UNION STATION (50-75-00111-00). *Brattleboro, Windham Co.* Municipal ownership. One story stone station built in 1915, a prominent Brattleboro landmark. Restoration and repointing of damaged stonework; repairs to windows and doors; painting. \$3,000.





POINT OF HONOR (51-71-00005-00). *Lynchburg, (Indep. City).* Municipal ownership. A two-story stuccoed brick Federal style mansion built in 1806 with exceptional period woodwork. Structural stabilization and exterior restoration. \$13,500.

ST. JAMES CHURCH (51-71-00008-00). *Accomack, Accomack Co.* Private (church) ownership. A church built in 1838 distinguished by exceptional interior painted architectural decoration. Restoration of mural above altar. \$1,500.

CUSTIS TOMBS (51-71-00010-00). *Cheapside vic., Northampton Co.* Private ownership (Association for the Preservation of Virginia Antiquities). Cemetery containing tombs of the progenitor of the Custis family in America and his grandson. Stabilization of stonework and archeological examination. \$1,500.

PRESTWOULD (51-71-00010-01). *Clarks-ville, Mecklenburg Co.* Private ownership

(Prestwould Foundation). One of Virginia's best preserved 18th century plantations. Preparation of developmental master plan. \$4,000.

POINT OF HONOR (41-72-00012-00). See above (71-00005-00). Continuing restoration, including repointing and stabilizing masonry on main house and office. \$5,397.70.

WISHART-BOUSCH HOUSE (51-72-00016-00). *Virginia Beach (Indep. City).* Private ownership (Association for the Preservation of Virginia Antiquities). One of America's oldest remaining brick houses. Archeological investigation. \$3,000.

MORSON'S ROW (51-72-00017-00). *Richmond (Indep. City).* State ownership. Row of three townhouses in the Italianate style dating from 1853 that are an essential feature in the State Capitol area streetscape. Architectural research preliminary to restoration. \$4,000.

MAYFIELD COTTAGE (51-72-00019-00). See above (71-00004-00). Continuing restoration, including masonry, cornice, and basement repairs; waterproofing; drainage and grading work, and rehabilitation of steps and porch. \$11,359.30.

THE LYCEUM (51-72-00020-00). *Alexandria (Indep. City).* Municipal ownership. A splendid Greek Revival building of the 1830's that is a focal point in the Alexandria Historic District. Architectural planning for structural and exterior restoration. \$4,000.

BOTETOURT COUNTY COURTHOUSE (51-72-00021-00). *Fincastle, Botetourt Co.* County ownership. A provincial Greek Revival building important in Virginia's notable collection of antebellum courthouses. Preparation of drawings, plans, and specifications for restoration. After a fire, a study showed that the building was structurally unsound, and it had to be razed. \$11,000.

KERR PLACE (51-72-00022-00). *Onancock, Accomack Co.* Private ownership (Eastern Shore of Virginia Historical Society). A building widely regarded as the most elaborate Federal mansion on Virginia's eastern shore. Various structural and engineering improve-



ments. \$8,000.

WISHART-BOUSCH HOUSE (51-73-00025-00). See above (72-00016-00). Continuing restoration of house and gardens. \$36,000.

WESTON MANOR (51-73-00029-00). *Hopewell (Indep. City)*. Private ownership (Historic Hopewell Foundation, Inc.). An important late Georgian plantation house. Restoration of weatherboarding; repair of roof, windows, sills, and foundation; porch reconstruction, and exterior painting. \$15,000.

WHITTLE HOUSE (51-73-00034-00). *Norfolk (Indep. City)*. Private ownership (Norfolk Historic Foundation). A fine example of Federal design dating from the 1790's. Basement and exterior repairs. \$15,322.

THE ACADEMY OF MUSIC (51-73-00038-00). *Lynchburg (Indep. City)*. Municipal and private (Academy of Music Theatre, Inc.) ownership. One of the few surviving legitimate theaters dating from the turn of the

century in Virginia, distinguished by its fine classical decoration and design. Repairs to doors, roofing, windows, stucco, stage, and plumbing; painting. \$23,000.

ST JOHN'S CHURCH (51-73-00041-00). *Hampton (Indep. City)*. Private (church) ownership. A brick building dating from c. 1728 with interior Victorian decor, one of six remaining colonial churches in Virginia built in the shape of a Latin cross. Architectural services and masonry repairs. \$1,533.

WILLIAM J. CLARK LIBRARY AND BARCO-STEVENSON HALL (51-73-00043-00). *Richmond (Indep. City)*. Private ownership (Virginia Union University). Built in New York City as the Belgian Pavilion for World's Fair, then moved to campus in 1941. Window restoration and air conditioning installation. \$15,000.

FREDERICKSBURG HISTORIC DISTRICT (51-73-00048-00). *Fredericksburg (Indep. City)*. Multiple public and private ownership. Preparation of master plan for development and restoration of a valuable historical area. \$3,500.

MONUMENTAL CHURCH (51-73-00049-00). *Richmond (Indep. City).* State ownership. A superb example of American Greek Revival architecture dating from c. 1814. Archeological investigation, drawings, and studies preliminary to restoration. \$5,000. ■

POINT OF HONOR (51-73-00050-00). See above (71-00005-00). Repair of masonry and sash, and replacement of the roof on the attached building. \$20,000.

MERCHANT'S HOPE CHURCH (51-73-00051-00). *Hopewell vic., Prince George Co.* Private ownership (Merchant's Hope Church Foundation, Inc.). Possibly the oldest church in Virginia, noted for its colonial brickwork. Various repairs; repointing and cleaning of brick; foundation improvements. \$4,750.

LEXINGTON HISTORIC DISTRICT: JACOB RUFF HOUSE (51-73-00054-00). *Lexington (Indep. City).* Private ownership (Historic Lexington Foundation). A late 18th century building important in the Lexington Historic District. Restoration, including masonry, concrete, carpentry, millwork; metal and roofing repairs; excavation; painting; demolition of incompatible features. \$12,500.

STONEWALL JACKSON HOUSE (51-74-00056-00). *Lexington City.* Private ownership. A 2½ story brick house, the residence of Jackson from 1857 to 1861. Feasibility study for preservation. \$2,000.

WILLIAM J. CLARK LIBRARY AND BARCO-STEVENSON HALL (51-74-00059-00). See above (73-00043-00). Restoration of canopy; replacement of metal rail; concrete wall facing; and architectural and engineering fees. \$10,000.

OLD RUSSELL COUNTY COURTHOUSE (DICKERSON-FUGATE HOUSE) (51-75-00167-00). *Dickinsonville, Russel Co.* County ownership. 1798 structure, originally a courthouse, until ca. 1830 when converted to residence. Structural stabilization. \$12,500.

ST. JOHN'S CHURCH HISTORIC DISTRICT: ADAMS DOUBLE HOUSE (51-75-

00169-00). *Richmond (Indep. city).* Private ownership (Historical Richmond Foundation). Federal style home built by Dr. Samuel Adams in 1809, typifies the middle class life style. Installation of heating, air conditioning, plumbing and electrical systems. \$6,000.

ST. JOHN'S CHURCH HISTORIC DISTRICT: CARRINGTON ROW (51-75-00170-00). *Richmond (Indep. city).* Private ownership. Unique example of early planned uniform block development in Federal style. Restoration of third unit. Installation of heating, air conditioning, plumbing, and electrical systems. \$14,000.

ST. THOMAS CHAPEL (51-75-00178-00). *Middletown, Federick Co.* Private ownership. Episcopal church in early Gothic Revival style to be restored to 1868 period. Replacement of stucco and reconstruction of belfry and cross. \$7,725.

ALLMAND-ARCHER HOUSE (51-75-00203-00). *Norfolk (Indep. city).* Private ownership. Built ca. 1790 and remodelled in Greek Revival style, one of oldest surviving dwellings in city. Repair of chimneys and exterior stucco. \$4,000.







ASTOR FUR WAREHOUSE (55-71-00006-00). *Prairie du Chien, Crawford Co.* State ownership. An 1830's stone building that was one of the American Fur Company's principal establishments. Plans and specifications; removal of later additions; restoration of exterior stone masonry; trim, window; and interior structural repairs. \$15,209.45. ■

MINERAL POINT HILL (55-71-00008-00). *Mineral Point, Iowa Co.* An area with a high concentration of sites and structures associated with the development of Wisconsin's third oldest city. Acquisition by the State from private individual of a 40 acre tract containing remains of early mining pits, a zinc mine shaft, and a fine Cornish stone masonry building. \$11,224.

ASTOR FUR WAREHOUSE (55-72-00015-00). See above (71-00006-00). Continuing restoration, including interior, electri-

cal, heating, and ventilating improvements to prepare building for public museum use. \$9,588. ■

KOEPSSEL HOUSE (55-73-00019-00). *Eagle vic., Waukesha Co.* State ownership. One of Wisconsin's best half-timber houses, dating from 1860. Reconstruction based on measured drawings and photos of the Historic American Buildings Survey. \$41,250.

CHRISTIAN TURCK HOUSE (55-73-00021-00). *Eagle vic., Waukesha Co.* State ownership. Rare example of German construction techniques, dating from 1830. Reconstruction based on measured drawings and photos of the Historic American Buildings Survey. \$15,000.

OCTAGON HOUSE (55-74-00042-00). *Watertown, Jefferson Co.* Private ownership. The Octagon House, built in 1854, is the largest octagonal house remaining in the State. Repointing and repair of brick exterior walls and replacement of shutters. \$3,672.

OCTAGON HOUSE (55-74-00047-00). *Fond du Lac, Fond du Lac Co.* This 1850's house is a significant example of Mid-Victorian American architecture. Acquisition of property from a State agency by private individual. \$15,000.

T. B. SCOTT FREE LIBRARY (55-75-00053-00). *Merrill, Lincoln Co.* Municipal ownership. A distinctive Prairie School architectural style building. Restoration of roof. \$7,680.


MILLER-DAVIDSON HOUSE (55-75-00060-00). *Menomonee Falls, Waukesha Co.* Municipal ownership. This c. 1858 structure is an excellent example of the regional stone Greek Revival farmhouse. A new cedar shingle roof and new flashing will be installed. \$2,250.

HAMLIN GARLAND HOUSE (55-75-00066-00). *West Salem, LaCrosse Co.* Private ownership (West Salem Historical Society).


This two-story frame vernacular Victorian house was the home of author Hamlin Garland from 1893 to 1916. Chimney restoration; roof repairs; exterior painting; and interior restoration. \$6,750.

FIRST UNITARIAN SOCIETY MEETING-HOUSE. (55-75-00070-00). *Shorewood Hills, Dane Co.* Private ownership (First Unitarian Society). This 1951 Frank Lloyd Wright-designed structure represents Wright's expressionistic period in the late 1940's and is among his most notable buildings. Installation of roof insulation; repair of plaster; re-painting of ceilings. \$3,400.



SOUTH PASS CITY: GRECIAN BEND SALOON (56-71-00005-00). *South Pass City, Fremont Co.* Multiple public and private ownership. An historic mining town in Wyoming's Sweetwater gold country that reached a peak of prosperity in 1870. Restoration of the Grecian Bend Saloon. \$5,444.88.


FORT BRIDGER (56-71-00006-00). *Fort Bridger vic., Uinta Co.* State ownership. One of the two most important forts in this area of the country associated with the overland migration of the 19th century. General site improvements, to include fire protection, burial of overhead lines, marker relocations, footpaths and footbridges, and identification of lost structures. \$12,398.98.

SOUTH PASS CITY: HOTEL (56-71-00008-00). See above (71-00005-00). Reconstruction and restoration of hotel. \$2,725.

POINT OF ROCKS STAGE STATION (56-71-00012-00). *Rock Springs vic., Sweetwater Co.* State ownership. A stop on the Overland Stage Line, and junction of the Overland Trail and the Union Pacific Railroad. Stabilization preparatory to restoration. \$545.

REGISTER CLIFF (56-71-00013-00). *Guernsey vic., Platte Co.* State ownership. A mid-19th century landmark along the route to the west where countless emigrants inscribed names, dates, origins and messages in the soft limestone cliff faces. Site improvements, to include cemetery renovation, re-marking of station, and installation of a footbridge at the site of the Oregon Trail Ruts National Historic Landmark. \$1,438.31.

PIEDMONT CHARCOAL KILNS (56-71-00014-00). *Hilliard vic., Uinta Co.* State ownership. Conical native limestone kilns built in 1869 to process charcoal for mining smelters. Restoration and site improvements. \$3,037.50.

TRAIL END (56-71-00017-00). *Sheridan, Sheridan Co.* Private ownership (Sheridan County Historical Society). House built between 1908 and 1913 by cattleman, governor, and Senator John Kendrick that stands as a monumental symbol of the man and his society. Structural stabilization. \$8,419,85.

ST. MICHAEL'S MISSION (56-71-00019-00). *Ethete, Fremont Co.* Private ownership. (Episcopal Diocese of Wyoming.) A mission established in 1887 to serve the Arapahoes. Restoration of St. Martha's Cottage, one of a group of mission buildings, to serve as an Arapahoe cultural and historic center. \$5,000.

MILLER CABIN (56-71-00022-00). *Jackson Hole vic., Teton Co.* County ownership. A log complex that was the administrative seat for the first major Federal refuge for a large species of North American wildlife, the Wapiti elk. Survey and preparation of a developmental master plan. \$2,500.

MILLER CABIN (56-71-00022-00). See above (71-00021-00). Immediate stabilization of deteriorating log structure. \$4,121.25.

FORT BRIDGER: GOODRICK HOUSE (56-71-00024-00). See above (71-00006-00). Acquisition of the Goodrick ranch house by the State. \$436.

FORT BRIDGER: GOODRICK HOUSE (56-71-00025-00). See above (71-00024-00). Relocation of the Goodrick ranch house to a site within the Fort Bridger historic area. \$3,264.11.

SOUTH PASS CITY: CARISSA BUILDING (56-71-00026-00). See above (71-00005-00). A frame structure within the historic district that has served as a store and a saloon. Acquisition by the State. \$8,300.

FORT PHIL KEARNY AND ASSOCIATED SITES (56-71-00027-00). *Story vic., Johnson Co.* State ownership. Focus of the Red Cloud War. Archeological exploration, protection of findings, and site improvements. \$4,000. ■

SOUTH PASS CITY (56-71-00028-00). See above (71-00005-00). General improvement of the historic district, to include fencing; repairs to street and boardwalk; fire protection; and installation of water, sewer and electrical facilities. \$10,000.

SOUTH PASS CITY: JEAN CHIPPE CABIN (56-71-00030-00). See above (71-00005-00). An early miner's habitation. Acquisition by the State. \$500.

FORT BRIDGER: POST TRADER'S STORE (56-72-00040-00). See above (71-00006-00). Repairs to foundation. \$2,316.

SOUTH PASS CITY: EXCHANGE BANK AND COUNTY RECORDER'S OFFICE (56-72-00042-00). See above (71-00005-00). Restoration. \$4,750.

FORT FETTERMAN (56-72-00043-00). See above (71-00004-00). General site development, to include walkway improvements, reconstruction of flagpole and base, and installation of interpretive and sighting devices. \$3,000.

IVINSON MANSION AND GROUNDS (56-72-00047-00). *Laramie, Albany Co.* Private ownership (Laramie Plains Museum Association). A fine example of Victorian architecture and symbol of the pioneering work of Edward and Jane Iverson in the development of the community and State. Acquisition by the Association. \$50,000.

INDEPENDENCE ROCK (56-72-00048-01). *Devil's Gate, Natrona Co.* State and private ownership. A site associated with early fur trade, emigration, and cattle frontier history. Design and installation of six interpretive plaques and a sign. \$1,500.

TRAIL END (56-73-00052-00). See above (71-00017-00). Restoration of main house and carriage house. \$8,178.

FORT BRIDGER: COMMANDING OFFICER'S QUARTERS (56-73-00055-00). See above (71-00006-00). Research, planning,

foundation repairs, and beginning reconstruction. \$15,000.

SOUTH PASS CITY: EXCHANGE BANK AND COUNTY RECORDER'S OFFICE (56-73-00056-00). See above (72-00042-00). Completion of restoration. \$1,475.

FORT BRIDGER: POST TRADER'S STORE. (56-73-00058-00). See above (72-00040-00). Repairs to store, milk house, and commissary. \$5,897.

FORT FETTERMAN (56-73-00060-00). See above (71-00004-00). Installation of markers identifying the locations of lost structures. \$800.

MILLER CABIN (56-73-00061-00). See above (71-00021-00). Chimney, door, and window repairs; utility improvements; preservative treatment. \$2,000.

POINT OF ROCKS STAGE STATION (56-73-00065-00). See above (71-00012-00). Restoration, to include stone wall improvements, replacement of sod roof, and preservative treatment. \$5,000.

THE AMES MONUMENT (56-73-00069-00). *Albany Co.* Private ownership (Union Pacific Railroad). A monument to the contributions of the Ames Brothers to the first transcontinental railroad. Installation of interpretive marker. \$350.

FORT BRIDGER (56-74-00075-00). See above (71-00006-00). Masonry repairs on the commissary; also repairs to roof and repointing masonry of Guard House; and repairs to foundation and rethinking logs of 1858 Officers' Quarters. \$7,168.

SOUTH PASS CITY: HOUGHTON-COLTER STORE (56-74-00081-00). See above (71-00005-00). One of the first stores opened in the town. New foundation, roof, structural stabilization and interior restoration. \$19,932.

FORT FRED STEELE (56-74-00089-00).

Rawlins, Carbon Co. State ownership. A fort established to protect construction crews during building of transcontinental railroad. General stabilization and removal of trash and rubble as first stage of restoration. \$13,567.

ATLAS THEATRE (56-74-00091-00). *Cheyenne, Laramie Co.* Private ownership (Cheyenne Little Theatre Players Assoc.). Excellent example of late 19th century commercial building. Interior restoration of stage, skylight, and auditorium floor; repair of roof and repointing of brickwork. \$4,000.

IVINSON MANSION AND GROUNDS (56-74-00094-00). See above (72-00047-00). Restoration of house exterior and grounds. \$50,000.

SHOSHONE-EPISCOPAL MISSION (56-74-00095-00). *Fort Washakie vic., Fremont Co.* Private ownership (Trustees, Protestant Episcopal Church). Mission building which has served as a school and activity center for the Shoshone Indians since 1889. Preparation of plans and specifications, repairs to foundation, and structural stabilization. \$4,000.

ST. MICHAEL'S MISSION (56-74-00097-00). See above (71-00019-00). Restoration of stone and wood building, known as the Mission Office Building, including roofing and interior sheathing. \$2,000.

SOUTH PASS CITY: PAYNE HOUSE (56-75-00102-00). See above (71-00005-00). State ownership. Replacement of roof; repairs to foundation, windows, doors and siding. \$12,100.

POINT OF ROCKS STAGE STATION (56-75-00106-00). See above (71-00012-00). Preparation of drawings; repointing of rock. \$4,959.

GRANGER STAGE STATION (56-75-00107-00). *Granger, Sweetwater Co.* State ownership. Established along the Overland Trail in 1862. Architectural research; plans and specifications; foundation underpinnings; rockwork repointing; repair of roof, door and windows. \$10,600.

MEDICINE LODGE CREEK SITE (56-75-00108-00). *Hyattville, Big Horn Co.* State ownership. Archeological site that dates from 10,000 B.C. to present. Placement of interpretative plaques. \$2,945.

LEGEND ROCK PETROGLYPH SITE (56-75-00110-00). *Grass Creek vic., Hog Springs Co.* Dates from 500-1700 A.D., one of best sites in Rocky Mountain area. Acquisition of 15 acres by state from private owner. \$3,520.





FORT CASPER (56-75-00117-00). *Casper, Natrona Co.* Private ownership. Built in 1858 in early frontier log-style; served as military post, telegraph, pony express and stage coach station, and trading post for emigrants and Indians. Study for future development. \$7,700.

SOUTH TORRINGTON UNION PACIFIC DEPOT (56-76-00130-00). *Torrington, Goshen Co.,* County ownership. Built in 1926 to handle freight for the agricultural country of southeastern Wyoming. Repair of roof tiles, windows and plumbing; repainting of exterior and interior. \$3,500.





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
